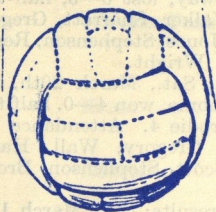

Colin Tinsley (Goalkeeper). Native of Middlesbrough and has had previous experience with Darlington and Exeter City. Well built, 6 ft., and 11 st. 12 lb.

Ken Barton (Right Back). Native of Caernarvon, who joined from Tottenham Hotspur recently after several seasons at Spurs. Stands 5 ft. 9 in., weighs 11 st. 7 lb.

Fred Jardine (Left Back). This sturdy Scot hails from Edinburgh but his previous club was Dundee. Established in the "Hatters" side, he is 5 ft. 10 in., and scales 11 st. 5 lb.

Dave Pacey (Right Half). Luton born and bred he has served since 1956 and has two Under 23 caps. Strong player who is often amongst the goals. 5 ft. 10½ in. and 11 st. 7 lb.

Gordon Fincham (Centre Half). Transferred from Leicester to Plymouth and then on to Luton Town in 1963, is a dominating type of centre-half with a build of 6 ft. 2 in. and 13 st. to back him. Native of Hornchurch.

John Reid (Left Half). Converted inside forward who formerly played with Bradford City and Northampton, joining Luton in November, 1963. A Scot, he stands 5 ft. 10 in., weighing 11 st. 6 lb.

David Pleat (Outside Right). Former Youth International from Nottingham Forest, his home town Club, with whom he spent several years after school leaving. Fast and tricky, he is 5 ft. 8 in., weighing 11 st. 9 lb.

Gordon Riddick (Inside Right). Luton born he has been with only one club and is one of Luton's younger and brighter coming starlets. Well built. 5 ft. 10 in., and 11 st. 4½ lb. Turned professional in 1961.

John O'Rourke (Centre Forward). Previously with Arsenal and Chelsea and joined on a "free" in December, 1963. Had 22 goals in 23 games last season. Former London Boys and Youth International player.

Eddie Phillips (Inside Left). Native of Leiston, Suffolk, and long serving and prolific goal scorer with Ipswich Town for many years until he joined Luton Town this season. Powerfully built, he stands 6 ft. 1 in. and weighs 12 st. 6 lb.

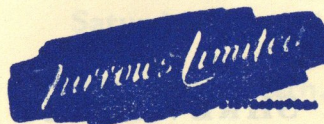
