THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

NOTICE

to Players, Officials and Spectators
(extract from Rules)

Players, Officials and Spectators are only allowed to take part in or attend matches on condition that they observe the Rules of the Association, and every affiliated Association or Club is required to observe and enforce such rules.

Every Association or Club is responsible to the Council for the action of its Players, Officials and Spectators, and is required to take all precautions necessary to prevent Spectators threatening or assaulting Officials and Players, during or at the conclusion of Matches. An Official of an Association or Club, Referee, Linesman, or Player shall not bet on any Football Match, and Associations and Clubs are also required to prevent betting and the use of objectionable language by Spectators. In the case of a breach of the Rule, any Player, Official, or Spectator may be removed from any ground, and such force used as may be necessary for the purpose of effecting such removal.

The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions whether the same shall or shall not reflect on the character or conduct of any Club, Official, Player or Spectator, and every such Club, Official, Player, or Spectator shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Arthur Wilkie (goalkeeper). Born Woolwich S.E. Joined the Club's ground staff on November 11th, 1958 as an amateur player and signed as a professional player on October 8th, 1959. Reserve for England F.A. Youth XI that toured Germany in January, 1959.

John Walker (full back). Born Glasgow. Captain of the Club. An experienced player who was transferred from Southampton F.C. on December 12th, 1957. He assisted Southampton for five seasons and was previously with Wolverhampton Wanderers for a similar period.

Colin Meldrum (full back). Born Glasgow. Joined our Club on 4th April, 1963 when he was transferred from Watford F.C. Prior to joining the Hertfordshire Club, Colin assisted Arsenal F.C. for two seasons

Maurice Evans (wing half). Born Didcot. Now in his thirteenth season with our Club, Maurice joined the Club's ground staff in September, 1952 and signed as a professional player in September the following year. During his period of National Service, played many Representative matches for the Royal Air Force.
