### CLUB NOTES—continued

Saturday provided the first opportunity for supporters to see Ted Phillips in action after his move to centre-forward and his strong shooting provided most of the thrills of the match.

In fact, he was unlucky not to score more than once and his tally of four goals in six matches shows that the manager was not far out in his judgment when he persuaded Leyton Orient to part with this marksman, in the hope that he would help step up our low goal output.

Six points have been obtained with a goal average of 7-1 which has served to improve matters so far as the aggregate average is concerned and that might well turn out to be important in a close finish to the season.

So, the remaining matches, the need is for goals and more goals and these may well come because the manager has gone on record as saying that the defensive attitude that has crept into football is abhorrent to him.

Saturday's attendance of 5,479 was our highest in the League this year, but, of course, is still far below subsistence level and we can only hope that the issues at stake tonight will have led to a bigger crowd paying through the turnstiles.

Supporters should note that next Monday, kick-off 7.30 p.m. we are meeting Bedford Town on this ground in the final of the Bedfordshire Professional Cup.

Bedford are the holders but, despite our pre-occupation with League matters, we should like to regain the trophy for the sake of prestige. Bedford usually bring a considerable following for this match and we are hoping for a sizeable crowd.

At one of the home matches during Easter, probably the one against Gillingham, there will be a collection for the Churchill Memorial Appeal. Collectors will be inside the ground and it is hoped that there will be a generous response to this worthy fund.

## THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION NOTICE

to Players, Officials and Spectators  
(extract from Rules)

Players, Officials and Spectators are only allowed to take part in or attend matches on condition that they observe the Rules of the Association, and every affiliated Association or Club is required to observe and enforce such rules.

Every Association or Club is responsible to the Council for the action of its Players, Officials and Spectators, and is required to take all precautions necessary to prevent Spectators threatening or assaulting Officials and Players, during or at the conclusion of Matches. An Official of an Association or Club, Referee, Linesman, or Player shall not bet on any Football Match, and Associations and Clubs are also required to prevent betting and the use of objectionable language by Spectators. In the case of a breach of the Rule, any Player, Official, or Spectator may be removed from any ground, and such force used as may be necessary for the purpose of effecting such removal.

The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions whether the same shall or shall not reflect on the character or conduct of any Club, Official, Player or Spectator, and every such Club, Official, Player, or Spectator shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

Fortunately, their goalkeeper, Arthur Wilkie, who was rushed to hospital in an unconscious condition after the match, made a quick recovery and was able to leave for home on Sunday.

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Bob Williamson** (goalkeeper). Bob has had experience with the Scottish Clubs, St. Mirren and Arbroath, he was born in Edinburgh and released by St. Mirren after being originally retained by them at the end of Season 1962/63.

**Barry Murphy** (full back). Barry made his debut in the first team at Halifax in Season 1962/63 and was a regular member of the Third Division side towards the end of the Season. Born in Consett, County Durham, he was a part-timer with South Shields before coming to Oakwell.

**Eric Brookes** (full back). Eric, another local born player, is also a former Barnsley Schoolboy's player, and also a former England Youth International. He became a professional in April, 1961 and made his League debut while on the Club Groundstaff.

**Willie Cunningham** (wing half). Willie joined the Club in the close Season from Third Lanark. He spent six seasons with the Scottish Club. He is a constructive wing half, always ready to feed his forwards.

**Eric Winstanley** (centre half). Eric who joined the Club's Groundstaff from Barnsley Boys Team is another former England Youth International. He got his chance following the retirement of stalwart Duncan Sharp. Eric became a professional in May, 1962.

**Jimmy Sheavills** (outside right). Jimmy played 23 First Team appearances for Peterborough in Season 1962/63—signing for Barnsley in June, 1963. He joined Peterborough from Holbeach United in March, 1960.

**George Kerr** (inside forward). George was signed in May, 1960 from the Scottish Junior Club, Vale Juniors. He is a clever ball player.

**John Byrne** (centre forward). John scored eight goals for the Club last year when he made 27 First Team appearances. He is a scheming player with an eye for a goal.

**Eddie O'Hara** (outside left). Eddie was signed in the close Season of 1963 from Morton, the Scottish Club. He had previously played with Rotherham Utd.
