THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

NOTICE

to Players, Officials and Spectators
(extract from Rules)

Players, Officials and Spectators are only allowed to take part in or attend matches on condition that they observe the Rules of the Association, and every affiliated Association or Club is required to observe and enforce such rules.

Every Association or Club is responsible to the Council for the action of its Players, Officials and Spectators, and is required to take all precautions necessary to prevent Spectators threatening or assaulting Officials and Players, during or at the conclusion of Matches. An Official of an Association or Club, Referee, Linesman, or Player shall not bet on any Football Match, and Associations and Clubs are also required to

prevent betting and the use of objectionable language by Spectators. In the case of a breach of the Rule, any Player, Official, or Spectator may be removed from any ground, and such force used as may be necessary for the purpose of effecting such removal.

The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions whether the same shall or shall not reflect on the character or conduct of any Club, Official, Player or Spectator, and every such Club, Official, Player, or Spectator shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Terry Carling. Signed during the close season from Lincoln City in exchange for another Goalkeeper.

Trefor West. A young full back signed from West Bromwich Albion during the close season, was a sought-after Coventry schoolboy player.

Frank Gregg. Another local boy signed straight from school as an apprentice six years ago and signed full time professional four seasons ago.

Graham Chadwick. Signed from Manchester City during the close season. A native of Oldham.

John Leedham. A strong centre half back, another new signing during the close season from Millwall Athletic.

Alan Roper. A local boy graduated through the junior ranks, can also play in the full back position, a whole-hearted player.

Roger Smith. A Tamworth boy signed straight from school as an apprentice, always showed promise in the Youth teams and it is no surprise that he has recently fought his way into the senior side.

Graham Matthews. A Newcastle-under-Lyme boy signed from Stoke City at the beginning of last season, made many appearances in Stoke's First Team, an ever present since joining Walsall.

Alan Clarke. Another local boy who has graduated through the junior ranks and was apprentice player before signing as a full professional twelve months ago.

George Meek. An experienced and clever ball player transferred from

Leicester City three seasons ago, previously with Leeds United, usually plays on the wing.

Trevor Foster. Another local boy also graduated through the junior ranks, young clever ball player.

Bert Llewellyn. Transferred from Northampton Town half-way through last season, a hard centre forward.

Ken Hodgkinson. One of Walsall's senior players transferred from West Bromwich Albion about eight years ago, recognised as one of the best inside forwards in the League.

Jim O'Neill. One of Walsall's biggest transfers from Sunderland in the middle of season 1962/63, a go-ahead energetic centre forward, the only Irishman on the staff.

Stan Bennett. Another local boy previously an apprentice, a whole-hearted player.
