THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION NOTICE

to Players, Officials and Spectators
(extract from Rules)

Players, Officials and Spectators are only allowed to take part in or attend matches on condition that they observe the Rules of the Association, and every affiliated Association or Club is required to observe and enforce such rules.

Every Association or Club is responsible to the Council for the action of its Players, Officials and Spectators, and is required to take all precautions necessary to prevent Spectators threatening or assaulting Officials and Players, during or at the conclusion of Matches. An Official of an Association or Club, Referee, Linesman, or Player shall not bet on any Football Match, and Associations and Clubs are also required to

prevent betting and the use of objectionable language by Spectators. In the case of a breach of the Rule, any Player, Official, or Spectator may be removed from any ground, and such force used as may be necessary for the purpose of effecting such removal.

The Association shall be entitled to publish in the public Press, or in any other manner it shall think fit, reports of its proceedings, acts and resolutions whether the same shall or shall not reflect on the character or conduct of any Club, Official, Player or Spectator, and every such Club, Official, Player, or Spectator shall be deemed to have assented to such publication.

Final blow came last Saturday when there was a completely unexpected heavy defeat at Scunthorpe although, of course, the final score was exaggerated by the injury to John O'Rourke, who had to leave the field for good half an hour from the end.

In point of fact, we lost his effective services in the 28th minute when he scored a neat goal to pull back the score to 3-1. Whether a successful rally would have been a possibility had the team remained at full strength, will never be known, but it is a fact that the scores might well have been level when the mishap occurred, despite Scunthorpe's blitz of three goals in the first seven minutes.

That burst which found our defence badly wanting settled our future status because our only chance of escape was by goal average.
