Club Notes

SINCE the first team was last at home, they have had a couple of disappointing results on opponents' grounds. There was excuse for the exit from the League Cup at Brighton in that we lost Colin Tinsley with a bruised back before half-time and were virtually reduced to 10 men for the remainder of the match.

As if that was not sufficient misfortune for one day, John Reid twice hit the woodwork when taking a penalty immediately after the interval when the score sheet was still blank.

Defeat by 2-0 was poor reward for a defence that worked tremendously hard and young Alan Rivers had a fine match against the experienced Bobby Smith.

In view of the resistance put up against the Third Division team, hopes were high for some reward at Torquay on Saturday. However, it was not to be because the Devonshire team carried too many guns for us in attack and another 2-0 reverse was the result.

Once again, there was some re-shuffling of the forward line which did not prove a success and the shortage of goals when the team is on tour is causing concern.

Billy Stark made his debut for us on Saturday and did enough in difficult circumstances to suggest that he will be a useful asset once he has had a chance to settle down here.

Tonight, John O'Rourke, who has persisted in his desire to move to another club was expected to return to the team and we hope that he will give the front line some much-needed goal punch, even if his stay here is to be of limited duration.

It was expected that more than one of the bigger clubs would have a represent-

ative here tonight in view of our announcement that reasonable offers for the player will be considered.

While the first team is experiencing a goal famine, the Reserves struck it rich by scoring four times in each of two matches in the course of three days.

In a thrilling finish last Thursday, they turned a 3-1 deficit into a 4-3 win against Southend and, on Saturday, scored four times without reply from Aldershot.

Because of the spate of injuries, mainly to experienced players, we have been forced to field the youngest reserve team in our history and the boys have responded by putting on two highly entertaining displays which were worthy of better support than they received. Certainly, this type of football should be capable of drawing more supporters.

Next Wednesday, the Reserves will be at home again, with Brentford their visitors. Come and give the boys a cheer!

Tonight we welcome Wrexham, making their second visit to this ground and we will be out to avenge the defeat we suffered on their Racecourse ground on the first Monday of the season.

Like us, the Welsh club are doing considerably better at home than they are away and we hope not to help them improve their away record this evening.

There is another home match on Saturday when Chesterfield, whom we met several times in the Second Division just after the war, will be the visitors.

It is hoped that the car, an Austin Mini, which will be the subject of the next draw in connection with our Pools Scheme will be on view this evening and also on Saturdays.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Steve Fleet (goalkeeper). Signed from Manchester City in the 1963 close season. Steve has been goalkeeping understudy to the great Bert Trautmann—making a number of senior appearances whilst with Manchester City. Last season he more or less shared the first team position with Albert Dunlop.

Haydn Jones (right back). In his second season as a professional with the Club, this Caernarvon born youngster was originally a member of the Club's ground staff and gained Youth International Caps. If he continues to make the progress which is anticipated a lot should be heard of him in the not too distant future.

Reg Holland (right half). Born at Sutton-in-Ashfield, Notts. Reg arrived at the Racecourse ground from Manchester United, his only other League Club. Captained the Central League side at Old Trafford, a distinction he also gained with the English Schoolboys. Was a regular performer in the first team last season.

Raymond Mielczarek (centre half). Is a Welsh speaking youngster from Caernarvon despite his unfamiliar surname, and joined the Club's ground staff in the summer of 1962, signing professional two years later. Captained the Club's successful Youth Team and also the Welsh Youth XI two seasons ago. A well-built six-footer from whom much is expected of this dominating pivot.

Keith Webber (outside right). Was with Everton for four seasons from where he was transferred to Brighton and Hove Albion. Spent only one season there before moving to Wrexham in the 1964-1965 season. Has played very consistently since arriving here.

Arfon Griffiths (inside right). Began his career at the Racecourse, moving to Arsenal in February 1961 for the then

Club record fee of £15,000. Made many First Division appearances for the 'Gunners' as well as Welsh Under 23 Caps before returning to Wales in September 1962. Although inside forward is his usual position, Arfon has given a number of star performances at outside right. A Wrexham boy.

Martyn King (centre forward). Signed on from Colchester United in October 1964. As a junior he represented Essex Grammar School, finally selected for England Public and Grammar Schools against Scotland in April 1956 as a centre forward as he is today. Whilst at Oxford University he played for them at Wembley. Signed professional forms for Colchester in 1958, and scored 124 goals in 210 appearances.

David Campbell (outside left). A local boy from nearby Acton. Joined Manchester United from school and was at Old Trafford for two seasons. Joined the Wrexham ground staff in May 1964. Signed professional forms June 1965, and made his debut for Wrexham against Hartlepool at the end of last season. He enjoys everything connected with sport.

Peter Jones. An ex-Busby babe who made appearances in the first team at Old Trafford. Peter was signed in March 1960 and since that date has been an almost ever-present in the first team. A stylish player who has played for the Club at full-back, half-back and centre forward, although right-back is the position he favours.

Sammy McMillan. Signed from Manchester United on Christmas Eve 1963, and although he is still in his early twenties has a vast amount of experience having made many First Division appearances with United as well as gaining several Under 23 and Full International Caps for Northern Ireland. Born in Belfast, this stocky inside-forward can prove a match winner on his day.
