### Club Notes

AFTER a good deal of anxiety, we maintained our 100 per cent home record against a young, but lively Wrexham team on Thursday and although there was some disappointment that the team did not score more than the one goal secured by Ray Whittaker, there was at least the consolation that the two points gave us a decided jump in the League Table.

Several good chances were allowed to go astray, but Manager George Martin drew comfort from the fact that the openings were at least created and that they will not always be missed with such prodigality.

With little chance of a breather after their exertions on Thursday, the team is again in action before the home fans this afternoon and the plan was to give an unchanged team another chance.

Such has been the injury position this season that it has been seldom that the same line-up has been able to take the field in consecutive matches and, obviously, this has had an effect on the form in away matches which has been disappointing.

At the moment, the main thing is to keep winning at home and then hope to build up with better results on tour as the team becomes a settled unit again.

Fortunately, there are signs that we are over the worst so far as injuries are concerned, though it may be another 10 days or so before Billy Harber is fit again.

At least eight other clubs had representatives here on Thursday evening. In some cases, it was probably a matter of making a routine check since ours was the only match in the south, but there is

reason to believe that one or two clubs were taking more than a passing interest in John O'Rourke who seems unshakeable in his determination to make a move.

Visit of Chesterfield revives memories of our Second Division days and we last met in the 1950-51 season. The Derbyshire club made a poor start to the season, but have suddenly hit form with a couple of victories and it has been noted that our former player, Gareth Salisbury, currently appearing at outside left, scored in both.

On the completion of his two month's trial period, Barrie Fry, who had a couple of games at outside right in the First Team at the start of the season and who has been playing well at inside right for the Reserves, has been offered a contract for the remainder of the season.

Mention of the Reserves recalls their two fine victories last week when they scored four times against both Southend and Aldershot. They are the youngest team we have ever fielded and several supporters have said how much they enjoyed both games.

In future, League match programmes will carry a lucky number and there will be available for drawing each week, three double tickets for the Odeon Cinema, kindly donated by their manager.

**John Osborne** (goalkeeper). A local lad from Marlborough. Was a Schoolboy International half back. Signed as a professional 1961/62 season. Has made a number of First Team appearances.

**Barry Taylor** (full back). Signed by the Club in August 1964, from Oldham Athletic. Was previously with Sheffield United for four seasons. Born in Sheffield.

**Gerald Sears** (full back). Born at Arkwright Town, Chesterfield. Was signed from a local junior team as an outside left but soon moved to the defence and has been a regular member of the League team for a number of seasons.

**Gerald Clarke** (wing half). Another local player who came to the Club after a short spell with a Sheffield Junior team. Was a member of the Chesterfield Boys team which reached the Final of the schoolboys' competition.
