Club Notes

TO some supporters with long memories, the name of Doncaster has a magic ring because it was on their Belle Vue ground, way back in 1955 that we clinched our bid for promotion to the First Division by winning 3-0 in the last match of the season.

One who will remember that match most vividly is our present trainer, Charlie Watkins, who played at inside left that day in a team that was chosen for its experience and its ability to rise to the occasion.

Much water has passed under the bridge in those last 10 years and, unfortunately, both ourselves and the Rovers now find ourselves in Division IV, something that certainly no one envisaged at that particular time.

However, it is with the present that we must be most concerned and from our point of view, the urgent need is to take full points, not only from the fixture tonight, but from the one with Barnsley on Saturday.

About the difficulty of both these games, we are under no illusion because both our opponents have visions of beginning the climb back to their former status and neither hurdle will be easy.

After a flying start, Doncaster have fallen from grace recently, but they have re-shuffled their team, especially their attack, which has not been notably dangerous away from home and come here with firm ideas about improving their rather moderate away record.

Their team manager is Bill Leivers, formerly of Manchester City, whom we understand is still registered as a player

and he has recruited a very useful looking side.

With Saturday's visitors, Barnsley, we have a long standing friendship, dating back to before the war when we were both members of the Second Division.

With us, they suffered the disappointment of the ultimate relegation at the end of last season, but they are putting a brave face on things and have done very well this season.

Supporters, especially those who consistently follow us away from home, whatever the length of the journey, should note that the match with Tranmere Rovers at Prenton Park, postponed last Friday because the Rovers' pitch was flooded, has now been re-arranged for Wednesday, November 3rd, kick-off 7.30.

There are two dates worth remembering next week. First is on Wednesday, when we are sending a strong team to meet Cambridge United in a match for the benefit of our player, Jimmy Gibson.

This is in fulfilment of a promise made when the transfer deal went through last season and we hope that Jimmy will be well supported.

On the following evening, on this ground, Bedfordshire meet Oxfordshire in the F.A. County Championship.

In the Southern Floodlit Cup in which we beat Watford on Monday, we are now called upon to meet the winners of Reading and Ipswich, away, in the next round.

Each match programme now carries a number and the lucky holders of the three drawn out of the hat will receive two free seats each at the Odeon Cinema, by courtesy of their manager, and this will continue throughout the season.

Brian Kelly (right back). Transferred from Bradford City during 1964/65 season. Age 21 years.

Jimmy Watton (left back). Joined the Club in July 1964 from Port Vale after two years service.

John Wylie (right half). Transferred from Stockport County 1964/65. Was previously with Huddersfield Town and Preston North End.

Bill Leivers (centre half). Appointed Playing Team Manager in July 1964. Previously with Manchester City for ten seasons.

Keith Ripley (centre half). Joined the Rovers in 1962 from Peterborough United. Has also seen service with Leeds United and Mansfield Town.

Graham Ricketts (left half). Five appearances as England Youth International. Previous Clubs were Bristol Rovers and Stockport County from whom he was transferred in July 1964.
