EDITORIAL COMMENT

Writing in Friday night's programme we said that if the opposition will come out and fight, we can give the customers the goals they so desperately want to retain their interest in soccer. The players of both sides must have read those words and decided to put them into effect. For ninety minutes it was as though a whirlwind had struck Prenton Park. Shots rained down on goal at the rate of about six a minute. In the first hour six goals had been scored...and Tranmere had scored five of them...and the next half-hour was a dramatic cliff-hanger as Wrexham hit back with all the Welsh fervour they could muster and gave us the fright of our lives. In the end the score-line was realistic and the customers were satisfied. They'd had ninety minutes of top-class entertainment and the Wrexham fans had seen their team show the sort of spirit that must drag them clear of trouble before the season is very much older.

A new and massively unwelcome element made its appearance at this match when a bottle was thrown from behind the Borough Road goal and landed on the pitch near the Wrexham goalkeeper, Steve Fleet. Prompt action by the police nipped that disgraceful business in the bud and it was a matter for comment among the visiting officials and pressmen that the crowd showed their disapproval of the hooliganism in no uncertain manner. As one who finds reason to visit many other grounds where hooliganism has been rife in recent seasons we have never known such a spontaneous demonstration. This fully justified the action of the Tranmere Rovers' board in arranging for extra policemen to be on hand at the Borough Road end to deal with the small band—and we emphasise, it is a small band—of louts who have marred the pleasure of the many at recent matches by their obscenities. If any of those unwelcome characters remain let them take warning: WE DON'T WANT THEM ANYWHERE NEAR PRENTON PARK AND EVERY EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO ENSURE THAT THEY FIND THEIR HOOLIGANISM AND GENERAL FOULNESS AN UNREWARDING EXERCISE.





OUR VISITORS

Just six years ago Luton Town were in the First Division. More than that, they were at Wembley where they were beaten by a single goal by Nottingham Forest. Last May they were relegated to Division Four. This must be the most dramatic fall from grace in the history of English soccer. And now 'The Hatters' face the long, hard road out of the Fourth Division and back to a place among the more illustrious names in the game.

Only once previously have we had the pleasure of entertaining them here at Prenton Park. That was in 1938 when we were together in the Second Division. Let's hope it won't be very long before we are together again in that sphere.

Here are pen pictures of our visitors:-

COLIN TINSLEY (goalkeeper). — Born at Middlesbrough. His first Club was Grimsby Town, then on to Exeter City before joining Luton in August, 1963. He made regular appearances in the First Team last season, and established himself as first choice.

BOBBY THOMSON (right-back). — Born at Menstrie in Scotland. He first came into prominence with Partick Thistle, and was later transferred to Liverpool for a big fee. Luton secured his services from the latter Club on the 2nd August, 1965. And now he makes a quick return to Merseyside.

FREDDY JARDINE (left-back). — Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee for two seasons before coming to Luton at the end of Season 1960-1961. He came as an outside-left, but was successfully converted to a full-back, where he figured last season in 32 First Team games.

GRAHAM FRENCH (outside-right). — A player with a somewhat chequered

career although he is still in his very early 20's. Came to the front with Shrewsbury Town, was transferred to Swindon Town for a five figure fee and shot into a place in the England Under-23 side in double-quick time. But almost as rapidly he vanished from League football into non-League from which he returned only three weeks ago when he was signed by Luton. Highly talented.

TONY READ (inside-right). — Luton list him as a goalkeeper. Born at Haydock. His first Club was Sheffield Wednesday, and in 1964 he left them to go to Peterborough for whom he also played at centre-forward. He was transferred to Luton in March, 1965, but unfortunately, owing to a broken bone in his foot, he was unable to play last Season.

JOHN REID (right-half). — Previously played for Bradford and Northampton to whom Luton paid a substantial transfer fee in November, 1963. He has settled down well at Luton and is a tireless and energetic worker.

ALAN RIVERS (centre-half). — Born at Portsmouth, he migrated to the Luton area and was recommended to the 'Hatters' in 1961. Progressed through Junior Teams and signed Full Professional Forms in January, 1964. Is a very well-built lad who can also play with success at centre-forward.

JOHN MOORE (left-half). — A newcomer to Luton, having been signed from Motherwell in May, 1965. He was recommended by Town's Scottish Representative who forecast a bright future for him in English Football.

JOHN O'ROURKE (centre-forward). — Was previously with Arsenal and Chelsea, from whom Luton signed him on a free transfer in December, 1965. He immediately made his mark and scored 22 goals in 23 League appearances. Up to last Saturday he had scored 10 this season. He has also played for London School Boys' and the England Youth Team.

BILL STARK (inside-left). — A much travelled Scotsman who started out with his home town team, Airdrie, and moved on to Carlisle United. From there he made the long trip south-east to Colchester and was with them until a few weeks ago when he joined Luton in a switch with Ted Phillips.

RAY WHITTAKER (outside-left). — A Londoner from Bow, his only other Club being Arsenal. He gained England Youth International Honours with John O'Rourke in 1962 and 1963, and was persuaded to join Luton in March, 1964. He went straight into the First Team and held his place for the remainder of the Season.


