Club Notes

IN view of the fact that the team was not due to play at home until a week on Saturday, tonight's Cup replay with Corby Town is a welcome addition to the fixture list and, if it turns out as well as did the one with Romford, it will be rewarding financially, too.

And, from our point of view, any extra revenue is doubly welcome in view of the heavy overheads of present day football.

We welcome Corby for what is probably as near to a local derby as we shall come this season and, unashamedly we say that they gave us a first-class scare last Saturday when only a late goal from the penalty spot gave us the chance of a second attempt at knocking out the gallant Southern Leaguers.

Naturally, we hope that there will be no mistake tonight and it is a pity that the reward for the winners was not more generous when the draw for the third round was made.

A long journey to Plymouth was not the sort of pairing either team would have chosen but, providing that we get through tonight, we shall certainly not despair of our chances of earning at least a replay for the third consecutive round.

Over the course of the years, both in the Third Division and the Second Division, we have had many battles with the Devon club and, on their Home Park pitch, our record certainly bears a second look.

First things first, though, and there is tonight's hurdle to be overcome. That will be no easy task, we are well aware after Saturday's hard match. Unfortunately, it seemed yesterday unlikely that

Allan McBain, who spent two seasons at Kenilworth Road, would be in the Corby line-up because of the injury that nearly caused him to miss the first match in which he experienced some discomfort in the closing stages.

However, another of our former players Bob Riley, is in the side and he had a very useful game on Saturday.

While progress in the Cup is very desirable, no one is losing sight of the fact that the hunt for League points must remain just as intense.

After two good results at Doncaster and Lincoln, we go into League action again on Friday night at Stockport with considerable confidence.

After that, we stage a League match here for the first time for a month a week on Saturday when Bradford City will be the visitors.

Then comes the difficult Christmas programme, at least travel-wise, with away and home matches with Southport.

With the away pairing in the Cup, January looks grim from the travel point of view, too, but we should come into our own in February when three of the

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Alan Alexander (goalkeeper). Born near Glasgow and joined Corby Town from Bradford Park Avenue on a free transfer in July 1962, has since made over 100 appearances for the Steelmen. Aged 23.

Alan McBain (right back). Age 24 years. Started his career with Swansea and later transferred to Carlisle. After 3 years at Carlisle was transferred to Luton, joining Steelmen in August this year.

Dave Pollard (left back). Age 26 years. Signed from Hereford United 2 seasons ago. Great hearted player, lives in Leicester.

Robert Riley (right half). Plays either wing half. Started his career with Leicester, his home town. After 5 seasons transferred to Luton Town from whom he was signed in July this year. Age 23 years.

Tony Needham (centre half). Utility defender signed from Scunthorpe, his only other club, in July this year. Age 25 years.

George Armour (left half). A local boy who signed for Chelsea as a youth, later joining Kettering. Transferred to Corby from Kettering at the beginning of last season.

John Haasz (outside right). Age 26 years. Also plays at inside forward. Has played alongside the great Puskas, was born in Hungary. Started his football in this country with Swansea, moving on to Workington for two seasons, then on to Cambridge United for the past two seasons, scoring 80 goals.

Alex Stenhouse (inside right). Captain of Team. Signed from Bedford Town 2½ seasons ago. Age 29 years. Previously with Southend United. Knows how to make an opening and has terrific right foot. Penalty ace. Painter by trade.

M. Goodall (centre forward). Came up through our Youth Team, playing many positions. Now attracting a number of League clubs as a centre forward. Been with Corby for 5 years. 21 years of age.

Alex Garden (inside left). Signed from Ashford towards end of last season. Formerly with Plymouth. At inside forward a human dynamo. Born in Aberdeen. Age 23 years.

George Jaggard (outside left). Born in Barnsley and signed from that club two seasons ago. Played at wing half before joining Corby, has made the outside left position his own. George always keeps well in the game, an excellent club man. Age 24 years.
