BOBBY THOMSON (Right Back): Was transferred from Partick Thistle to Liverpool for a big fee. Joined Luton in the close season.

FREDDY JARDINE (Left-back): Secured from Dundee at end of 1960-61 season. Came as an outside-left.

GORDON RIDDICK (Right-half): Turned Professional in 1961 following a short period of apprenticeship. Can also play inside-forward.

MATT WOODS (Centre-half): Made 126 first team appearances for Blackburn Rovers, including a Cup Final. Signed for Luton on returning from Australia.

BRUCE RIOCH (Left-half): Former Luton Boys player, becoming a full-time professional in September 1964.

DAVID PLEAT (Outside-right): Secured from Nottingham Forest for a big fee at start of last season. Former England Youth Player.

RAY WHITTAKER (Outside-left): Joined Luton in March 1964 after being with Arsenal. Another former Youth International.

NOBODY WANTS TO BE WORLD CUP FAVOURITES

Favouritism is a mixed blessing. At least, that is what teams with their eyes on the World Cup seem to think. Have you noticed, for example, how many of the spokesmen for the various countries — the ones who might be regarded as having very good chances of winning the Jules Rimet Cup next July — tend to play down on their own situations and plump for somebody else to win the trophy?

If you listened to all of them, and took a consensus of opinion, you would almost certainly come up with a pollsters' result making England the favourites to carry off the coveted award at Wembley on July 30th.

Their reasoning is logical enough. Host nations invariably do well. Since the end of the Second World War, for example, only one host country has failed to reach the semi-finals — that was Switzerland in 1954. And England have such a good record at home against foreign opposition they point out, that it is reasonable to suggest that they will do even better under the spur of competition for the World Championship.

Explore the situation more deeply, however, and those same spokesmen seldom fail to point out that, while they are not just advocating success for the home country on the score of visitors being pleasant to their hosts, the one thing they wish to do more than anything else, highly as they respect their own chances, and optimistic as they are of success, is to ensure that the possible mantle of favouritism is shifted from them.

They all want to be underdogs, to give the impression of coming from behind to win. Yes, that even includes Brazil, winners of the trophy in Sweden in 1958 and Chile in 1962, and, of course, bidding for outright possession of the Cup by reregistering a hat-trick of victories.

The great former world heavyweight champion, Joe Louis, recently went on record as saying "Everybody wants to go to Heaven, but nobody wants to die".

And everybody, it seems, wants to win the World Cup. But nobody wants to be favourite.
