The two postponed games, one in the North East and the other in the South East means that today we shall be playing our third consecutive game in front of a Park Avenue crowd.


It was unfortunate that after a run of good displays in home games, fog should spoil the chance of a really good attendance for the Colchester match.

With visibility in many of the surrounding areas being poor it was not surprising that many should decide not to risk the journey and under the circumstances a near 6,000 attendance must be regarded as satisfactory.

As expected, Colchester gave us a hard game and, although we had many more scoring attempts than the visitors with only Kevin Hector's 27th minute goal registering, our supporters were kept on tenterhooks until the final whistle.

The loss of the Xmas gate — the re-arranged game naturally was nothing near as remunerative as would have been a holiday fixture — followed by two weeks without any match income has made matters more difficult financially, and we must now hope for a good run of favourable weather plus good results to improve the position.

As it is more than 15 years since Luton Town visited Park Avenue in a Football League fixture — all their previous six Football League visits were as 2nd Division members — it will be for many of our supporters their first opportunity of seeing the side from the Town once famous for its share in the hat industry but perhaps now more reliant on the car industry.

In their six games here in the 2nd Division, two before the war and four after it, Luton shared the points twice — in 1937 (1—1) and 1947-8 (2—2) and suffered defeat in the other four games, although only once was the margin more than a single goal, the exception being in 1948-9 when a Geo. Ainsley 'hat trick' along with a Gerry Henry goal gave us a 4—1 victory.

That season also brought us our only win at Luton to give us a double. We also drew twice there but it will be remembered that we lost 1—3 when we were there in the opening game of this season.

Revenge for that defeat would enable us to move above Luton in the table as they are at present one position higher and one point more than us.

They have won two and drawn three of their previous away games in which they have scored an average of exactly a goal per match.

PEN PICTURES OF TO-DAY'S VISITORS

C. TINSLEY (Goal). Born at Middlesbrough. Previously with Grimsby Town and Exeter, before joining Luton in 1963.

G. RIDDICK (Right Back). Turned professional in April 1961 following a short period of Apprenticeship. Tall, with good ball control and a very good shot, much is expected of this lad as he gains more experience.

F. JARDINE (Left Back). Born in Edinburgh. Played for Dundee before coming to Luton at the end of Season 1960-61.

J. REID (Right Half). Previously with Bradford City and Northampton to whom we made a substantial transfer fee in 1963.

M. WOODS (Centre Half). Born in Skelmersdale, Lancs. His first Club was Blackburn for whom he made 126 out of a possible 128 appearances, including a Cup Final.

J. MOORE (Left Half). A newcomer to Luton, having been signed from Motherwell in May, 1965.

T. READ (Inside Right). Born at Haydock. His first Club was Sheffield Wed., and in 1964 he moved to Peterborough. Signed by Luton in March, 1965.

J. O'ROURKE (Centre Forward). Previously with Arsenal and Chelsea, from whom he was signed in December 1965. Scored 22 goals in 23 League appearances for Luton.

B. RIOCH (Inside Left). Born in Aldershot. Signed Apprentice Professional for Luton in August 1963 and Full Professional in September 1964.

R. WHITTAKER (Left Wing). A Londoner from Bow, his only other Club being Arsenal. Signed in March, 1964.
