Club Notes

OUR hopes of promotion this season came alive again after the brilliant win at Bradford last Saturday in which the determination which was called for by Manager George Martin came to complete fulfilment.

Our meeting with Aldershot this afternoon is the first of three home matches during this month and at the end of it we are hoping to be in a position to contemplate our chances of promotion as rosy.

Our success at Bradford completed our first double of the season and, today, we were hoping to wipe out the memory of a 3-1 defeat at Aldershot way back in August. On that occasion, the Soldiers looked more than a useful outfit, but we had not then settled down into a cohesive unit. Now, Aldershot find themselves at the bottom of the League table but, with bitter memories of what happened when Bradford City came here, too much notice should not be taken of the fact because form is apt to go topsy-turvy in the most unexpected style.

Today is the first occasion on which we have staged a first team match under the new parking restrictions on the Dunstable Road side of the ground.

On another page in this programme, there is a map detailing the roads on the Dallow Road side of the ground where unlimited parking is possible and to which the police will direct motorists. In addition, the shaded areas show where the restrictions apply for two or four hours in such roads as Kenilworth Road. With a change of approach by support-

ers, we feel that this problem can be overcome completely, and there seems no reason at all for undue concern.

In coping with this problem, the police have been most helpful and arrangements have been made to man extra turnstiles at the Maple Road end to cope with the expected rush in that area.

With regard to the donation of match footballs to which there has been a most generous response, we would like to draw attention to the fact that the ball given for the home match with Bradford City, was not the personal gift of Mr. Mayes, of the "White Horse", Eaton Bray, but as the result of a collection among his customers.

We understand that similar collections are being made at some licensed premises in Luton but, in the meantime, we have accepted a most generous offer from Mr. Reg. Swain, the well-known Luton bookmaker and commission agent, to supply match balls for the remainder of the season.

Since the last home match, our playing staff has been reduced by one in that Billy Stark has gone on loan for a month to Corby Town, who asked us to help them out of an awkward period caused through injuries.

For real football enthusiasts, there is an attractive match on this ground next Wednesday evening (kick-off 7.30) when Luton Schoolboys meet Smethwick for a place in the quarter finals of the English Schools Shield.

Winners visit either Blackburn or Leeds, and Luton, who won at Brighton on Saturday, are to be congratulated on reaching the last 16 which is a distinct feather in their cap.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Jones, David (goalkeeper). Came to Aldershot from Reading in July 1961 and has missed very few League games since, until last season he broke a leg and was absent for 22 matches. Born Aberdare, Wales.

Devereux, Tony (full back). A local product, signed as an amateur in 1958 later turned professional. Born at Gibraltar.

Renwick, Dick (full back). Transferred from Grimsby Town in July 1963, and gained a first team place in 1963/64 season. Home Town Gillsland.

Walker, Len (half back). Signed 1964 from Newcastle United with which Club he got a first team place. Previously played for Spennymoor United. Born Ferryhill.

Gunter, Phil (centre half). Signed 1964. Went to Portsmouth as a boy and stayed with them for 15 seasons before joining Aldershot. Has played for England 'B' Team. Native of Portsmouth.

Burton, Alan (wing forward). A local lad who joined the Club in December 1960 as an amateur, later signing professional forms. Made 35 appearances last season.

Maloy, Ken (forward). A close season signing, previous Clubs Plymouth Argyle and Peterborough United and has had considerable Second Division experience. Born at Tottenham.

Howarth, Jack (centre forward). A new signing from Luton, previously a Chelsea youngster and is now only 21. Born at Crook, Co. Durham.

Kearns, Peter (inside forward). Born at Aldershot though joined this Club from Corby Town in December 1962. Previously with Plymouth Argyle.

Dodson, David (wing forward). Joined Aldershot from Portsmouth last season. A former Youth International and has also seen service with Arsenal and Swansea Town. Birthplace, Gravesend.

Doherty, John (centre or inside forward). A clever ball player who had six seasons with Fulham, playing in a number of Second Division games. Spent a short period in Australia before signing for Aldershot last season. Born Ewell, Surrey.

Howfield, Bobby (outside left). Rejoined Aldershot in close season after guesting for New Yorkers. Was top scorer for Aldershot in his two earlier seasons with the Club then left to join Watford and later Fulham.

Knights, Tony (wing half). A new Aldershot signing. Born Grimsby and had Second and Third Division experience with Grimsby Town before having a season with Luton Town.

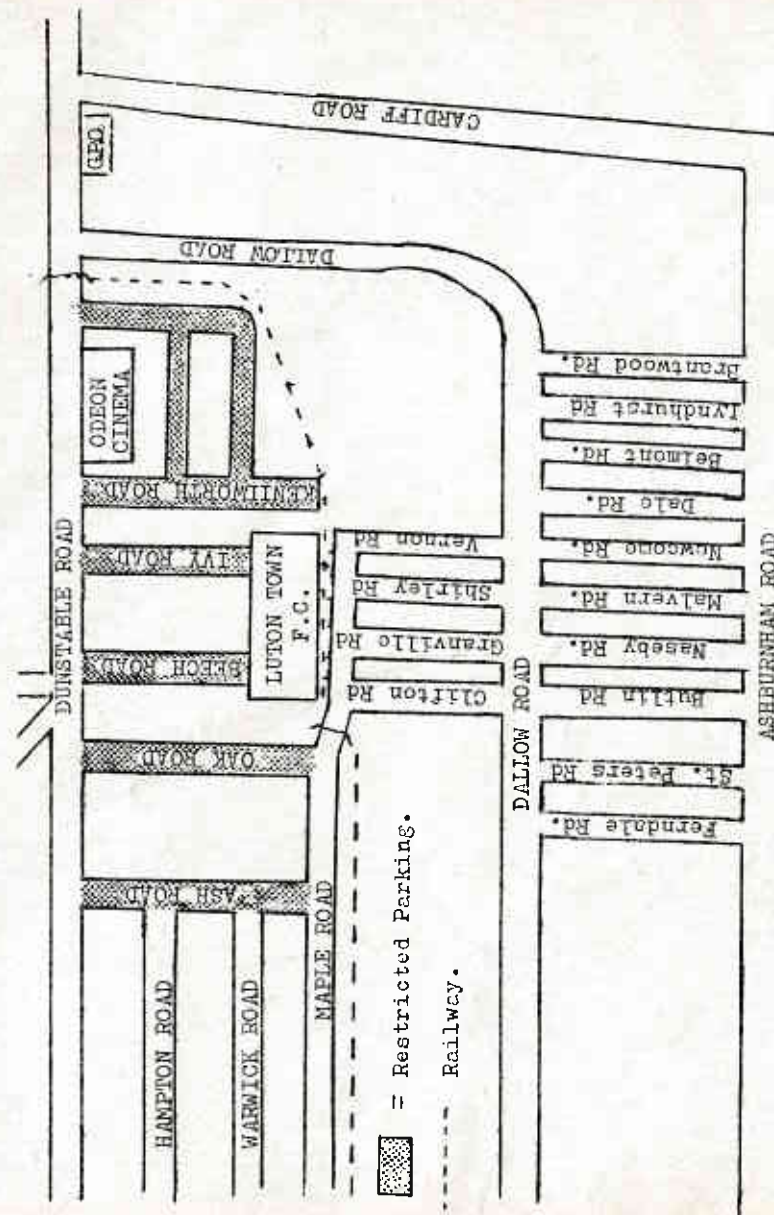
