Re-arranged matches are at Southport on Monday, 21st March with the return here on Monday, 2nd May. Chester will now come here on Monday 28th March, and the home game with Hartlepools has been switched from Saturday, 26th March, to the previous evening, kick-off 6 o'clock.

Saturday, 26th March, is, of course, Grand National Day, so there will be quite a lot of matches on Friday, the 25th, and many of the remaining Saturday matches will have late afternoon or evening kick-offs.

We have been badly hit by postponements due to the weather and our opponents being engaged in the F.A. Cup, and today's encounter with Luton Town will only be our fourth home game since Bradford were here on Boxing Day.

Last Saturday we were badly hit indeed, as none of our three teams had League engagements. Our Fourth Division side should have been at home to Southport, who were still in the Cup, and our Central League game at Huddersfield was ruled out due to the Town versus Sheffield Wednesday Cup tie, whilst our Juniors were the odd team out in the 17-strong Northern Intermediate League.

Every effort to re-arrange matches failed, and so in the end a free public practice match was staged to keep the players in touch.

The Central League game took place on Monday, and the Reserves earned a well merited draw 0-0 at Huddersfield.

Today we extend a hearty welcome to Luton Town, who still have an outside chance of regaining a place in the Third Division at the first attempt.

Luton have had a big drop in status in recent years. In 1959-60 they were relegated from Division One, and at the end of 1962-63 season they dropped into the Third Division. Their slump continued, and the closure of the 1964-65 campaign saw them slip to the Fourth Division.

Last September we managed to beat them 2-1 at Kenilworth Road, and so today we have a chance to complete the double.

Although the "Hatters" have an impressive home record—13 wins and two defeats—their away performances have not been very impressive—three wins, three draws and nine defeats.



Two of our goals were scored by Alan Morton, playing at inside-left in a new-look attack in which only centre-forward Ivan Hollett retained his place. It was Ivan who notched the second goal a minute after Alan had put us ahead 15 minutes after the start.

It would not have been an injustice had we doubled our score as our attack was much more lively than in recent weeks.

The following Saturday saw us at Rochdale hoping to repeat the previous season's victory at Spotland, but in the end had to be content with a point from a 1-1 draw after falling in arrears in the second minute.

During the first half a tremendous downpour threatened to bring a premature end to the game, but the referee decided to carry on after consulting both captains.

From then on we took almost complete command, but the goals would not come. However, after 68 minutes, Vince Adams, operating on the right wing, beat the home back, and after racing down the wing, put across a good centre which Ivan Hollett headed home.

Mick Hughes almost snatched the winner in the closing stages when his well-placed shot was only just flicked over the bar by the home goalkeeper Heath.

We gained two more valuable and well-deserved points against Lincoln City at Sincil Bank on Wednesday night.

Both sides missed chances, but the difference was that we did accept two of ours.

The first came three minutes before half-time from Ivan Hollett, who had little difficulty in putting the ball wide of the home goalkeeper, Wakeham, after good work by Sears.

Gerald Clarke, after a bad miss in the first half, added the second after 78 minutes when he received the ball in front of goal from a header by Hollett who had connected with a centre from John Henderson on the right wing.

Our defence was rarely in serious trouble, with Brian Arblaster making a number of spectacular saves.

This win enabled us to complete the double over the "Imps."

Gareth Salisbury, relegated to the Reserves side, scored the only goal in reply to five by the home side at Bolton, and John Henderson gave us the lead in the home game against a strong Everton Reserves team, who hit back to claim both points through two late goals.

There is no doubt that better marksmanship would have earned us both points against the Merseysiders.

Next Saturday our Fourth Division side goes to Barrow, who forced a 2-2 draw here earlier in the season, and we shall have to pull out a little extra to hold them at bay.
