### Club Notes

NO one is more completely aware than our players of the vital importance of the result of today's match in our fight to regain promotion to the Third Division and this struggle at the top of the table seems destined to go on without final solution until late in the season.

Tramore, a very useful side, managed by Dave Russell, who used to be in charge at Bury, have been one of the pace-makers throughout and, despite their setback at Colchester last Saturday, are very dangerous rivals to us indeed.

In meeting them today, we are comforted by the fact that, by and large, our best displays this season have been against the better teams in the Fourth Division and that, with a couple of notable exceptions, the home form has been most impressive. May it continue that way this afternoon when one of our former players, Jack Lornie, will be wearing the Tramore number 11 shirt.

Now, the late season rush of matches on this ground is beginning and there are two Schoolboys fixtures here during next week.

First comes on Wednesday, when the annual Seaward Trophy match will be staged, kick-off 7.30, with the invited opponents to Luton Schoolboys this year being Nottingham. This is a fine opportunity for local fans to give a big welcome to the local Schoolboys whose bid to reach the final of the English Schools Shield failed so narrowly and so unluckily at Oxford last Saturday.

Then, on Saturday morning, Bedfordshire Schoolboys will meet Suffolk (kick-off 11 a.m.) in the Home Counties

Championship. Last Monday, Bedfordshire beat Middlesex at Fulham by 3-2, with goals coming from Buonpane (2) and Riach and, if they overcome Suffolk, they will meet Surrey in the final.

Seven members of the Luton team were in the county side against Middlesex and there may possibly be more next Saturday. For both matches, admission to the Stand and Enclosure only will be 2/- for adults and 1/- for boys.

Then, we hope that supporters will bear in mind the Ron Baynham testimonial match here on Monday week, kick-off 7.30. The present Luton team will take on a side of past stars which will include a number of the members of our 1959 Cup Final side.

Finally, next Wednesday sees the choosing of the Luton Town Beauty Queen at the Bobbers Stand and Supporters Club social which looks like being a very good evening indeed and the judging will be the concern of a panel of very well known local people.

## PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

**Harry Leyland** (goalkeeper). In his fifth season with Rovers for whom he has made more than 150 appearances. Joined them from Blackburn Rovers with whom he made a Cup Final appearance. Liverpool born, Harry was signed by Everton after making a name for himself in Army football. Is a fully qualified F.A. coach.

**Roy Parnell** (full back). Birkenhead born and a product of local schools football, but he made his way to Prenton Park via Everton F.C., having joined up at Goodison straight from school. Made several first team appearances with Everton, but came to Tranmere on a free transfer just before the start of last season.

**Barrie Martin** (full back). Manager David Russell's one major 'buy' during the close season. Birmingham born Barrie spent 12 years with Blackpool, partnering Jimmy Armfield for ten seasons. After 250 first team games with Blackpool, was transferred to Oldham Athletic and a year later joined Tranmere.

**Joe Pritchard** (wing half). Completes the trio of home grown players in Rovers' League side. Joe was discovered in Birkenhead schools football, nursed through the juniors and Reserve ranks while he served his time as a shipwright and became a full time professional last autumn.

**Eddie Stuart** (centre half). Captain of the side, this giant South African (he was born in Capetown) shares with Harry Leyland the distinction of possessing a Cup Final medal (but Eddie's is a winner's trophy, won with Wolves). He also won three League championship medals while at Molineux and when he moved on to Stoke City he won a Second Division medal there. Hopes to complete the record treble by winning a Division Four award with Rovers.

**Alan King** (wing half). Birkenhead born and a product of Manager Russell's youth policy. Like two other members of the League side, Alan has graduated from the juniors. Got his chance at the beginning of last season and grabbed it with both hands.

**Mandy Hill** (winger). The second ex-Blackpool player in the side. Was in the Bloomfield Road team with Barrie Martin, but arrived at Prenton Park eight months before him. London born, Mandy won four Under 23 caps with Blackpool.

**John Manning** (inside forward). Was the goal scoring sensation of 1964. Had bagged 21 goals by November last season then suffered injury and never quite recovered his touch, but the 'big fellow' has plenty of time and ability to win back his place. Was an amateur with Liverpool F.C.

**Barry Dyson** (centre forward). That name has figured prominently in the list of leading scorers over the past four seasons. Was brought to Prenton Park on a free transfer from Bury F.C. for whom he had been signed by Manager Russell. In 130 appearances for Rovers up to the end of last season he scored 74 goals.

**Roy Sinclair** (inside forward). By common consent one of the most talented ball players in the Fourth Division. Although this Liverpool born lad was with Liverpool F.C. as an amateur, he was coached through League standard in Rovers' junior teams.

**Jack Lornie** (winger). Joined the Club from Carlisle United in 1964 as an outside right, but has filled every forward position and even stands-in from time to time as wing half or full back. Hails from Aberdeen where he entered League football, then moved to Leicester City and later to Luton Town.
