Club Notes

FOR the second time this season we bid welcome to Aldershot, the first occasion being an unhappy one for us in that it led to our exit from the League Cup after having held the Soldiers to a draw on their own ground.

In the replay, we had our chances of victory, failed to take them and paid the full penalty which was the loss of what would have been a highly attractive home tie with Queens Park Rangers in the next round and the chance of hooking an even bigger fish later in the competition.

Now, the immediate need is to improve our position in the League table and, in truth, four points out of the first 12 was not the sort of start that we envisaged.

Even taking into account the obvious strength and experience of the League leaders, Stockport County, it was an extreme disappointment to be beaten by them in such convincing style last Saturday.

Not that we feel that the team deserved such a fate, but the fact remains that the visitors proved to have the greater facility for snapping up their chances.

All of which adds up to the fact that it is vastly important that there should be no further slip up against our old friend, Dave Smith's boys, this afternoon and we can only hope that the team can slide into the free-scoring pattern that has eluded them so far this season.

Attempts to reinforce the number of experienced players, ready for League football, at our disposal, have failed so far and the transfer market is difficult

at the moment, partly because most clubs need their full resources as a safeguard against injuries during the early season rush of matches and the mid-week engagements it entails.

However, there are hopes of a new signing before next Thursday evening's home League match with Rochdale. There has been agreement between the club concerned for the transfer and it now remains for the player to decide, when the proposition is put to him after this weekend is over.

Ideally, we would have liked to have his services for this afternoon's match, but his present club require him to play today which is why the deal is hanging fire.

After a gap of three years, we have regained the use of the car park at Maple Road and there are a few vacancies for the parking of cars which will be limited, in the first instance, to season ticket holders, and will cost £3/3/- for the season.

We would stress that the accommodation is strictly limited and will be allocated on a first come, first served basis, but it does help in some measure towards the parking problem which has proved a headache to some people.

During last season, a scheme whereby local firms or individuals helped the club financially by providing a match ball, worked extremely well and there has been a reasonably good response so far this time.

However, as things stand at the moment, the supply of footballs donated will not last until Christmas and we would appeal for more.
