Club Notes

IT is with a lighter heart and a greater feeling of confidence that these notes are written—indicative of the improvement shown by the team last Saturday in whipping Aldershot by 4-0.

We only hope that this is reflected in the attendance figures tonight when Rochdale are our visitors for only the second time in the history of both clubs.

Certainly, increased support is a vital necessity because last Saturday's figures of 4,471 are well below an economic minimum.

All too well, it is realised that supporters want results and goals, and they are entitled to get their share of both. Perhaps the two points and four goals secured against Aldershot will provide the necessary fillip to the fans.

Certainly, from the players' point of view, the win could not have been more timely and the forward changes made by the manager worked extremely well.

For young Tony Thear, making his League debut, this was a memorable occasion because he scored in each half and might easily have completed a hat-trick.

Now, the hope is that Thear will settle in to fill the gap left by the departure of John O'Rourke whose determination to leave this club was a bad blow and an upset to the pre-season planning of the manager.

The search for new players still goes on, but lack of money restricts the market so far as we are concerned and players we can afford who are available and also measure up to what we require, are few and far between.

Tonight's opponents, who are managed by a former Watford player, Tony Collins, lost their first two matches of the season, but then settled down in impressive style and come here undefeated in their last five games from which they have earned themselves eight points.

With all due respect to them, though, this is a match which we must win if we are to start to make up the leeway on the leaders and join them eventually, which must be the aim.

After only a day's respite, the team faces the long trip to North Wales to meet Wrexham who have also improved immensely after an uneasy start.

They have behind them six matches without defeat, four of them drawn and, obviously, there will have to be a big improvement on our team's previous away form if any reward is to be gained.

Away points in some quantity are a vital necessity for a team with any pretensions towards promotion and our away record so far shows an unhappy blank in the points column, something which must be remedied without waste of time.

After a gap of three years, we have regained the use of the car park at Maple Road and there are a few vacancies for the parking of cars which will be limited, in the first instance, to season ticket holders, and will cost £3/3/- for the season.

We would stress that the accommodation is strictly limited and will be allocated on a first come, first served basis, but it does help in some measure towards the parking problem which has proved a headache to some people.
