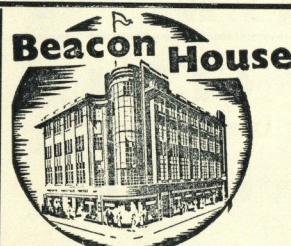

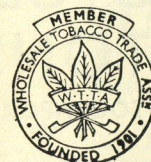

Club Notes

SECOND LEAGUE VISIT. This afternoon we extend a warm welcome to Luton Town who are making only their second league visit to our ground. When they came here last season and we won by the odd goal in five, the game attracted the best league attendance of the season, 6,638. After three successive defeats, we are naturally very keen to get back onto the winning path. And we would also like a win today for the sake of our manager, Billy Bingham who was, of course, a member of the Luton side that played in the F.A. Cup Final in May, 1959. Luton have not made a very good start to this their second season in the Fourth Division. They have eight points to their credit from nine games, but all their points have been obtained at home. On tour Luton have been beaten at Brentford (0-1), Rochdale (0-3), Barnsley (1-2) and Wrexham (0-2). In their nine league and two Cup matches they have scored 16 goals, their marksmen being Thear (four), Rioch, and Whittaker (three each), King (two), Slough, Jardine, Moore and Rivers (one each).

BARROW HERE ON MONDAY. On Monday night we play our return game with Barrow and having drawn 2-2 at Holker Street earlier in the season, we are naturally hoping to go one better on our own ground. The kick-off is at 7-30 p.m.

RESERVE GAME POSTPONED. Our Reserves, who are still unbeaten, are at Bacup to-day. Next Saturday there should have been an attractive Lancashire Combination fixture with Chorley at our ground but this has had to be postponed because Chorley are engaged in the F.A. Cup.

LUTON TOWN F.C. — PEN PICTURES, 1966-67

TERRENCE ADAMSON (Full-back): Born at Shiney Row, Co. Durham. Transferred to Luton from Sunderland in July, 1966. Only 18 years of age. He appeared last season for Sunderland in the Final of the F.A. Youth Cup Final.

GRAHAM FRENCH (Winger): Born at Wolverhampton. Played for Shrewsbury and whilst with them he gained Youth International caps for England. Later he played for Swindon and Watford, before joining Luton in October, 1965.

ERIC GRIEVE (Half-back): Born Gatehouse-of-Fleet. Was last season playing for Tarff Rovers, Kirkcowan, as an amateur and was persuaded to turn professional in July, 1966.

FREDDIE JARDINE (Full-back): Born in Edinburgh. Played for two seasons for Dundee before coming to Luton in 1961. Was signed as an outside-left but has since made the left-back position his own.

BRIAN JOHNSON (Winger): Born Newcastle. His only other club was Sunderland from whom he was transferred in July, 1966.

GERALD KING (Winger): A Welshman by birth, he played for his country both as a schoolboy and at Youth International level. Has played for Cardiff and Torquay, from whom he was transferred in June, 1966.

JOHN MOORE (Wing-half): In his second season for Luton. Previously played for Motherwell. Made 43 League appearances and scored five goals last season.

PETER MOONEY (Winger): Is an apprentice on our staff whose appearances last season were mainly confined to Youth football, but on the occasions when he was called upon for Reserve team duties he performed well. Born Luton.

JOHN NICHOLSON (Centre-half): Another product of our Youth scheme. Born at Bristol. Was signed as a part-time player in December, 1965, and came on to our full-time staff in June, 1966. He made a number of Reserve team appearances last season.

DAVID PLEAT (Winger): Born at Nottingham. He played for England Youth team and also Nottingham Forest, from whom we secured his transfer in August, 1964. Was a regular member of our First team until he had the great misfortune to break a leg.

TONY READ (Goalkeeper): Born at Haydock. His first club was Sheffield Wednesday, and in 1964 he left them to go to Peterborough. Was then transferred to Luton in March, 1965. Last season made 35 appearances in the forward line scoring 12 goals, besides 6 appearances in goal.

GORDON RIDDICK (Inside-forward): Turned professional in April, 1961, following a short period of apprenticeship. He has been with this club since this date making many First team appearances equally well at full-back, half-back and as a forward. He was born at Langlebury.

BRUCE RIOCH (Inside-forward): Although born at Aldershot he was brought up in Luton and represented the town at school also having trials for the England Schoolboys team. He signed apprentice professional in August, 1963, and full professional in September, 1964.

ALAN RIVERS (Half-back): Born at Portsmouth, he signed professional forms for this club in January, 1964, after playing three years as an amateur.

ALAN SLOUGH (Full-back): Another Luton boy who has graduated through the ranks of schoolboy, amateur and apprentice professional, being offered full terms in May, 1965. He gained County representative honours as an amateur at inside-forward.

TONY THEAR (Centre-forward): Born at Tottenham and joined Arsenal as apprentice professional. He holds an F.A. Youth Cup winners medal.

BOBBY THOMSON (Full-back): Born at Menstrie in Scotland. He first came into prominence with Partick Thistle, and was later transferred to Liverpool for a big fee. Luton secured his services from the latter club on the 2nd August, 1965.

RAY WHITTAKER (Outside-left): A Londoner from Bow, his only other club being Arsenal. He gained England Youth International Caps in 1962 and 1963, and when we were in need of a left-wing he was persuaded to join us in March, 1964. He went straight into the First team and held his place ever since.

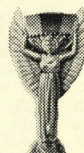
