Club Notes

TODAY, sees the start of a two match period which should enable us to improve our League position which, at the moment, is disappointing because of the inability of the team to produce in away games, the successful form they have shown at home.

We had hoped that the fine victories over Aldershot and Rochdale were the fore-runner of much better things, but defeats at Wrexham and Southport followed, to set us back again.

Now, there are two home matches to be fulfilled in quick succession, against Notts County today and Bradford City on Thursday evening.

Of course, the County are old friends and rivals, dating back to pre-war days when, for a time, we were closely locked in the battle for promotion.

After a poor start to the season, County have reinforced their side considerably by new signings, notably, Terry Harkin, from Cardiff City and Frank Upton, a highly experienced wing half who gave distinguished service to both Derby County and Chelsea.

Result has been a considerable improvement which suggests that our lads might find themselves with a more difficult struggle on their hands than the County's current League position would suggest.

However, if the team clicks in the way in which it did in the last two home games, then there should be no anxiety about the destination of the points. Certain it is, that we cannot afford to drop a single point at home, and Bradford City, who have also gone for experience in their efforts to re-build

their side, will not be easy victims, either.

Doubtless, as this is the only League match being played on Thursday evening we shall be visited by representatives of several other clubs again and, so far as the attendance is concerned, there is no competition, football-wise whatever on that evening. Supporters should note that the kick-off is timed for 7.30 p.m.

After that game, comes the severe test of two tough away matches in the course of three days, at Chester next Saturday and at Newport on the following Monday.

Our memories of both these grounds are of disappointment because it was here that our last two games of last season were played.

As things turned out, two points from these two matches would have seen us into the Third Division, but we secured none at Newport and could manage only one at Chester in the last game of the season and so failed on goal average.

It is on a sad note that we end these notes because this week, one of our Directors, Mr. George Blackburn Harris, died suddenly, and his cremation will take place at the Vale on Monday.

Mr. Harris had been a Director since March, 1961, but his close connection with the club went back much further than that.

For well over 30 years, he had been the club's Hon. Solicitor, as he continued to be after his appointment to the Board and his work in this connection, all of a voluntary nature, has been absolutely invaluable.

He will be badly missed in both his capacities with the club.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

G. Smith (goalkeeper). Begins his seventh season as regular choice. Very reliable and safe keeper. Born Nottingham. This is his only League Club.

I. Hampton (full back). Heanor born. Formerly with Rotherham United as an Amateur. Last season was his most consistent one, missing only 5 League matches.

A. Gibson (centre half). Born Kirconnell. Ever present last season. Most consistent performer, gave way at pivot to young David Needham towards the end of the season and shielded the youngster on his left flank.

A. Flower (winger). Born Carlton. Joined the Club direct from School in 1960. Can play on either wing. Good shot in both feet. Fast and dangerous raider.

R. Edwards (wing half). Born Kirkby in Ashfield. This player is a tower of strength and can play in most defensive positions. Secured from neighbours Forest as an Amateur. Is now a regular choice.

B. Bates (winger). Born Beeston. Signed professional forms in July after three seasons as an Amateur. Prolific goalscorer, can play on either wing equally well.

L. Chalmers (full back). Born Corby. Previously with Leicester City for whom he played in the 1961 F.A. Cup Final. This acquisition will obviously add class to our defence.

J. Beresford (wing half). Born Sheffield. Signed summer 1965 from Chesterfield. Strong player, equally at home at inside forward.

J. Bowers (winger). Born Leicester City, signed this summer from Derby County where he had played for 9 seasons. Very fast raiding winger with good goals record.

D. Clarke (winger). Born Long Eaton. Signed from Nottingham Forest. Young promising player.

R. Still (centre forward). Born Aberdeen. Signed from Arsenal in summer of 1965, as a wing half. Successfully converted by former Manager Tim Coleman as a centre forward finishing the season as top scorer with 13 goals.

T. Thompson (wing half). Born Barlestone. Signed from Wolves in March of this year. Entered the First Team immediately and retained his place. Shows much class in his ball distribution.
