CLUB COMMENT

MISSED CHANCES

What should have been and, of course what actually happened are two different matters, but there is no doubt that had we taken the chances we made for ourselves in the second half against Stockport, we would have won and so kept up with the leading clubs. Now, as these notes are written, we are six points behind the fourth placed club, and only TWO in front of the first of the four re-election positions.

We mentioned how close the promotion race was likely to be this season in our last programme and this is certainly emphasised by the fact that there are only eight points separating the fourth and twenty first placed clubs in the Fourth Division. Rarely these days does a club jump a number of positions when they bring off a win, but an exception at the weekend was Barrow's 1-0 success at Aldershot on Friday night to lift them four places—reduced by one on the Saturday as a result of Southend's victory..

In view of our away record at the moment, we can ill-afford the dropping of home points, which is why we must make no mistakes against Luton Town tonight.

Following this match our next two League games are both away from home, at Rochdale and Notts County, both of whom were right on our tails after the weekend. Indeed, if matches which took place on Monday evening and last night go against us, we could have dropped another four places, so there can be no over-stressing how important this match is going to be, not only for us, but for Luton as well.

On Saturday they broke a spell of eight successive League games without a win by getting the better of Crewe, Gordon Riddick scoring both their goals. But Luton have one of the worst away records in the Football League having picked up only one point—at Chester—in eight matches.

Born at Shipley, Philip attended the Albert Road Infants and Junior Schools in Saltaire, before going to Bingley Secondary Modern School. He played inside forward until his last year at school when he reverted to left half, a position in which he represented Bradford Boys, staying on an extra term at school in order to complete the season with the Boys side.

On leaving, he joined Huddersfield Town as an amateur, and was with them for over a year before coming to Valley Parade as an amateur. He joined as a wing half, but was moved to centre half, although in the Wharfedale League on a Sunday he turned out for Saltaire at centre forward.

He has represented the Bradford Minor eleven side—at the same time as Ian Cooper and Bruce Bannister—and turned part time professional at the start of the present season.

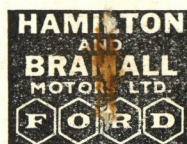

EXTRACT FROM THE F.A. NEWS

In this month's edition of the official journal of the F.A., an article concerning first-class professional football in Yorkshire is continued, which includes reference to the F.A. Cup, and we reproduce that part here as it will probably interest our supporters—

"Apart from Huddersfield the most successful Yorkshire clubs are, of course, Sheffield United and Sheffield Wednesday, but which Yorkshire club can claim to be the most successful in so far as games within their own County are concerned?

"It will not surprise many Yorkshiremen to know that a table of Yorkshire derby games in the FA Challenge Cup competition shows Huddersfield Town to be champions. But it may shock some to learn that Fourth Division Bradford City are placed second in such a table.

"The City have met nine of the leading Yorkshire clubs in the FA Cup Competition Proper at one time or another and have beaten seven of them, namely Barnsley, Bradford, Doncaster Rovers, Hull City, Middlesbrough, Sheffield United and York City. Huddersfield have met all but Halifax and among the others have so far only failed to gain a victory over Barnsley.

"No Yorkshire club has met all the other dozen first-class clubs in the county in the FA Cup Proper, but where they have yet to be drawn together in this competition, most have clashed in the League.

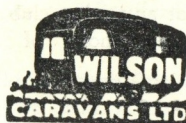
