## How are the Mighty Fallen Cup Finalists Only Eight Years Ago

It is still not quite seven years ago that Alan Brown headed First Division Luton Town's attack in an F.A. Cup tie on this ground, and one can't help wondering what his thoughts are today as he returns with the same club, now a struggling Fourth Division concern.

How are the mighty fallen! But let's emphasise right away that Alan Brown had nothing to do with the crash for he only returned to Luton three weeks ago to take over the managership after being away for more than five years.

This former Scottish International can

certainly have no illusions about the immense task he has undertaken in trying to restore Luton Town to some of their former glories. Despite their dismal League record he will be particularly anxious to taste some of the Cup success which he sampled in his previous spell with the "Hatters".

Wembley seems a long way off for the clubs engaged in this afternoon's Cup ties but Luton Town were there only eight seasons ago when they were beaten 2—1 in the Final by Nottingham Forest and Alan Brown was at inside-right for Luton on that auspicious occasion.

Apart from that game one has to go back 54 years to find an F.A. Cup Final which included one of the 80 clubs engaged in today's 1st Round ties!

It may interest some people to know that no less than 311 clubs have already fought it out in this season's competition. The F.A. Cup may be only just beginning for us today but the first games were played 12 weeks ago, since when there has been so much whittling down that only 20 of the original 286 participants still survive. Those 20 are now competing with 10 survivors of those who had been exempted until the 4th Round of the Qualifying Competition, the 48 Third & Fourth Division clubs, and the two Amateur Cup Finalists who were exempted until this round, making the total of 80 playing today.

It is a little surprising to note that Luton Town are actually the first Fourth Division side we have ever met in the F.A. Cup, and this is the 7th time in the last eight years that we have been lucky enough to have a First Round tie on our own ground. What now remains to be seen is whether we can take advantage of the luck of the draw.

**POOR AWAY RECORD**  
Although our form so far this season has been nothing to write home about, in some respects Luton's has been even worse.

Like Exeter, Luton Town have yet to win an away game, but whereas we have managed to gain five points and score seven goals on opponents' grounds Luton have collected only one away point and netted three away goals. They have scored only once in their last five away games!

Their three goals were scored one at a time at Barnsley, where John Moore found the net, and at Southport and Bradford City, where Bruce Rioch scored on each occasion.

Last Saturday Luton went down 3-0 at Barrow, so it is likely that Manager Alan Brown will be making some changes for this afternoon's game, and as their team is not to hand at the time of writing I may be some way out in my calculations.

However, I don't expect to see much of a change in their defence which will probably include Tony Read in goal, Bobby Tomson and Fred Jardine at full-back, John Moore at centre-half, and Frank Conboy and Alan Slough in the wing-half positions.

Luton have a way of turning forwards into goalkeepers or goalkeepers into forwards. I expect you can recall how their long-service goalkeeper Ron Baynham, also figured in their League side as a centre-forward. Well, goalkeeper, Tony Read, has had a similar experience, for only last season he made no less than 35 appearances in Luton's forward line, mostly at inside-right, and scored 12 goals. In addition he made six appearances in goal during that campaign.

This season he has remained in goal, but in view of Luton's poor scoring record so far we must not be surprised if he turns up in their forward line again today.

#### LUTON'S SCOTS

Both full-backs are Scots, Bobby Tomson was previously with Liverpool and is in his second season with Luton, while Fred Jardine is the longest serving member of the present side having been signed from Dundee in 1961.

is one of three local discoveries who may be in their side.

The other two are forwards Gordon Riddick and Bruce Rioch. The latter is Luton's leading League scorer this season to date, although his total is only four. Next to him comes outside-left Ray Whitaker, a former England Youth International signed from Arsenal, and Tony Thear, another former Arsenal player, both with three goals. Gordon Riddick is the only other Luton player to score more than a single Fourth Division goal this season.

After taking such a tumble in recent seasons Luton Town have no really long-service men. At the end of last season they retained only 13 professionals and gave free transfers to another 13, including former Exeter goalkeeper Colin Tinsley, who subsequently went to Kettering.

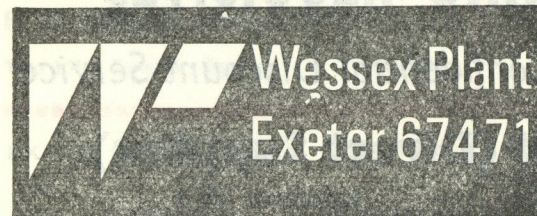
Here is Exeter City's F.A. Cup record since we were beaten by Luton Town in season 1959-60:

Probably the finest player ever to join Exeter from Luton Town was Bill Fellowes. One of the stars of their side which won promotion to the Second Division in 1937 he joined the City in the summer of 1938. After the war Bill became the first Assistant Manager the club had ever appointed.

Last season Luton beat Romford in a 1st Round replay at home, but were surprisingly eliminated in the 2nd Round by Corby at Luton (1—0) after holding the Southern League side to a draw at Corby.

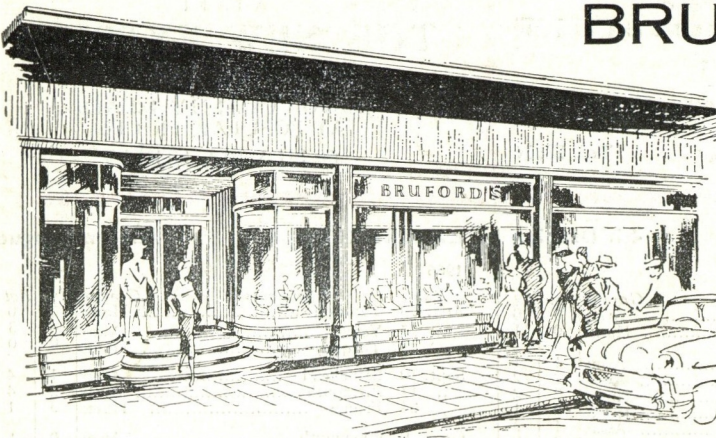
