

**EDITORIAL
COMMENT**

First things first. Our hope then is that Rovers' supporters have enjoyed the Christmas holiday so far and that nothing will happen over the next two days to mar their pleasure. Our hope, too, is that 1967 will see the fulfilment of all our ambitions for the team.

Holiday programmes have a way of shaping future events, but if Rovers can reach the end of 1966 with a minimum of 28 points they may well feel reasonably optimistic about 1967 for, in sharp contrast to other seasons, we have the advantage of games in hand of our promotion rivals. What is even more important, these are home games.

Victory at Chester was a tremendous boost for our players at the outset of what promises to be a very busy period and while the Cestrians might argue that they should have had at least one point the fact remains that Rovers took the one real chance that came their way.

But the paucity of goals remains a problem for Manager David Russell who justifiably feels that a marksman is all we need to complete the perfect promotion-winning blend. Happily (and here we touch wood) the defence has proved to be the soundest Rovers have turned out for many a long day and teams like Millwall and Gillingham have proved in recent years that promotion can be won by solid defences.

No one wants to undertake the job of compiling League fixtures (it calls for the patience of Job and the wisdom of Solomon) but surely it is possible to arrange Christmas holiday matches in such a way that long journeys are avoided. Travel facilities are at a minimum around this time, yet, just as Luton have had to find their way here this afternoon, Rovers must set out before dawn tomorrow to get to Kenilworth Road for the return fixture. Yet last Saturday, when all forms of transport were freely available, we went down the road to Chester. The gate at Sealand Road was just over 6,000, reflecting, not as one or two observers believed, public reaction to the form of the teams involved, but the traditional public reaction to football on the Saturday before Christmas. Just imagine what the gate at Sealand Road would have been had Chester and Tranmere been in opposition there today.

In welcoming Luton we also welcome their recently-appointed manager, Mr. Allan Brown, who frequently appeared at Prenton Park in his days as player-manager of Wigan Athletic.

After tomorrow's visit to Luton, Rovers' players will have only three days rest before finishing off their 1966 programme with a home

game against Bradford, City. Then next week they move to Morecambe for a spot of special training in preparation for the F.A. Cup second round tie at Barrow on January 7th. It is hoped that a change of scene and the Morecambe Bay ozone will pep them up for what promises to be as stiff a cup test as we could have picked. Barrow's record is an impressive one but Rovers players are confident they will still be interested when the third round draw is made on Monday, January 9th.....interested and hoping for one of the plums.

One way to help in that direction is to ensure that our players have plenty of vocal support at Holker Street. Elsewhere in the programme you can find details of coaches being run for the occasion. Doubtless the road north will carry quite a few fans travelling by their own transport. We believe a limited number of stand seats (6/- each) are still available for this tie. They can be obtained at the club office opposite the ground or by written application to the secretary.

But Morecambe, pleasant though it is, would seem small beer if plans for Rovers to visit Burma during the close-season go through. Yes, we said 'BURMA'. The invitation to the Far East has gone out to several clubs through the F.A. and negotiations are now proceeding with the football authorities in Burma.



OUR VISITORS

TONY READ (goalkeeper).—Born at Haydock, his first Club was Sheffield Wednesday, and in 1964 he left them to go to Peterborough. Was then transferred from there to Luton in March, 1965, to show his versatility, he last season made 35 appearances in the forward line scoring 12 goals besides six appearances in goal.

BOBBY THOMSON (right-back). — Born at Henstrie in Scotland. He first came into prominence with Partick Thistle, and was later transferred to Liverpool for a big fee. Luton secured his services from the latter Club on the 2nd August, 1965.

FREDDIE JARDINE (left-back). — Although born in Edinburgh, he played for two seasons for Dundee before coming South to Luton in 1961. Was signed as an outside-left but has since made the left-back position his own.

ALAN SLOUGH (right-half). — Another Luton boy who has graduated through the ranks of Schoolboy, Amateur and Apprentice Professional, being offered full terms in May, 1965. He is another boy on whom the Club will pin its faith for the future. Can also play with distinction at wing-half and inside forward, in fact he gained County Representative honours as an amateur in the latter position.

MIKE DOUGAN (centre-half).—The fourth Scot in Town's defence and was Manager Alan Brown's first capture after taking over at Kenilworth Road. Mike hails from Lanarkshire and was with Third Lanark before coming South to Leicester City where, last season, he made two first team appearances. Cost £7,000 when he moved to Luton.

JOHN MOORE (left-half). — In his second season for Luton. Previously played for Motherwell. Made 43 League appearances and scored five goals last season which can be said to be a satisfactory baptism into English football.

GRAHAM FRENCH (outside-right). — Born at Wolverhampton, Graham came into prominence when playing for Shrewsbury and whilst with them he gained Youth International caps for England. Later he played for Swindon and Watford, before joining Luton in October, 1965. Can play on either wing.

GORDON RIDDICK (inside-right).— Turned professional in April, 1961, following a short period of Apprenticeship. He has been with this Club since this date making many first team appearances equally well at full-back, half-back and as a forward. He was born at Langlebury.

DEREK KIEVAN (centre-forward).— There's a familiar name if ever we saw one. Derek has trodden soccer paths the whole way from Bradford (Park Avenue) through West Brom. (and England), Manchester City, Crystal Palace and Peterborough United until last week when Alan Brown swooped for his second capture.

BRUCE RIOCH (inside-left). — Although born at Aldershot he was brought up in Luton and represented the Town at School also having trials for the England Schoolboys Team. He signed Apprentice Professional in August, 1963, and full Professional in September, 1964. Made 21 League appearances last season.


