Like ourselves, Brentford have known much more successful days, having been members of the First Division in the not so distant past and who are now facing the considerable task of fighting their way out of Division Four.

In their efforts to do so, they have spent much money and, while they are by no means out of the promotion hunt yet, they have had rather a mixed experience on the field since being relegated at the end of last season.

One thing that is certain is that they will put up a hard fight today but, on their current home form, our boys should gain the points which could lead to a decisive advance in the League table.

Gradually, under the influence of Allan Brown, and the addition of experienced players like Max Dougan and Derek Kevan, the team is settling down into a powerful combination and

we certainly look forward to the New Year with every confidence.

It starts for us, next Saturday, with a tough Cup test against Bristol Rovers at Eastville, a ground on which successive Luton teams have fought some hard battles in the past.

With the improvement shown by the team recently, we are certainly not without hope of survival, even though the Rovers are very much in the hunt for promotion to the Second Division.

A draw is certainly not beyond the bounds of possibility and we would certainly fancy our chances in a replay which would be on the following Wednesday, kick-off 7.30 p.m.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Gordon Phillips (goalkeeper). A former Junior who is only 20 and has taken over the No. 1 spot from the experienced Chic Brodie.

Allan Jones (full back). A Welshman in his fourth season at Griffin Park. First Division experience with Liverpool. His consistency meant he only missed two games last season when he was watched by Welsh selectors.

George Thomson (full back). A Scottish Under 23 International who played in Everton's First Division Championship side. Previously with Hearts where he lost his place to Dave Mackay. Has just returned after cartilage operation.

Tommy Higginson (wing half). Can play in any defensive position and has often helped out at inside forward. Longest serving player, having joined in 1959 from Kilmarnock. Nearly 250 League outings to his credit.

Mel Scott (centre half). An expensive capture from Chelsea in March 1963 where he was an England Under 23 International. Fast and adaptable, he has often excelled in the "sweeper" role.

John Richardson (wing half). Only 17 but has been watched in recent weeks by Everton, Spurs and Leicester. Nephew of team manager Billy Gray and followed him from Millwall.

Tom Curley (winger). A Scot signed last season on a free transfer from Glasgow Celtic. Fought his way into the League side so well that he made 14 League appearances last season.

Bobbie Ross (inside right). A Scot signed last March from Shrewsbury Town

immediately after appearing in Fifth Round Cup tie at Chelsea. Scored over 20 goals for Shrewsbury in 1964/65 Season but has been used in linkman role at Brentford. Recently appointed Club Captain.

Ian Lawther (centre forward). Irish International who previously assisted Blackburn Rovers, Sunderland and Scunthorpe United. Had the distinction of being signed in the House of Commons by Brentford Chairman, Jack Dunnett, M.P. for Nottingham Central.

Brian Etheridge (inside right). Signed in middle of last Season from Northampton Town. Former England Youth International.

John Docherty (winger). A five figure fee was required to obtain his services from Sheffield United in December 1965. But John started his League career at Brentford in 1959 before transferring to United in March 1961.


