Club Notes

LAST time notes were written for this programme, they did not see the light of day through the unfortunate postponement a fortnight today of the home League match with York City.

That was brought forward to try to avoid having a gap of a month between home games, but the idea was beaten by the badly waterlogged state of the pitch and the match now goes back to its original date, May 13th, which incidentally, will be our last of the current season.

In the meantime, two away fixtures have been played without adding to our stock of points, or bringing to an end the strange inability of the team to show on opponents' grounds, anything approaching the form they have displayed fairly consistently at Kenilworth Road.

That the defeat at Aldershot last Saturday should have been as severe as 4-1 was a grave miscarriage of justice because, the truth is that we had the chances in the first 25 minutes, to have made certain of winning.

No team, playing away, can expect to treat the opportunities that came our way in such prodigal fashion, and get away with it, and the trouble that finally engulfed our team was largely of their own making, though it was thought that the penalty that brought the second goal was a harsh award.

Such has become the situation that it is absolutely imperative that no home points should be dropped, and we are well aware of the difficulty that is likely to be experienced in overcoming Wrexham this afternoon.

The Welsh side have the curious

record of having drawn exactly half their 26 League matches but, on the other hand, have lost only four and are very much in touch with the promotion issue.

Their manager, former England and Manchester United centre forward, Jack Rowley, has got together a very useful side which includes his latest signing, Don Weston, from Huddersfield Town, and a hard match is expected.

Since our last programme, there have been two departures from the club, Roy Lunmiss, the full back or centre half, who was having a trial period after his return from South Africa, has now decided to join the American club, San Francisco, but, for the moment, is still training with our players.

Then, this week, Tony Thear, one of four players offered free transfers last week by Manager Allan Brown, had a successful trial outing with Gillingham and was signed for the rest of the season.

For the first time, the League Cup Final will be played on a Saturday, and at Wembley, and a big crowd is expected for the meeting of West Bromwich Albion and Queens Park Rangers.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

John Reginald Schofield (Goalkeeper). John is a close season signing from Birmingham City, a club with whom he spent ten seasons—firstly as understudy to Gil Merrick and latterly as first choice for their first team. A great clubman who always gives of his best. Born at Atherstone, Warwickshire.

Stephen Darrow Stacey (full back). Steve was signed from Bristol City on the 25th February 1966, and was a regular member of the first team at Wrexham for the remainder of the season. A thoughtful player who tries to start attacks from behind whenever possible. Born Bristol on the 27th August 1944.

Thomas Peter Walt (full back). Peter arrived at Wrexham from Shrewsbury Town on the 6th November 1965, and has since proved himself to be one of the most useful utility players on the Club's books. Still only twenty-one years of age he has ample time to improve considerably during the next few seasons. Born Shrewsbury.

Terence James Oldfield (wing half). A close season signing from Bristol Rovers with whom he played from 1958 to 1966. Terry is a hard tackling wing half of whom great things are expected at his new club. Born Bristol. Plays cricket during the close season.

Graham John Turner (centre half). Was spoilt playing with Ellesmere Port Schoolboys, Graham joined the Wrexham Ground Staff and eventually signed professional forms on July 1st 1965. He actually played in the first team whilst still an amateur at seventeen years of age. Last season he played for England in their Youth Team against Scotland at Ibrox Park, Glasgow, but only turned out in one half of the game. He could become a very good player with anything like average luck.

David Powell (wing half). Signed from Gwydyr Rovers after some very good reports. David joined the Ground Staff at Wrexham on January 11th 1962. A

Welsh Youth International who has made steady progress since arriving at Wrexham. Born Dolgarrog.

David Campbell (winger). A local boy who returned to his home town after having trials with Manchester United. Still only nineteen years of age. David made some excellent progress last season.

Arfon Trevor Griffiths (inside forward). One of the most experienced players on the club's books, Arfon originally joined Wrexham on the 6th May 1957. He was transferred to Arsenal on the 3rd February 1961, but returned to his old club again on the 17th September 1962. An Under 23 Welsh International, Arfon gets through a tremendous amount of work for one so frail. Born Wrexham.

Anthony Joseph McLoughlin (centre forward). Signed from Everton during the close season, Tony is an ideally built centre forward. Standing 6 ft. 1in, and weighing 12 st 10 lbs, he could cause a number of defences a lot of trouble. Was with Everton for three seasons, but is still only nineteen years of age. Born Liverpool.

Samuel McMillan (inside left). The most experienced player in the side Sammy is now in his fourth season with the club. He was signed from Manchester United on the 24th December 1963. He has been capped for Ireland.

Matthew David Carrick (winger). Born at Ramshaw. David signed for Wrexham during the close season after having spent three seasons with Wolverhampton Wanderers F.C.


