It is three weeks since the further reconstruction began. Then, the majority of directors resigned to make way for a reshaping of the board; and, in the meantime, a great deal of time and effort has been expended towards this reconstruction and in other fields.

A short list of these candidates has now been prepared, and it can also be expected here that a definite announcement will be made in the very near future.

On a third matter, a meeting took place this week with a well-known brewery company, as a result of which our chairman, Mr. W. A. Hopcroft, promised to prepare plans for the erection of a clubroom on the Meadow Lane frontage.

The provision of seven-day facilities of this type would be a boon to supporters, and could well provide a considerable revenue for the club. Many other football clubs have successfully developed similar ventures in recent years, and it is strongly felt that it is a sphere of activity in which Notts. ought not to lag behind.

So, wait for it! There is a lot happening... and it all promises to come to the boil over a short period.

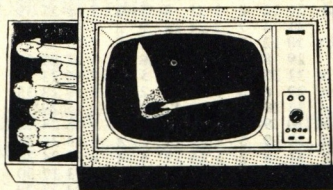

Naturally, the gates at both of these games will be keenly watched to see if they provide pointers to possible future policy.

In a frustrating season, Notts. County's 5-2 win at Luton last October stands out as the brightest day of all.

Today Luton, whom we warmly welcome to Meadow Lane, are out to avenge that defeat; Notts. are out for the season's first double. It adds up to an intriguing match—especially as the outcome is going to have an immediate bearing on the re-election zone placings.

Luton are managed by Allan Brown, one of their famous former players, and they are likely today to be represented by the following players:

Ron Swan (goalkeeper). A Scot who was with East Stirling be-

fore having a spell with Oldham Athletic, for whom he made 35 appearances last season, found his chances at Oldham restricted following the capture of David Best from Bournemouth, and moved on to Luton this season.

Bobby Thomson (right back) another Scot, he made his mark first with Partick Thistle and then he cost Liverpool a big fee. Switched from Anfield to Luton in August, 1965.

Freddie Jardine (left back) completes an all-Scottish defensive trio. Born in Edinburgh, he had two seasons with Dundee before joining Luton in 1961—as an outside left. Has since switched to full back with notable success.

Gordon Riddick (right half) most versatile player on the books. Was originally an apprentice professional with Luton, signing as a full professional in April, 1961.

Max Dougan (centre half) a former Third Lanark and Leicester City player who cost Luton a handsome fee when they signed him from Leicester—where his league chances had been limited—a few months ago.

John Moore (left half) a former Motherwell player now in his second season at Luton. Showed up so well in his first English campaign that he made 43 appearances and scored five goals. Recently on the injured list, when he was replaced by Alan Slough, a local product.

Graham French (outside right) born at Wolverhampton, he first created a stir when playing for Shrewsbury Town, being capped as an England Youth international while on their books. He later had spells with Swindon and Watford before linking with Luton in October, 1965.

Derek Kevan (inside right) most famed member of the side. Comes from Ripon and soon established himself with Bradford (Park Avenue). Later had notable playing success with

West Bromwich Albion (where he scored over 150 League and Cup goals in nine years), before Chelsea paid £40,000 for him in March, 1963. He was there for only five months before moving on to Manchester City, then to Peterborough United and, earlier this season, to Luton. Many times capped by England. He is no stranger to Meadow Lane, having appeared here in the representative team in the Centenary Match in 1962 and having scored the only goal of the game for Manchester City which, two years later, put Notts. out of the Football League Cup.

David Pleat (centre forward) needs no introduction here, for Nottingham is his home town and he started his career with Forest. Signed by Luton in August, 1964, he is now completely recovered from a broken leg injury.

Bruce Rioch (inside left) a local boy who had trials for an England schoolboys' place and first joined Luton as an apprentice professional in August, 1963.

Ray Whittaker (outside left) a Londoner, he was on Arsenal's books when capped for England Youth both in 1962 and 1963. Went to Luton in March, 1964, and has been a first choice ever since.
