Club Notes

HAVING taken three points from the first four away matches, we can feel reasonably well satisfied with the start that has been made to the season and the chance to consolidate the position comes with two consecutive home games, the first of which is against York City this afternoon.

York, who had to apply for re-election last season, have made a distinctly sticky beginning and come here still looking for their first victory.

However, they will be fighting to end their dreary run but, on current form, the points should come our way.

A real battle is expected next Wednesday when Southend United will be at Kenilworth Road (7.30). When we went to Roots Hall recently, we had just about all the bad luck that was going, as a result of which defeat by 3-0 was our portion, but things could have been very different had fortune been on our side.

At the same time, Southend are a smart outfit who may well take some stopping in the promotion race, but hopes are high that revenge will be taken for our only League defeat so far.

Unfortunately, at the moment, we are faced with a centre forward problem consequent on Rodney Green having to go into hospital for a cartilage operation which was performed successfully on Tuesday. We wish him a speedy recovery but, meanwhile, every effort is being made to plug the gap.

Early in the week, there was the prospect that Paul Aimson, of Bury, would sign and the hope was that he

would lead the attack against his club, York, this afternoon.

However, after coming to Luton for an interview with Manager Allan Brown, he decided that his business commitments were such that he could not contemplate a move to the south.

The manager has two other centre forwards in mind and the hope is that he will land one in time for Wednesday's match with Southend.

An appeal is again made to supporters and especially to the younger element to keep off the playing pitch at the end of the match.

This invasion, which seems to have become a ritual is tending to cause untold damage to the turf.

PEN PORTRAITS OF OUR VISITORS

Harry Fallon (goalkeeper). Fearless Scottish keeper signed from St. Johnstone. A former Scottish Junior International who made 30 first team appearances last season.

Gerry Baker (full back). Signed four seasons ago from Nottingham Forest. A versatile player who has appeared at half back and centre forward. Made 46 first team appearances last season.

Ken Turner (full back). Signed from Shrewsbury Town with Mike Walker. An ever present last season. Had also a spell with Huddersfield Town. A very steady and dependable player.

Dennis Walker (wing half). Signed some 4 years ago from Manchester United this stylish player has many admirers. With useful experience he should now be approaching his peak, and his craft should be a big asset to the City team.

Barry Jackson (centre half). Local born player whose consistent displays over the last decade have made him well known in this Division. The sheet anchor of the defence, an enthusiastic player who never gives up. Ever present last season.

Phil Burrows (wing half). Young grafting player signed from Manchester City. A regular first team player until an injury cost him his place late in the season. Made 42 first team appearances last season.

Stuart Alderson (winger). Signed in the close season from Newcastle United for whom he made 5 first team appearances in the First Division. A young North East boy who should settle in well with the City.

Ted MacDougall (inside forward). City signing from Liverpool. A young player for whom a big future is forecast. Cost City a big transfer fee, and carries much hope for the City's future.

Tommy Spencer (centre forward). Played for Glasgow Celtic and Southampton from whom he signed for the City Club. He became the top scorer last season in his first full season in the Football League. A young Scottish player very good in the air, who should benefit this season from his experience last season.

John Hawksby (inside forward). Local born player who joined City after service with Leeds United and Lincoln City. Thought to be the best schoolboy footballer from the City boys' team. With experience he has gained, should season settle down and make his mark in this Division.

Rowland Horrey (winger). Signed last season from Blackburn Rovers and made 51 appearances in the first team. A hard-working winger with a good turn of pace.

Stewart Fellows (wing half). The youngest full time professional on the books. Signed this season from Newcastle United. Has not yet appeared in the Football League although for a youngster he has considerable Central League experience.

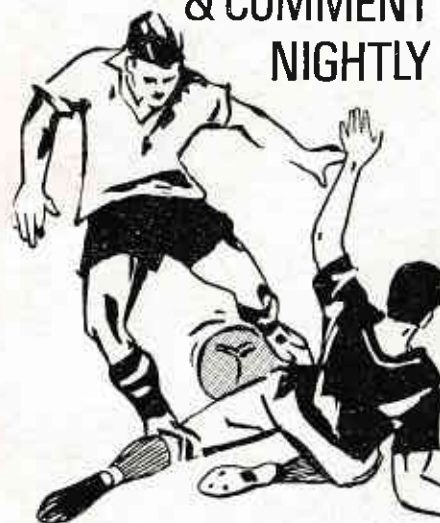
