NOTES AND NEWS

The Rovers splendid run of six games without defeat ended at Brentford on Saturday last. Voted one of the best games seen at Brentford for a long time, it was a ding-dong struggle with the Londoners just having the edge towards the end. The match was a personal triumph for Alick Jeffrey, whose two goals were brilliantly taken, the first being one of the finest ever seen at Griffin Park. Although the Rovers conceded four goals for the first time this season, the defence had plenty to do in endeavouring to hold the lively Brentford attack, who struck their best form, and generally did well.

The point at Wrexham, hard fought for, brought our total of away points to equal those of the whole of last season.

The Northern Intermediate League side were three down against Scunthorpe but fought back to equalise with goals from Sheldon, Allen and Brennan.

The search for new players to add to our comparatively small staff goes on and it is hoped that before very long news of signings will be forthcoming. In the meantime we hope our supporters will give the Club every encouragement by turning up in still greater numbers. Help is also needed by the various fund raising organisations—why not give them a hand? Your assistance will be most welcome.

OUR VISITORS

This evening we welcome Luton Town to Belle Vue. The teams met quite a few times in our Second Division days in the late 'forties and early 'fifties but Luton's last visit here was on November 23rd, 1965, when a 1-1 draw resulted.

Luton Town was formed in 1885 by the fusion of Luton Wanderers and Luton Excelsior and is the oldest professional club in the South. They were for a time in the Southern League but became members of the Football League—Division Two—in 1897-98. Three seasons later they lost their status and returned to the Southern League. It was not until the formation of the Third Division (Southern Section) in 1920-21 that they regained League status and in 1936-37 they won the championship and returned to the Second Division. Promoted at the end of the 1954-55 season, they spent five seasons in Division One but returned to the Second Division for the 1960-61 season. Three seasons later they dropped to the Third Division and in 1965 to Division Four. The Club's finest hour was in 1959 when they were F.A. Cup Finalists, only to lose to Nottingham Forest at Wembley Stadium by the odd goal of three. From their early days they were known as "The Hatters" and their ground at Kenilworth Road is a spacious one, the record attendance there being 30,069, when Blackpool were their opponents in the F.A. Cup in March, 1959. The Town were in the transfer market last week when they secured Ian Buxton from Derby County. With a 100 per cent home record they have lost but one game away, that being to Southend. They have had drawn games at Newport, Rochdale, Swansea and Wrexham. Here are pen pictures of their players:—

READ, TONY (Goalkeeper) - Transferred from Peterborough in March, 1965, previously with Sheffield Wednesday. Is equally at home in the centre forward position.

HARE, TOMMY (Right back) - signed from Southampton during the close season.

JARDINE, FREDDIE (Left back) - Joined Luton from Dundee in 1961. Started his career as an outside left.

DOUGAN, MAX (Right half) - Cost Luton a sizeable transfer fee in December 1966. Previous clubs Queens Park (Scotland) and Leicester City. Gained five Youth International Caps for England.

BRANSTON, TERRY (Centre half) - Signed in June from Northampton with whom he played regularly and has appeared in all four divisions of the Football League.

MOORE, JOHN (Left half) - In his third season with Luton, being a regular member of the first team. Previously with Motherwell.

FRENCH, GRAHAM (Outside right) - Has previously played for Shrewsbury, Swindon, Watford and Wellington Town before joining Luton in 1964.

BUXTON, IAN (Inside right) - Signed for five figure fee from Derby County last week.

ALLEN, KEITH (Centre forward) - Joined Luton from Stockport in exchange for Derek Kevan in March of this year. Previous clubs, Grimsby and Portsmouth.

RIOCH, BRUCE (Inside left) - Signed for Luton as an apprentice in 1963, becoming a full time professional in September, 1964 and is a regular member of the first team.

WHITTAKER, RAY (Outside left) - Previously with Arsenal with whom he gained England Youth International Caps before joining Luton in March, 1964. Regular member of the first team.
