## HAMILTON DEAL IS FINALLY COMPLETED

Since the last Fourth Division game at St. James's Park there have been quite a few developments from Mr. Frank Broome's office.

All the time the continued search for new forwards has been going on, but Mr. Broome's efforts failed until forty-eight hours before the Southend game last week-end.

But a telephone call from Eastville changed all that. It was the news Mr. Broome had been waiting for on inside-forward Ian Hamilton.

A hurried car trip to Bristol that afternoon clinched the Hamilton deal.

The player agreed to join the city on a month's trial, and made his debut at Southend. Unfortunately it was not a game in which he could show very much of what he is capable of, although he did produce some neat touches, particularly in mid-field.

This afternoon supporters have the opportunity to see for themselves what kind of a player Hamilton is. He has been one of Mr. Broome's targets for some time, and the most significant development at St. James's Park in the last fortnight.

Broome did say he hoped this would not be the last new face to be seen at the club, and he is still interested in a couple of other forwards who he thinks can do the club good.

The following morning, however, Mr. Broome received some disappointing news through the post.

It came from the Football Association and contained the decision on Bruce Stuckey—fourteen days' suspension after being sent off at Halifax.

There is one more event I would like to mention—Cecil Smyth's benefit match in mid-week. At the time of going to press, final arrangements were being completed, and I am sure we all hope that everything went off successfully for the full-back.

#### LUTON TOWN

It was not so long ago that Luton were a First Division club. But they have gradually dropped down through the ranks, and this afternoon they come to St. James's Park with a reputation of being something of a bogey side to Exeter City.

The City were drawn at home to Luton last season in the first round of the F.A. Cup, and were held to a 1—1 draw. In the replay at Luton the City were knocked out of the competition 2—0.

When Exeter went to Luton again for the league encounter they were soundly defeated 4—0. This was not one of the City's displays to be proud of.

So this afternoon Exeter will be out for revenge over Allan Brown's team. Manager Allan Brown is, of course, a former Portsmouth and Luton player and a Scottish international.

#### FRENCH MISSING

While not knowing the exact Luton side at the time of writing, one player who will be missing from their line-up is youth international winger Graham French.

He is one of the main dangers in the Luton forward line and supporters will no doubt recall how he gave full-back George Ley quite a hectic game last season.

But a 21-day suspension means French will have to sit this one out along, of course, with our own Bruce Stuckey. Even so, Luton have quite a strong all round side, and they could have a few new faces in the side this afternoon.

Probably at centre half will be Terry Branston, signed in the close season from Northampton; inside-right Micky Brown is another newcomer; so too is full-back Tommy Hare and wing-half Billy McDerment.

But even with French out, they could still have another England Youth international at outside-left. He is Ray

## DO YOU REMEMBER?

20 YEARS AGO: Supporters were acclaiming Angus Mackay as the best signing since the war, but although this player did all the scheming in a game at Aldershot and the City were on top for long spells they could not score. Indeed, City were later forced onto the defensive and were lucky to hold on to a point in a goalless draw. Reg Gibson was City's hero in defence. Bill Dymond, who had signed from Bristol City that summer but broke a wrist just before the start of the season made a come-back in the City's Colts team, obtaining special permission to play with a cast on his wrist.

Saturday, October 7th, 1967.

Football League:

Wrexham (home): 2-2.

After a disappointing first half, Exeter came right back into the game

The City did away with their first-half sweeper system in this revival and when Jimmy Blain switched to the forward line the whole side played better as a team.

Wrexham, managed by former Exeter player Alvan Williams, still a character in his own right, were a goal up in the first half and but for two bad misses in front of goal they could have had a more commanding lead.

But the pattern completely changed and when Bruce Stuckey and Jimmy Blain scored the City's goals it looked like two points for Exeter. But late in the game Ernie Wilkinson was unlucky to head through his own goal and the final result was a 2-2 draw.
