CLUB COMMENT**FOUR IN A ROW?**

It was perhaps inevitable that some time this season Valley Parade would be the scene of a tussle between two clubs where victory for either side would be a tremendous achievement, quite apart from the fact that two precious points were at stake. This is the fourth visit by a club in the top four promotion places so far. Lincoln City went away pointless with the winner having come five minutes from time; Chesterfield came with an unbeaten League record and returned with it at an end; Crewe Alex came as Fourth Division leaders only to be deposed by ourselves. Three victories out of three visits by top four teams—can we make it four in a row?

This game is even more interesting if only for the fact that Town have won all of their last eight League games—a sterling performance and promotion form by any high standards. These have consisted of five at home and three away, 27 goals have been scored and only six conceded, with the defence not having given away a single goal in no fewer than five of the games.

LUTON'S FINE ACHIEVEMENT

Luton are having an exceptionally successful season so far, in sharp contrast to that of the last campaign when they could only collect six points away from home all season. Shrewd signings by their manager, Mr. Allan Brown, have helped to put the club well on the way to returning to the Third Division for with two matches in hand they are only two points behind the present leaders, Chesterfield, and are level with us with three games fewer played.

Town have suffered only two defeats so far this season, both being away from home. In fact all Town's loss of points have been while on travel for they have a 100 per cent home record.

Their first defeat was on September 4th at Southend where they crashed 3-0 and the other was rather surprisingly at Doncaster on October 3rd. Since then they have not dropped a point in their eight game victory run. Can we halt it? We shall certainly have a darned good try!


PICTURE PERSONALITY

No. 10—BARRY SWALLOW
(left half)

Like father, like son! Following in his father's footsteps is Barry who has been with Doncaster Rovers and Barnsley, two clubs with whom his father, the late Mr. Eric Swallow, played as a full back.

Born in Doncaster, Barry went to Wheatley Technical Modern School, turning out for the school side, during which time he had two seasons with Doncaster Boys and trials for Yorkshire Boys. At the age of 16 he joined the Doncaster Rovers ground staff, Peter Doherty signing him on as an amateur, and then as a professional after a couple of months.

Barry made his League debut in Bradford when aged 18 at Park Avenue, and after two full seasons with the Rovers, with whom he served under over half a dozen managers, he joined Crewe Alexandra in 1962.

He returned to his native Yorkshire in August 1964 when he signed for Barnsley on a two month's trial and in the October was taken on by the club. In the 1965-66 season he missed only one League game, during which he captained the side and in addition to playing wing half and centre half, turned out for Barnsley at centre forward shortly before coming to Valley Parade on February 17th, 1967.

With us he has so far made 38 League appearances, scoring three goals. His debut for us was at Aldershot on February 18th this year and his first goal in the return game the following month.


