

TONY READ (Goalkeeper): Born Haydock. Originally with Sheffield Wednesday. Later went to Peterborough and joined Luton in March, 1965. Is equally at home at centre-forward.

MAX DOUGAN (Full-back): Previously with Queen's Park in Scotland and Leicester City. Cost Luton a sizeable transfer fee in December, 1966. An amateur international.

FREDDIE JARDINE (Full-back): Another Scot, from Edinburgh. Played for Dundee before coming South to Luton in 1961. Originally an outside-left.

BILLY McDERMENT (Wing-half): Transferred from Leicester City in July. Born Paisley.

TERRY BRANSTON (Centre-half): Signed in June from Northampton Town for whom he played regularly. Has appeared in all four divisions of the Football League. Born Rugby.

ALAN SLOUGH (Wing-half): Born Luton and graduated through ranks of schoolboy, amateur and apprentice before accepting full terms in May, 1965.

GRAHAM FRENCH (Winger): Previously played for Shrewsbury, Swindon, Watford and Wellington. Joined Luton in October, 1965. An England Youth international. Born Wolverhampton.

KEITH ALLEN (Inside-forward): Joined Luton from Stockport in exchange for Derek Kevan last March.

MICKY BROWN (Centre-forward): Born Slough and made League debut for Fulham where he spent five seasons. Joined Luton last July after two seasons with Millwall.

BRUCE RIOCH (Inside-forward): Born Aldershot but has lived in Luton most of his life. Signed as apprentice in 1963. Turned full-time in September, 1964.

RAY WHITTAKER (Winger): A Londoner from Bow. Played for Arsenal with whom he gained England Youth international caps. Joined Luton in March, 1964.

JOHN MOORE (Wing-half): In his third season at Luton. Previously with Motherwell. A Scot.

John Bettany, who has served the Oakwell Club extremely well since coming to Barnsley from Second Division Huddersfield Town in March, 1965, is making his 100th League appearance for the Reds this afternoon.

Bettany came as an inside-forward, but has since proved one of Barnsley's most reliable players in a mid-field role which makes great demands on his stamina and footballing ability.

He missed only four League games in the 1965-66 season and was an ever-present last term until a badly pulled muscle, sustained in the second half of the F.A. Cup third round clash with Cardiff City at Oakwell in January, put him out for the rest of the campaign.

This season, however, he has proved himself fully fit. He has missed only three matches and is playing better than ever.

Born Rotherham, he won a place in the Rother Valley Boys' team and on leaving school he had a spell with Wolves nursery team at Brampton and trials with Sheffield Wednesday and Lincoln City before joining Huddersfield.


