



CLUB NOTES

With the busy period continuing, we stage another attractive home match tonight, with Mansfield Town, one of the front-runners in the Third Division so far, being the visitors.

They were pegged back somewhat by their 3-0 defeat at Barrow on Saturday which will make them all the more keen to gain some reward tonight.

However, from the way in which our boys are playing at the moment, it is difficult to see any team holding them at Kenilworth Road and goals are coming regularly which is keeping the supporters happy.

While on the subject of support, it is appropriate here to say how pleased we are that the fans are appreciating so much the football that is being played. To draw nearly 13,000 on a shockingly wet day on Saturday is a true indication of the measure of enthusiasm there is in the town and district and, given fine weather, we expect an appreciably bigger crowd tonight.

Tomorrow morning sees the start of a short break by the sea for the players, who will arrive in Brighton in time for lunch and stay there until the match at the Goldstone Ground on Saturday. This will be our third meeting with the Sussex team in a short space of time and we know from previous experience that this will be a stern struggle.

Again, we expect a large following and a number of people are taking the opportunity of a weekend by the sea and a football match, as well.

After that, comes the visit to Everton in the League Cup next Tuesday and we are hoping to be able to screen this match at Kenilworth Road by closed circuit television. We feel that there will be a public for it and, if it does become definite we hope that there will be big support because it is a costly business and a 15,000 crowd will be needed to enable us to break even.

Should a replay be necessary, the date has not yet been fixed. Everton do not want the following Wednesday because it clashes with the Wales-England under 23 International in which they expect to have some players.

We were pleased to note a definite improvement on Saturday in the behaviour of the youngsters, so far as running on to the pitch was concerned. If this continues, everybody will be happy and there will be no need for any recriminations.



Dave Hollins (goalkeeper)

Signed from Newcastle United in February, 1967. Regular First Team 'keeper. Welsh International Brother John plays for Chelsea and England.

Stuart is a local boy who came up through the 'A' and Reserve teams. A very promising player who many predict a great future in the game for him. Also a good cricketer and had trials with Nottinghamshire C.C.C.

Phil Waller (wing half)

Phil was signed from Derby County in March, 1968. A very experienced wing half, hard in the tackle and a good user of the ball.

Ray Keeley (winger)

Ray was signed from the Southern League during the close season. Previously with Charlton Athletic.

A very good ball playing type of player who distributes with real skill. A London boy.

Malcolm Partridge (inside forward)

Malcolm has just signed professional after being an apprentice pro for twelve months. A good shot in either foot and shows a considerable amount of promise.

Bob Ledger (centre forward)

Bob was signed from Oldham Ath. last January. A very experienced player who can play in a number of positions in the team. Started his career with Huddersfield Town as an outside right.

Nick Sharkey (inside forward)

Nick was signed from Leicester City last March. Previously with Sunderland where he won Scottish International Under 23 Caps. Broke Sunderlands goal scoring record with five goals in a second Division match. Also a schoolboy International.






