CLUB NOTES

THINGS seem to be building up to a tremendous climax to the season for us, with the team holding an undoubted chance of regaining a place in the Second Division following a run of eight matches without defeat.

From this spell, 14 points have been taken and if this consistency can be maintained during the remaining weeks, then Watford and Swindon Town will be hard pressed to hold their present advantage.

It is, of course vitally necessary that we should make the most of the present sequence of home matches. A fine start was made on Wednesday with a 3-0 defeat of Bristol Rovers in an entertaining match.

Hopes are that a dose of the same medicine can be administered to another team who are in the lower reaches of the League table, our visitors this afternoon, Gillingham.

Already this season we have beaten the Kent team twice, each time by 3-1 and on present form, the result should be two more points, despite the fact that our former player, Gordon Riddick will obviously be all out to impress.

Two more home games are due next week, the first coming on Wednesday against Barrow, who were unable to fulfil the original fixture because their playing ranks were decimated by flu and then, a week today, there is something in the nature of a local derby when Orient provide the opposition.

After that comes three tough away matches, covering the Easter period and, by the time this hectic programme is over, we shall have a very clear idea of our prospects and about what exactly is needed from the clash with Watford on April 30th.

Several season ticket holders have asked if they will have to pay for this match. The answer is that they do not, and they will find that there are sufficient slips in their books to cover the contingency of matches having to be replayed. Supporters should note that the demand for tickets has been such that only a few are left for disposal.

Looking further forward, our Youth Team is to visit Holland again at Whitsun for the two day tournament in which they finished third 12 months ago.

Even more distantly ahead, we have arranged a most attractive home friendly as a pre-season pipe-opener against the Italian under 21 national team on Monday, 28th July.

In that a considerable guarantee has had to be made in order to secure this fixture, this is one of the most ambitious moves we have made in this direction and we hope to be fully supported.

Supporters are asked to note the new Bonanza draw which will be made at each First Team match. It began quite successfully on Wednesday after a minimum of publicity. Under the Lotteries Act, 50 per cent of the takings will be returned as prize money each time.

Finally, we would appeal to the irresponsible throwers of toilet rolls to stop this nuisance forthwith.

Our Lucky Mascot today is Philip Shayler of 7, Ampthill Road, Flitwick Beds. He is 11 years old. Today means a great deal for Philip for he emigrates with his family to Australia on April 10th, 1969 and we hope that today will remain in his memory for many years to come.



Derek Woodley (winger). Signed from Southend United in January, 1967.

Born at Isleworth, started his career with West Ham United.

Brian Yeo (inside forward). Born Worthing, signed from Portsmouth in the Summer of 1963. Made his 100th League appearance at the end of last season.

John Meredith (winger). Born near Doncaster, started with Doncaster Rovers and moved to Sheffield Wednesday. Signed by Chesterfield and left for Gillingham in March, 1964. Has made 182 League appearances in just over four seasons.






