Our Visitors—Luton Town

BLUES NEWS

Visiting Priestfield this afternoon are Luton Town, whose players so nearly gained their club promotion to the Second Division at the end of last season with a late burst. It was not to be as Swindon Town and Watford, Luton's near neighbours, both gained 64 points to Luton's 61. The Bobbers were ten points ahead of a fourth place Bournemouth.

The men from Kenilworth Road were last at the Stadium twelve months ago, on Saturday, 31st August, 1968, and they ran in 3-1 victors before our best League attendance of last season, 8,227. The teams and goal-scorers were:—

The only other post-war encounter here was in season 1964/65 when Brian Yeo (3) and Rodney Green (2) netted for us in our 5-0 win.

The League Cup success at Aldershot was certainly a tonic, but we find ourselves drawn away yet again, this time at Blackpool. We visit Bloomfield Road on Wednesday, 3rd September, kick off 7.30 p.m. Transport arrangements are being made for supporters wishing to travel and booking details are given on page six. If a replay is necessary, it will take place on Wednesday, 10th September, 1969, at 7.30 p.m.

The S.E. Counties League Cup First Round draw has given the Youth team a home tie with Q.P.R. on Saturday, 13th September, kick off 11.00 a.m. at the R.E. Garrison Ground, Brompton, which is sign-posted from the main road. Our juniors are also to entertain either 'Spurs or Aldershot in the Southern Junior Floodlight Cup, on a date to be arranged.

It was, incidentally, Denis Housden who made his second team debut for us against Oxford United reserves on Saturday, 9th August and not Andy Woolford, as stated in the Reading programme on this page—sorry for the confusion lads! That error apart, we have received many compliments on the new-style programme. Glad you like it.

FOOTBALL WORLD

Two goalkeepers of days gone by who might be remembered by some of our older supporters, are still attending the games as spectators. ALF SIMMONDS, who served under manager Hendry, was quick to point out that the first Third Division fixtures were of course 49 and not 29 years ago. GEORGE ROBINSON, a reserve keeper just after the war watched the pre-season friendly at Folkestone.

After watching the cup tie at Aldershot, our former centre half and captain HARRY HUGHES gave praise to the victory by saying, "It's worth going anywhere to see a game like that." Harry was playing for Guildford in the Southern League before breaking a leg and now runs a sports shop in the city.

Fulham used 31 players for the Division Two matches last season and 17 men shared 40 goals. Leading marksmen were Brian Dear (now Millwall), with six in 13 appearances and Malcolm MacDonald (playing today for Luton) who hit five in ten games.

The world record transfer fee for a player is £440,000, which Juventus paid Varese for Sicilian forward Piero Anastasi, a member of Italy's European Championship winning side.

It will probably come as a surprise to most people, but Gillingham have done far better than Manchester United in the League Cup. United have only entered the competition twice before and in their first attempt (1960-61), they drew 1-1 at Exeter. United won the replay 4-1, but last 2-1 to Bradford City in the Second Round. It was not until 1966-67 that they tried again and this time, after gaining a first round bye they were beaten 5-1 at Blackpool(!)

Oxford United and Brighton both withdrew from the South East Counties League at the end of last season. Arsenal, however, have re-entered their strong side from the Metropolitan League to give a round figure of sixteen clubs in the competition for 1969-70.

In the Southern League twenty years ago the Gills followed up their impressive victories in August with some disappointing results in September—a 1-1 draw at Hereford, a 2-1 defeat at Hastings, whom they had beaten 8-1 only two weeks earlier, and a 2-2 draw at home to Chelmsford.

THE LUTON STORY

By May 1959, Luton had reached the pinnacle of their success, although beaten 2-1 by Nottingham Forest they had played in the F.A. Cup Final at Wembley and on the way there had attracted a record attendance of 30,069 fans to Kenilworth Road for the Sixth Round tie against Blackpool. And for four years now they had been proud members of the First Division. Suddenly the dream shattered, relegated at the end of the next season, down to the Third in 1963 and finally dropping to the bottom grade in 1965. Gradually they began to fight their way back, took the championship in 1968, and under Alec Stock narrowly failed to take another step higher last term.

The club was formed in 1885 when Luton Wanderers and Luton Excelsior amalgamated and five years later they became the first professional side in the South by paying three of their team a 5/- wage. At the end of the season it was decided to pay all the players 2/6 a week, plus an extra sixpence for away games and payment for working time lost before noon on Saturdays. In their early days the "Hatters" took the field in the striking attire of navy blue and pink halved shirts with caps to match.

They joined Division Two in 1897 for a short stay of three years before returning to the Southern League. The Third Division (South) was formed in 1920 and the Town became founder members, winning the title in 1937. In the year before Joe Payne established the Football League record for the most goals scored in a game by netting ten in Luton's 12-0 victory over Bristol Rovers. Their rise to fame came in 1955 when they filled the runners-up spot to gain the coveted position in the top division.

SCRAPBOOK OF TEN YEARS AGO . . .

Gillingham completed August 1959 with long journeys north to meet Rochdale and Darlington on the 27th and 29th of the month respectively. In the first match a freak goal against in the third minute meant goodbye to both points and at Darlington the Blues were again unlucky and went down 2-1. Annoyed at the injustice of the defeat, manager Harry Barratt stated that one of their goals was "a penalty that never was" as the incident was two yards outside the area, but the Gills still returned home empty handed. The next Fourth Division fixtures were both at Priestfield and the club maintained their 100 per cent home record with a 2-0 win over Rochdale in the return encounter and a 3-1 success against Aldershot.
