

Eric Pugh's Page



While there was some disappointment over the loss of a home point to Torquay United, this was alleviated to some extent by the fact that the team were able to share the spoils with Rotherham at Millmoor last Saturday.

Not that it was a very inspiring game, but in the words of Manager Alec Stock, 'The thing about this game is not to lose.'

In point of fact, the Town's away record is quite fantastic with fourteen points having been gathered out of a possible eighteen.

Cushioned their loss

That, to some extent, has cushioned the effect of the loss of four points in drawn games at home, where the formula has not worked quite so smoothly.

Today, in what is obviously an absolutely vital match with Barnsley, who also have ideas about the Second Division next season, expectations are that the Town will go over to a more attacking policy, with probably a return to two raiding wingers.

Chance to drive home advantage

Now, the Town are entering a period in

which they could go a very long way towards clinching their ambitions about winning the promotion prize.

This is the first of three consecutive home League games, all of them against teams who could represent some sort of challenge to Luton before the end of the season.

After Barnsley come Rochdale, who are very much the surprise packet of the Third Division and are probably doing better than even they envisaged after their elevation from Division IV.

Attacking football

And they have accomplished their success by playing attacking football and there seems no doubt that they will come here

a fortnight today as the leading scorers in Division III.

On the Tuesday after their visit, we will welcome Fulham for the first time in many years. With Johnny Haynes still a name to be conjured with, they have an attractive side which has not done quite as well in the lower circle as had been expected, but for all that, they can be dangerous opponents.

Gate of 20,000 plus?

Already, considerable interest is being taken in this match, judging by the demand for stand tickets and this may well be the occasion for the gate to top the 20,000 mark for the first time this season.

Aim from this trio of important matches must be six points. Should that happen, then the Town can contemplate the onset of the heavier grounds which they expect to suit them even better than the hard surfaces on which they have been playing with a certain amount of detachment.

Out of luck in the cup draw

Before those next two games, comes the Cup-tie at Bournemouth next Saturday. Obviously, the club had been hoping for a home draw and the odds-on chance of securing a place in the second round of the FA Cup.

Equally, they probably feared the prospect of being drawn away to a non-League club of which they have had somewhat unfortunate experience in the past.

Certainly, it is in their favour that they have won on their last two appearances at Dean Court, although on the other hand, they will remember somewhat forcibly that Bournemouth got away with a point here in a goalless draw on 7 October.

Disappointing season

On that occasion, Bournemouth looked a competent, efficient outfit but, for all that, they are having a thoroughly disappointing season and look as if they might have to struggle to avoid relegation.

In the whole of their long history, they have never been out of the Third Division, but they are certainly drifting towards trouble.

Before today, they had played eleven League matches without a victory and, curiously, their last success was by 5-1 against Tranmere Rovers at Prenton Park.

League Cup success

Seemingly, they reserved their best performances for the League Cup in which they knocked out Bristol Rovers, Sheffield Wednesday, after a draw at Hillsborough and finally bowed out, but not without a struggle, to Leicester City at Dean Court.

Despite their ambitions in the League, the Town will not want to fall at this first Cup hurdle and there seems no reason why they should, providing that they can maintain the consistent form they have been showing away from home.

Long tradition

At the same time, Bournemouth have a long tradition of being doughty Cup-fighters and, certainly, the Town will not tend to under-estimate the toughness of their task.

Since the last programme was published, Laurie Sheffield has left the club, to re-join one of his former ones, Doncaster Rovers.

A great-hearted trier, Sheffield had to be content with reserve team service during his last weeks at Kenilworth Road, following the arrival of Matt Tees from Charlton Athletic.

Suited everybody

However, one does not forget the plucky displays he gave in this season's League Cup and all supporters will wish him the best of luck in his new career.

This was a transfer which suited everybody. Sheffield has continued to live and train in Doncaster since he joined the Town and, as he said at Rotherham last Saturday when he watched his former colleagues in action, it will save him a good deal of travelling.

Support away from home

From the Town's point of view, they recouped a goodish slice of the £9,000 fee they paid Oldham Athletic for Sheffield's transfer, and they might not have



Barnsley equal division III best *By Tony Pullein*

Barnsley, unbeaten in their last eight matches, share with Rochdale the longest unbeaten run in the Third Division at the moment. Including last season's results, they have lost only one of their last ten away games, and that only by a penalty goal to nil at Doncaster. They won at Bury (2-1), Tranmere (1-0) and Gillingham (3-1), drawing at Bristol Rovers (3-3), Plymouth (0-0), Bradford City (1-1), Fulham (0-0).

This Barnsley side is full of experience. Jimmy Robson won a League Championship medal and an England under-23 cap while with Burnley, his first club, and scored their goal in the 1962 FA Cup Final. A prolific scorer, he once hit five goals in one game against Nottingham Forest and was top Burnley scorer with twenty-six League goals in 1960-61. Blackpool signed him in 1964 and he moved to Barnsley three years later.

Top scorers

Joint top scorer at the moment, with six goals, is George Boardman, a close-season signing from Shrewsbury. George became a Scottish amateur international during his days with Queen's Park FC of Glasgow, joining Shrewsbury in 1963.

Sharing the scoring lead with Boardman is John Evans, who set out with Liverpool. After transferring to Bournemouth, he suffered an injury which seemed to have ended his career. He tried to come back in non-League football and, later, Stockport brought him back to League soccer. He was their top-scorer in 1963-64, though he moved to Carlisle before the season ended. He topped Carlisle's list in 1964-65, moved off for a short spell with Exeter City before joining Barnsley in 1966. John was Barnsley's top marksman two seasons back.

Attack is stable

Eddie Loyden didn't make much of an impression with either Blackpool or Carlisle but soon hit the goals trail at Chester, topping their list with twenty-two in 1967-68 - including one four-goal smash against Lincoln. He joined Barnsley during the summer of 1968, hitting twelve goals for them last term. The attack, which has remained stable for several weeks, is likely to be completed by Bob Earnshaw who has served the club so well in almost 200 senior games since his debut in 1962-63.

Wonderful service

Another Barnsley discovery who has given

wonderful service is Eric Winstanley, who has reverted to centre-half after finishing top scorer with fourteen goals last season. Eric completed his 250th League appearance for the club this season. Three other members of their outstanding defence came out of the junior sides. Barry Murphy, ever-present for the past two seasons, won his debut in 1962-63. Pat Howard came in four years ago, while David Booth got his chance early last season and quickly established himself as a regular member of the side.

Was with Huddersfield

Wing-half John Bettany, who first tasted League football with Huddersfield in 1960-61, has been with Barnsley since 1964. Goalkeeper Brian Arblaster was kept out of Sheffield United's League side by former England player Alan Hodgkinson but got his chance after moving to Chesterfield in 1964. Three years later he switched to Scunthorpe but, after only one season, he joined Barnsley. He has established himself as first choice this season.

Won only one

Barnsley, who first came to Luton in 1899, have won only once in twelve League visits. Our League record against them is:



Trains have been booked for the visit to Bournemouth

Two trains have already been booked for the Cup-tie at Bournemouth next Saturday and a third will be available if the demand makes it necessary.

Fare will be £1 and the first train will leave Luton at 9.35 a.m., arriving Bournemouth 1.05. Departure time will be 5.45 p.m., arriving Luton 9 p.m.

Second train will depart at 10 a.m., calling at Harpenden five minutes later and St Albans at 10.10. This will arrive in Bournemouth at 1.20 p.m.

Encouraged

Return journey will start at 6.10 p.m., arriving at St Albans 9.15, Harpenden 9.20 and Luton 9.25.

So far we have been vastly encouraged by the smooth way in which our chartered train trips have gone and there has not been the slightest hint of trouble.

However, supporters should note that there will be no rail trip for the following away match at Mansfield on 29 November.

This would entail supporters disembarking at Nottingham and completing the journey by coach which, we feel, is too complicated a procedure and might lead to the trouble which we have gone to such pains to avoid.

Not Feasible

Wherever it is possible to make a direct journey, we shall run trains, but we feel that the one to Mansfield is not a feasible proposition.

Our new Sports Centre at 231 Dunstable Road is now open, though there will be an 'official' opening day later on.

Among the articles on sale there are the new Luton Town T shirts on which there are pictures of the players - price 12s 6d. Also available are club blazer badges, 7s 6d each.





One thing that must have been of considerable encouragement to the team in away matches has been the measure of support accorded to them.


This has increased, of course, since the club's decision to charter trains for away games and transport the fans at a most reasonable price.


