From the Chairman

Although it is only a few hours since my appointment as Chairman by the Directors in meeting last evening I have received many messages of congratulations, some of sympathy and even one or two from my closer friends wondering if I was in need of psychiatric treatment in accepting the Chair at such a critical time in the career of the Club.

I can assure all that I have accepted the post with my eyes fully open and being well aware of the heavy responsibilities which accompany it. Having been a Blackburn Rovers' supporter for the majority of my life, I am honoured by the confidence placed in me by the Board and can assure you that I will carry out the duties to the best of my ability.

I know that some of the decisions which I will have to make will not be acceptable by all, but I can assure you that these decisions will be based on my opinion of what is in the best interest of Blackburn Rovers, and I would like to be judged on this basis. My first aim is, of course, to make sure that Blackburn Rovers regain their glory of the past and to this end I insist that all members of the Club be Blackburn Rovers minded. If they are not of this mind then as far as I am concerned they can leave and make room for someone who is. Loyalty to the Club must be foremost in the minds of all.

I have today spoken to the members of the Managerial, Secretarial and Training Staff and I am sure that I have their backing in what I am trying to achieve. I will be speaking to the Captain and players along similar lines as soon as possible, but definitely before you read this.

As a new man in the Chair, I request you, the supporters, not to be too impatient and to assist by giving the Club your fullest support in these trying times.

FROM THE RECORD BOOKS

FOUNDED in 1885 by the amalgamation of Luton Wanderers with Luton Excelsior, Luton Town were the first Southern club to employ professional players. They were in the Southern League from 1894 to 1896 and the following year became members of the Football League Division Two.

They failed to gain re-election in 1900 and returned to the Southern League until the Third Division of the League was formed after the First World War. They won promotion to the First Division in 1955 and had five years at the top before being relegated. They fell as far as the Fourth Division, in which they spent three seasons and after two more seasons they won their way back to the Second Division and are now going strongly for a return to the First Division.



GET BACK SOON, JIMMY . . .



BLACKBURN ROVERS DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION

TONY READ (goalkeeper): Born at Haydock. His first League club was Sheffield Wednesday, and he joined Luton from Peterborough United.

JOHN RYAN (right-back): Luton got him on a free from Fulham. Born at Maidstone and had spells with Tonbridge and Arsenal before going to Fulham.

JACK BANNISTER (left-back): Signed as a midfield player from Crystal Palace two years ago. Born at Chesterfield, he had spells with Scunthorpe and West Brom before going to Palace.

ROGER HOY (right-half): Luton paid Crystal Palace £20,000 for him in the close season. Began his career with Spurs before being transferred to Palace.

CHRIS NICHOLL (centre-half): Signed by Luton from Halifax Town last year for £30,000. Burnley turned him down after a trial and he went to Halifax from Cheshire League side Witton Albion.

ALAN SLOUGH (left-half): Born at Luton and is one of Luton's biggest assets. Several First Division clubs have asked about this fine young player.

JIM RYAN (outside-right): One of Luton's three close-season signings from Manchester United at a package deal of about £35,000. A Scot from Stirling.

DAVID COURT (inside-right): Formerly with Arsenal, and Luton had to pay £35,000 for him last summer. Aged 26, Court made more than 50 First Division appearances for Arsenal in two seasons.

MALCOLM MACDONALD (centre-forward): Target for many big city clubs is this young striker who is the top scorer in the league. At Fulham he played either at back or midfield, but Luton have turned him into one of the most efficient finishers in the game.

MIKE KEEN (inside-left): The club captain. Had ten years with Queen's Park Rangers before his transfer to Luton for a fee of £18,500. He has rejoined his former Rangers' boss, Alex Stock.

DON GIVENS (outside-left): Another of the ex-Manchester United players. Born in Dublin and joined the United staff from school. Already honoured by the Republic of Ireland.

VIVIAN BUSBY (inside-right): Luton blooded him late last season after he had left the amateur ranks with Wycombe Wanderers. Had a short spell with Queen's Park Rangers as an amateur.



Married with two children, Mr. Johnson is employed by a shoe company. He is interested in gardening and coin collecting.


