
# AYRESOME AIRS



## Featuring ... LUTON TOWN

Luton fans who mourned their passing from the First to the Fourth Division in five dramatic years during the 'fifties can scarcely believe that the Hatters are in such a wonderful position to regain First Division status this year. But it is true enough — Luton are one of our strongest challengers in the promotion race.

Much of their success is due to the shooting form of **Malcolm Macdonald**. Last season's leading Third Division scorer with 28 League and Cup goals, Malcolm is now among the Second Division's crack shots — he has scored 25 times so far, including two hat-tricks. But he has missed a penalty in each of their last two games! Three years ago Malcolm was full-back with Southern League Tonbridge. Fulham signed him, converted him into a striker and he joined Luton in 1969.

Due to the prolific-scoring Macdonald, **Don Givens'** scoring record tends to get overshadowed. But he has hit 11 valuable goals. Don won two international caps before making his League debut for Manchester United last season. Though he has since remained a member of the Republic of Ireland XI he didn't get many first-team opportunities at Old Trafford. So he signed for Luton last April.

**Peter Anderson** made an extraordinarily quick rise from amateur circles into the League spotlight last month. He was playing for Isthmian Leaguers Hendon when manager Alec Stock signed him and immediately promoted him to the League team.

In 11 years with Arsenal, **David Court** distinguished himself in several positions, turning out for the League team as striker, in mid-field and defence. He was a member of the Gunners' team beaten at Wembley in the 1969 League Cup Final. Luton signed him in July last year. **Mike Keen** was introduced to League football by Queens Park Rangers in 1959/60 and gave them wonderful service over 10 years, participating in their remarkable rise from the Third to the First Division — a feat he wants to repeat with Luton this season! When manager Alec Stock left Rangers for Luton he quickly went back to his old club for Mike's signature.

**Jim Ryan** developed in soccer's top academy at Manchester United, signing for Luton last April.

Goalkeeper **Tony Read** didn't make the League team at Sheffield Wednesday and only got a couple of chances at Peterborough. When he did make the grade at Luton it was as striker — he hit 12 goals in 1965/66. And that included one hat-trick!! Now he has reverted to goalkeeping.

Halifax spotted **Chris Nicholl** playing for Witton Albion and rushed him into their first team two seasons ago. He aided the club's first-ever promotion effort, then moved to Luton just days after playing a blinder against them in the League Cup last season.

Fulham gave **John Ryan** his chance in their League eleven during the 1967/68 season and he played regularly for about a year. Luton signed him during the following campaign. **Alan Slough**, a Luton discovery, was introduced to the senior side when it was in the Fourth Division in 1965/66.

Luton signed **John Moore** from Motherwell five years ago and he missed only seven League games in his first three seasons at Kenilworth Road. **Roger Hoy** went to Luton from Crystal Palace last summer. Spurs first gave him League status but it was in his two campaigns with Palace that he began to make real progress.


