One of our loyal supporters told me that whenever I say in this page that we are approaching the Easter programme with confidence we have a disappointing holiday. So I promise never to do so again!

At Sunderland our sound team performance on the ground where we scored three goals in an exciting F.A. Cup win was undermined by a freak shot from 35 yards by a full back.

The home games against Oxford and Queen's Park Rangers were disappointing and played on a tricky bone hard pitch. Then at Hull last Saturday Terry Mancini was concussed in the opening minutes and the re-shuffle that followed forward Bobby Moss's arrival as substitute did not help.

May I commend especially for your interest our first team match against West Ham on this ground on May 10. So our last game on this ground is against the same star players with whom we played a pre-season friendly. This time it is in aid of the testimonial for Dave Harper, our loyal wing half.





Keith Walker, now one of the country's best known referees, began his career in 1946 with the Blackpool and District Amateur League, progressing with the West Lancashire League, the Lancashire Football Combination and the Central league before being promoted to the Football League line in 1959.

He became a Football League referee in 1961 and a referee on the F.I.F.A. list in 1970. He moved to Kent and is now registered with the Kent F.A.

In 1967/8 Mr. Walker refereed the Irish Cup Final and he has officiated in many matches abroad including games in France, Spain, Germany, Belgium and Portugal.

Father of three sons aged 16, 13 and 10, Mr. Walker is employed by Kent County Council Estates Department and lives in Maidstone. His hobbies include judo, fishing, badminton and cricket.

MAN FOR MAN

Luton, our companions in promotion from the Third Division last season, were very nearly in a position to repeat the feat without us this time around. Their brave drive to reach the First Division at the first attempt has only just faltered and ever-successful manager Alec Stock now experimenting a little with his team for next season. These are his current first team men:

KEITH BARBER: Made his League debut last Saturday. Signed professional forms for Luton in February from Southern League Dunstable Town, a neighbouring club.

JOHN RYAN: A real bargain picked up 18 months ago from Fulham on a free transfer. Born at Maidstone and had spells with Tonbridge and Arsenal before securing League experience with Fulham. Firmly established at right back.

JACK BANNISTER: Signed for £8,000 from Crystal Palace three years ago as a midfield player but now settled in at left back for Luton. Before joining Palace had experience with Scunthorpe and West Bromwich.

DAVID COURT: Luton's costliest signing when bought from Arsenal for £35,000 last summer. Court had previously spent his entire playing career with Arsenal and made 55 First Division appearances in his last two seasons at Highbury.

ALAN SLOUGH: Although often asked after by leading First Division clubs, Slough has made it clear he wants to continue with his home town club's own drive to the top and is under a long contract. A good defensive wing half currently filling in at centre half during an injury to highly rated **CHRIS NICHOL** who may be back today.

JOHN MOORE: Ending his sixth year with Luton since joining them on a free transfer from Scottish club Motherwell. A strong defensive half back.

PETER ANDERSON: Until February was still an amateur with Hendon but signed professional forms for Luton within days of his League debut as an amateur and is currently being given a run at outside right.

VIV BUSBY: Had a short spell with QPR, Alec Stock's immediate past club, before signing pro for Luton from top amateur club Wycombe Wanderers. Has now netted some vital goals for Luton.

MALCOLM MACDONALD: Another player snapped up and developed to Fulham's embarrassment. Stock paid £17,500 for a full-back-cum-forward in time for him to score 25 promotion winning goals last season. Now valued at nearly £200,000 and linked with Manchester United and Newcastle in talks of £300,000 deals also involving centre half Nichol.

MIKE KEEN: Club captain who spent ten years with QPR, some of them under Stock. Signed by Stock from QPR for nearly £20,000 after leading Rangers into the First Division and to League Cup glory at Wembley.

DON GIVENS: Last of four recent Luton signings from Manchester United and most regular in the first team. Cost a five figure fee. Dublin born and now on the brink of full Eire international honours.

ROGER HOY: Cost £20,000 from Crystal Palace last summer, the deals being ironed out in the sun of the Costa Brava where both clubs were touring. Began his football life with Spurs before moving to help Palace reach the First Division.
