# Jimmy Adamson talks . . . about Soccer



**IT IS good to be back in action at Turf Moor after the summer break of three months, and of all the teams in the Second Division there are none we respect more than Luton Town, last season's sixth-placed club. I say that despite the fact that Malcolm MacDonald, whose striking ability stood out a mile this time last year when we won a friendly at Kenilworth Road, has moved on to Newcastle United for a near-record fee.**

We welcome to Turf Moor all the Luton Town officials, staff, players and, of course, supporters.

Although they dropped a home point last Saturday against Norwich City in a game of two penalties (Norwich's was in the last seconds) Luton will obviously be among the leading promotion candidates under the astute guidance of Alex Stock. As far as we ourselves are concerned we aim to get back into the First Division at the first attempt if that is humanly possible. This must be our target and after our display against Cardiff City in last Saturday's 2-2 draw I believe it is a realistic one.

There will not be any excuses for relegation from me. A manager should try to legislate for injuries and for a bad run of the ball, so I accept the blame for us going down after 24 memorable years. It is something we have had to accept within the club. We have had to take it on the chin, but we are not sitting back. On the contrary - we shall fight our problem with just one aim in mind. PROMOTION.

These catastrophic last 12 months have been a personal nightmare for me, but I look not backwards but forward to what I am sure is still going to be a bright future for OUR club. I would like to point out, however, that no matter what anyone outside the club might care to say to the opposite effect, tremendous efforts were made behind the scenes to find new players during 1970-71.

We knew early on last season that we had a goal-scoring problem and we did our best to put it right but it was not an easy matter to tackle. Even now in my office drawer I have a list of 34 experienced players who we have looked at during the last year of frustration. For some I was not willing to pay the ridiculous prices asked. Others, having watched them in action, I did not reckon would fit in. And there was one player in particular who we were willing to pay the price for but he would not come as "Burnley isn't a city club."

One way and another it was an experience that my staff and I could have done without

but we realise what we are up against in this game and that the system is not exactly geared the way of clubs like our's.

Last season was not all loss. I learned a lot about people and in Mr. Bob Lord I had the biggest ally any manager could wish for. The board as a whole assured me that money was available for players - and this was before the inevitable transfer of Ralph Coates - but I was not going to go out and buy for the sake of it.

I was helped all round by many, many people from the board of directors downwards. I had terrific help from all my staff and as for our players some of them had bad games, some of them found form hard to achieve, but one thing of which I am sure is that they cared and still do care about the club.

As far as our supporters are concerned no praise is too high and that is not only my opinion but that of all the players. Often when we lost a match last season it was the fans for whom the members of the team most felt sorry. There was no slow handclapping, there were no jeers because you knew that they gave their best.

I feel that our future can still be rosy even though we had had this severe setback. I would ask for you to be patient a little longer and the time may not be far off when we have something to celebrate.

I was well pleased with the display at Ninian Park and it was an achievement to start off in the Second Division with a 2-2 draw after being two goals down after 36 minutes against opponents who will certainly be in the running for the championship of the division.

I was delighted with the amount of skill we showed, David Thomas being particularly impressive in this and I was happy in that we managed to find the net twice for lack of goals was plainly our major headache in relegation season. Most of all, though, it was a satisfactory team effort from the viewpoint of the fighting spirit shown by the players when they could have been excused for thinking it was not their day. This must have been the case when after Brian Clark had scored in the ninth and 36th minutes

Frank Casper had wretched luck with a low shot that had goalkeeper Jimmy Eadie beaten until it hit him on the left leg.

Clark accepted his two chances smartly, and we shall have to guard against repeats but in fairness to our defenders I must say that the ball ran unkindly with the second due perhaps to a blustery wind and rain-affected turf.

It looked at half-time as though we had an uphill fight on our hands but we scored a splendid equaliser midway through the second-half, Frank Casper scoring from a yard out and then Martin Dobson pushed an equaliser through, David Thomas doing the spadework each time.

Not many teams will come away from Ninian Park with a point and we can surely be forgiven for thinking that one of our toughest matches is already out of the way. All in all, a very encouraging start to the season on which we naturally hope we can build greater things but we know a long and not always happy road lies before us.

Compared to last year at this time, our physiotherapist, Jimmy Holland has (thankfully) been almost completely "out of work." We had no injuries to worry about prior to last Saturday's games, but Jimmy was in action on Sunday dealing with Steve Kindon, who received a knock on the leg at Cardiff and Jim Thomson who came off during the reserve game with bruising to his ribs.

Currently visiting us to study training methods at Gawthorpe is Israel Fleischer, who coaches Israeli club FC Makbi Natana. The facilities and set-up has impressed him a lot, he tells us.

# ★ Welcome to Luton Town ★

LUTON TOWN had a very good season in 1970-71, but they still just failed to gain promotion, finally finishing sixth behind Leicester, Sheffield United, Cardiff City, Carlisle United and Hull City. In away games Town - of whom TV comedian Eric Morecambe is a director - won six times, drew six and lost nine, scoring 22 goals and conceding 25.

Their most impressive away results were at the Filbert St. ground, where they won 2-0 against Leicester City, and at Hillsborough where Sheffield Wednesday were thrashed 5-1. Town also scored 1-0 wins at Portsmouth, Watford and Orient and triumphed 2-0 over Hull City at Boothferry Park.

The Hatters' top scorer with 30 Second Division goals was big **Malcolm MacDonald**, who has since been transferred to Newcastle United for a massive fee, leaving much of the striking responsibility on that likable former Manchester United forward **Don Givens** and on former Wycombe Wanderer **Viv Busby**.

Givens is one of four ex-Manchester United players with **Alex Stock** at Kenilworth Road and apart from the free-scoring MacDonald was top League scorer in 1970-71 with 11 goals. Dublin-born, he has been in the Eire international side for the past two years.

One face in the Luton line-up that Burnley fans will quickly recognise is that of centre-half **Chris Nicholl**, a former Turf Moor junior. Born at Macclesfield, Chris went to Luton by way of Witton Albion, **Peter Mellor's** old club, and of Halifax, who sold him to Luton for a reported £30,000. Last season he was one of the best centre-halves in the whole of Division Two.

Wing-half **David Court** cost Luton £35,000 when he moved from Arsenal just over a year ago. For a long time Dave was in the first team at Highbury and made a total of over 150 appearances for the Gunners. Luton skipper is **Mike Keen**, who used to play for Q.P.R.

Another former Old Trafford player is winger **Jimmy Ryan**, a Scot from Stirling who made a

big impression with Luton fans after his move. **Roger Hoy** was one of Town's best signings, joining them from Crystal Palace and before going to Selhurst Park he had a spell with Tottenham.

Goalkeeper **Tony Read** has been displaced several times but has always found the confidence to bounce back as first choice. He has nearing 200 appearances for the Hatters after service with Sheffield Wednesday and Peterborough United. Tony is a native of Haydock.

**Ken Goodeve** was signed from Manchester United 12 months ago as a centre-half but towards the end of last season he did well in the Second Division eleven as a left-back.

Right-back **John Ryan** is probably the best free transfer signing Luton have ever made because he was allowed to leave by Fulham after having made 21 appearances in their first team. In two seasons with Luton he has played in 78 games out of a possible 88 and has developed into a fast, dependable defender. A Londoner, John was with Arsenal before going to Craven Cottage.

It is only just over a year since Burnley met Luton in a friendly at Kenilworth Road, the Clarets winning 2-1. **Geoff Nulty** and **Colin Waldron** headed goals for Burnley and Luton's goal was a penalty converted by MacDonald.






