# MATCH SCENE

LUTON TOWN have perhaps gained more fame in the north east as the club that sold **Malcolm Macdonald** to Newcastle United for a 'substantial' fee rather than being acknowledged for the quality of their football, although manager Stock is perhaps one of soccer's perfectionists!

The Soccer Who's Who describes the Luton team boss, **ALEC STOCK**, as a Manager. A simple definition for a straight-forward idealist... a popular idealist, who is in his 22nd year in Football League management.

Stock first attracted national attention in 1949 when, as manager of Southern League Yeovil Town, his team reached the fifth round of the F.A. Cup — beating ourselves in the process!

The next year the unflappable Stock was appointed manager of Leyton Orient, then a struggling Third Division side. Though he left them to become assistant manager at Highbury in 1956, he returned to Brisbane Road and remained long enough to see Leyton become a Second Division side.

He also put a lot of work towards Leyton gaining a place in the First Division three years later. Stock later went to Shepherds Bush to help the Queens Park Rangers Club into the First Division. Finally, when **Tommy Docherty** was appointed manager of the Rangers he left to join his present club as Chief Executive.

Last year, Luton just missed out on promotion. They had the goalscoring talents of Macdonald, the power of **Don Givens** and the youthful brilliance of **Viv Busby**, but a tough Easter programme knocked them completely out of the promotion reckoning and they had to be eventually satisfied with sixth place.

During the close season they sold Macdonald to the 'Magpies' for a considerable profit on the reported £20,000 fee they paid to Fulham.



### MIKE MCGIVEN

This season they have signed **Vic Halom** from Fulham and **Gordon Hindson** from Newcastle as forward line replacements.

Their first 11 games this season only produced 11 goals and added to that, seven of those games were draws and four of them ended 0-0 so it is not hard to see why Stock has spent this season.

In last seasons games against Luton we won 2-1 at Kenilworth Road with goals coming from **Joe Baker** and **Bobby Kerr**, and we drew 0-0 with them at Roker Park.

**Mike McGiven** does not like to remember the game at Luton last year. He fractured a leg and this was only the start of his injury problems.

# PERSONALITY PROFILE

When JIMMY "CHICO" HAMILTON came on as substitute against Preston North End he had a story book ending to his first team debut by scoring the winning goal five minutes from time.

The goal was a perfect example of how to head a ball. Chico jumped perfectly to hammer home Ian Porterfield's precise cross to give the North End 'keeper no chance of saving.

The goal enabled young Jimmy to hit the headlines in all the Sunday papers and he was featured in most national's for the rest of the following week. "I was chuffed with all the publicity," admits Jimmy "It's great to see your own name in the papers."


The young Scot from Uddingston — about eight miles from Glasgow — has made rapid progress since joining us in the summer. He was previously on West Bromwich Albion's books as an apprentice professional, but couldn't settle in the Birmingham area and was released by them at the end of last season.

When Jimmy returned home he had plenty of offers from Scottish clubs, but his heart was still set on "making it" in English football and when Manager Alan Brown offered him an apprenticeship at Roker Park Jimmy jumped at the chance.

"It's a chance I'm glad I accepted," adds Jimmy, "I have settled at Sunderland wonderfully well. The people have been so good to me and indeed, to the rest of the lads who are trying to settle here. Apart from the set-up at Roker Park and Washington, which I think is great, the town is good and it's not all that far away from home and my parents are able to come down more often."

When Jimmy was at school — Hozier Secondary — his father, also called Jim, used to encourage him all the time and, in fact, used to offer young Jim incentives! Two 'bob' a goal was the bonus and on one occasion Jimmy put six in the opposition's net and earned his biggest ever bonus!!

"I owe a lot to my father," says Jimmy, "I remember when the clubs were coming round asking me to sign for them he told me to stay as near to home as possible, but I wouldn't have any of it and I signed for the Albion. As things turned out he was right." Among the many clubs seeking Chico's signature were Crystal Palace, Nottingham Forest, and Coventry, but he is now with Sunderland.

# The Hatters are here Today!



**TONY READ (goalkeeper):** Despite the fact that he has been displaced on occasions, Read has always managed to bounce back as first choice for the position, and is nearing the landmark of 200 League appearances for Luton. Born in Haydock, Sheffield Wednesday gave him his first chance and he moved on to Peterborough United. There, an embarrassment of goalkeepers, caused him to play in the forward line for the Reserves and he has had League experience as a striker for Luton!

**KEITH BARBER (goalkeeper):** Came late into the game as a professional, being in his early 20's, but looks an extremely good prospect, having already made a successful League debut. Comes from Vauxhall (London) and played for Dunstable Town in the Southern League before Luton signed him on a permanent basis.

**JOHN RYAN (right-back):** Probably the best free transfer signing Luton have ever made because he was allowed to go by Fulham after having made 21 appearances in their team when they were relegated from Division II. In the two seasons he has been with Luton, he has made 78 out of 88 League appearances and has developed into one of the fastest, most dependable full-backs in the Second

Division. A Londoner, he had a spell with Arsenal before going to Craven Cottage.

**ALAN SLOUGH (left-back):** At 23 years-of-age Slough has a wealth of experience, all of it gained with his home town club, Luton. Most adaptable, he began his career as a full-back, had a spell in the attack and then it seemed that he had found his best place as a driving force in midfield. However, it was then decided that he would serve the Club better in the back four where he had a brilliant spell last season.

When First Division clubs were showing an interest in him, he asked for a long-term contract, and signed one for three years with the option of a further three.

**DON SHANKS (left-back):** Served his apprenticeship with Fulham who did not offer him terms as a full-time professional, so Luton snapped him up. Since then, he has developed quickly having been a regular member of England's youth team squad and he did not miss a match during their triumph when they won the Little World Cup in Czechoslovakia during the summer. Is now regarded as being ripe for League bleeding.

**MIKE KEEN (wing-half):** One of the most consistent players in the game, something that was recognised last Easter when the Club presented him with a silver salver to mark his 500th League appearance. Most of these were made for Q.P.R. whom he captained during their meteoric rise to Division 1 and in their League Cup triumph. Luton paid Rangers £18,000 for him, made him their captain and he has been a tower of strength to them. Toured Australia with the F.A. party this summer and was appointed captain.

**DAVID COURT (wing-half):** A record fee for Luton of £35,000 changed hands when this clever midfield player moved from Arsenal just over 12 months ago. For a long time was a member of the first team squad at Highbury where he made over 150 first team appearances and it came as something of a surprise when the "Gunners" agreed to let him go. In fact the deal went through only after protracted negotiations.

**CHRIS NICHOLL (centre-half):** Most of the football world was taken by surprise when Luton paid Halifax Town £30,000 for his transfer only a day after he had put up a storming display against them. Has developed into one of the most commanding centre-halves in the Second Division and is now rated in the £100,000 class. Born at Macclesfield, he had trials with Burnley who did not keep him, and Halifax signed him from Witton Albion for a reported fee of £750.

**PETER ANDERSON (outside-right):** Made his debut whilst still an amateur, against Watford on 13th February and was signed as a professional the following week. Previously he had been one of Hendon's most prominent stars and the move into the higher circle did not worry him because he maintained his place for most of the rest of the season.

**DON GIVENS (forward):** Fourth member of the ex-United quartet he came as a centre-forward but spent much of last season in the number 11 shirt, though operating as a striker. With eleven goals he was second leading scorer and it is reasonable to assume that he will boost this total this time. Dublin born, he has been a regular member of the Eire team during the last two seasons.

**VIV BUSBY (forward):** With the departure of Malcolm Macdonald to Newcastle United extra responsibility has developed on this 21 years-old player who made a brilliant ending to last season. Early on he found it difficult to command a regular place because of a succession of injuries. Several First Division clubs have shown interest in this former Wycombe Wanderers player but Luton have turned down all enquiries.

# All sides in form this season!

IT'S NICE TO BE HOME AGAIN, following three successive away games. We only picked up two points out of six, but we were desperately unlucky not to have won at both Birmingham and Charlton.

From the moment **Bobby Kerr** put us into the lead at St. Andrew's with a superb volleyed goal it looked as if it was going to be our day, but it was not to be. **Bob Latchford** grabbed an equaliser for the Blues a few minutes later and we had to do a lot of hectic defending for a 20 minute period, but we survived. On clear-cut goal chances we should have got both points!

At Charlton, after a delayed start, we went into an early lead thanks to a goal by **Billy Hughes**. The half-time score was 2-1 an own goal giving us our second — and Charlton only managed to get a point when they equalised with a penalty that was taken **THREE** times!

At Oxford it was United all the way, but again the ball didn't run for us especially when **Dennis Tueart** and **Billy Hughes** hit Mick Kearns' goalposts.

Our playing record, on the whole this season is impressive. The first team are placed seventh in the Division Two table with an excellent chance of improving their position over the next few months. We have home games against possible promotion contenders Luton Town — today — Blackpool, Bristol City and Millwall.

However, it is the reserves and youth team form that has been really impressive this term. In the North Midlands League the reserves have not lost a game while completing notable victories over sides like Hull City and Halifax.

The youth side with **Ray Yeoman** in charge have played really well. Apart from an off-day against Sheffield Wednesday when they lost 5-0 they have won all their other games including two games in the Northern Intermediate League Cup Competition when they beat Scunthorpe United 5-0 at home and 4-0 away.

For the Reserves **John Lathan** has been among the goals and **Colin Symm** has put in several useful performances at half-back. **Derek Forster** although not having a lot to do has dealt extremely well with what he has had to do.



The youth team have all played consistently well, but **Ken Henderson** — our penalty prize king — has been knocking in the goals regularly and **Dave Shannon** has given him plenty of support up front. Another player knocking in the goals now is **Graham Southwick**, Graham injured his right leg in pre-season training and has only just become match fit.


