MATCH SCENE

What a great game against Nottingham Forest! Our young side were brilliant in their cutting down of the Forest. Brilliant attacking football was the hallmark of the destruction of the Midlanders. Although Forest are not the best side by any stretch of the imagination to play at Roker Park in recent years we did make them look a far poorer side than they actually are.

After all, if you look at the record of Forest before they came to Wearside, they had won four and drawn two of the remainder of their programme. Not bad for the worst side to visit Roker Park in years — or so the critics tell us!

The first half against Forest was a continuation of the great football that we played against Aston Villa a few days earlier at Villa Park. It was amazing that we didn't get a point against Villa. We completely outplayed them and showed nothing for our efforts.

As these notes were written before the first team game at Oxford last Saturday I do not know if the team continued its great form. The Manor Ground has not been a lucky ground for us in the past and, indeed, we probably played our poorest game against Oxford last season when we were beaten two goals to nil and never really showed any of our true form.

Today's game against Luton is against a team of new faces. During the summer Mike Keen, Don Givens and Chris Nicholl all left for new Clubs. Added to the players Manager Alec Stock has left to take up a new challenge in the form of Fulham. The change was based on purely personal reasons because Manager Stock was feeling the effects of his 120 mile round trip from his home in Epsom to the Kenilworth Road ground at Luton.

Luton Town are now under the guidance of new manager Harry Haslam, formerly Chief Scout with the Club, and new coach Roy McCrohan. Together they have "revolutionised" the Luton Town style. Gone are the days when they employed midfield safety tactics and in their place they have substituted an all-out attacking policy.

Many teams play with a maximum of four players up front to get the goals, but Luton are claiming they play with six goal-hungry forwards!

as not being good enough, **Viv Busby**. Busby has been in fine form this term and, indeed, since his return from the pressures at Gallowgate he has hardly put a foot wrong.

Busby's fellow forwards are all men bought from other clubs except **Peter Anderson**. They are **Jimmy Ryan** and **John Aston** two former Busby Babes at Manchester United; **Rodney Fern** from Leicester City and **Vic Halom** from Fulham.

Another man who was snapped up by Luton is former England fullback **Bobby Thompson**. He cost nothing from Birmingham City and he is now showing some of the form that won him several England caps in the mid-sixties.

Last season we only drew with Luton at home, but at Kenilworth Road **John Lathan** cracked in a goal to give us the spoils in an attacking display of football.

Luton are not the best away side in the business, but they did have an impressive victory at the City Ground, Nottingham not so long ago. They were beaten, however, convincingly at Hillsborough by **Derek Dooley's** men by four goals to nil. They will be hoping to atone for that fairly hefty defeat and, no doubt, we can expect a tough game against the Hatters.

How good at it is he? Carol adds: "He can beat me, but that does not make him brilliant!! Keith says he is only playing at half pace when he plays against me though".






