INTRODUCING...

BURY TOWN

A nostalgic return to Kenilworth Road today for former Luton manager Allan Brown, who brings his team of Fourth Division promotion chasers in search of Cup glory. And undoubtedly he will instruct his side to seek success by playing attacking football.

Bury are one of Fourth Division's highest-scoring sides and they possess in Brian Williams, Derek Spence and George Hamstead three players who are all scoring regularly this season.

Williams is a youngster, discovered by Bury, who has been on the verge of England youth honours for the past two seasons. Spence, a former Northern Ireland inter-

national, was spotted by Oldham while playing for Crusaders. He made his League bow two seasons ago and joined Bury for a £2,500 fee in September 1972. Hamstead was once on Rotherham's books and after leaving them he signed for York City in 1964. Two years later he moved to Barnsley, holding a first-team place for four years. After being released, he signed for Bury in 1971.

Bury have a mixture of youth and experience in midfield where the selection will probably be made from Billy Rudd, Ian Miller, David Hughes and Alan Tinsley.

Billy Rudd was a Manchester United groundstaff boy but didn't

make their League team. Birmingham gave him his break in 1959/60 but it was after signing for York in 1962 that he really settled in League soccer. Grimsby signed him in 1966 and he later served Rochdale until joining Bury in 1970.

Mr Brown signed 18-year-old Ian Miller from Perth junior club Geanfield Swifts this summer but he has already established himself firmly in the first team pool. David Hughes was another close-season signing, but Bury had to

pay Southport £4,000 for him. David had spent only one campaign at Southport who he joined from his first club Preston.

Alan Tinsley is another ex-Preston player. He had only one season in their first team before transferring to Bury in 1970. Starring in Bury's defence is former England centre-half Peter Swan who joined Bury from Sheffield Wednesday this summer. Swan, who won 19 England caps, made his League debut for Wednesday back in 1955/56 but

was out of the game for eight years from 1964. He made a remarkable come-back at Hillsborough last season.

Swan plays dual centre-back with David Holt, while Steve Hoolickin and Keith Kennedy normally play on the flanks.

Holt is a Bury discovery who came through the juniors to take his League chance in 1969/70. Hoolickin arrived from Oldham, where he had been only an occasional first team player, this summer, while Kennedy was signed from Newcastle for £3,000 last season, winning an immediate first-team place.

John Forrest is Bury's goalkeeper. He initially came into the

side in 1967/68 and has now made well over 100 first team appearances.

Bury were held to a goalless draw at home to Oldham in the first round of the League Cup but proceeded to beat the Third Division side 3-2 on their own ground, Tinsley, Spence and Miller all scoring goals. In round two the Shakers defeated another Third Division side Cambridge United 2-0. Spence scored both goals.

Bury can look back on some outstanding Cup achievements. They won the F.A. Cup twice just after the turn of the century and in 1963 they reached the semi-finals of the League Cup.
