From the boardroom

THE road to Wembley is paved with . . . There are far more Dick Whittingtons these days than ever before, and although some of the most fashionable clubs in the country are still actively engaged in the Football League Cup many have fallen by the wayside, and there could be a couple of shock teams taking part in the final. Not that that would be a bad thing for the game, for the sooner it is again accepted that any side is in a game with a chance, not of avoiding defeat but of winning, the better it will be. That Leeds United are "running away" with the League championship is a remarkable performance, but it is not good for the competition. A race is a poor spectacle if one horse jumps into the lead from the start and is never headed.

The shock results so far experienced in the League Cup have for some been disappointing, but we would not be dismayed if they continued especially if we were involved in the cause! Our draw in the third round at Luton last week was reckoned by the pundits to be among the "surprise" results, but naturally we did not think so. Nor would we be surprised if tonight we defeated the Second Division side. Nor for that matter would the Hatters be surprised if they won!

Which suggests that it could be an eventful and exciting struggle to find who will play either Millwall or Bolton Wanderers in the fourth round. That we would be delighted to tackle the Wanderers at Burnden Park goes without saying. There's something about a local derby that has its own special appeal, and we do not get them

now we are in the Fourth Division. So here's hoping we have a League Cup engagement at Burnden Park.

We continue to hold our 100 per cent League record at home, but points continue to be lost when visiting. Our boys had a somewhat traumatic experience at Barnsley on Saturday where they were beaten after enjoying a two-goal lead in the first half. This was a game packed with interesting football and a credit to the Fourth Division. That we left the points behind was very disappointing, for unless the team can begin to collect when visiting the struggle to keep among the leaders will be much more difficult. No side ever won promotion on home points alone.

Efforts continue to be made to strengthen the Reserve side, and on Saturday the team gave a much more convincing display in drawing at Gigg Lane with Leeds United. A big fight is on our hands to get away from the bottom rungs but there is developing a much improved pattern of play which suggests that brighter days are ahead. We hope so!

In Bury's first win in seven weeks the forwards were on brilliant form. Butler opened up the scoring in the 7th minutes from a overhead kick by Robbie, however this did not dampen the spirit of the County players as they kept making short and strong attacks on the Bury defence.

In the 14th minute Robbie was once again involved in a goal which he laid on for Ball who beat Hardy with no trouble. Bury kept on the pressure for the rest of the game but in the 84th minute County came back with a goal by Critchley.

LUTON TOWN

LUTON TOWN established more than a club record with the sale of centre-forward Malcolm Macdonald to Newcastle United for £185,000 in May 1971. That fee made him the highest priced player to leave the Second Division, and Macdonald's personal contribution in two seasons at Luton had been 58 goals.

Thirty-four years before the Macdonald era, Luton had another headline-making centre-forward in Joe Payne, their top scorer, with 55 goals, when they gained promotion to Division Two in 1937. The previous season Payne, who later joined Chelsea, scored ten goals as emergency centre-forward in Luton's 12-0 win over Bristol Rovers. It is an individual scoring record that has never been equalled in League or F.A. Cup football.

In 1955 Luton moved up to Division One after a triple tie on points, their superior goal average allowing them, and not Rotherham, to be promoted with Birmingham. Four years later they reached the F.A. Cup Final for the first time, losing 2-1 to Nottingham Forest. But in 1960 Luton were relegated (with Leeds) and continued to drop to Division Three in 1963 and to the Fourth in 1965. The way back began with promotion to the Third Division in 1968 and two years later Luton were welcomed back to Division Two.
