## VIEWPOINT

In between the time that I wrote this piece and the time that you began to read it, a little more sorting out has gone on in the various divisions. The power crisis and the three day working week, plus the Xmas holidays imposed the same strain on the printers as it did most other industries and as far as these notes go, Millwall, Preston and Notts County results are unknown.

**They are unlikely to affect the overall second division picture .... it'll still be a case of Middlesbrough and two others for promotion and you'll still be able to take your pick of a dozen clubs.**

It hasn't been a good year for soccer with England's failure to qualify for West Germany this summer, the biggest single blow to the game but by no means the kiss of death that the mourners tried to convince us it was back in October. We've still the Scottish bid to look forward to next June and I hope that any need to extend our own season doesn't take its toll of the 'Anglos' in the side.

**There were signs that the degree of violence on the field increases in relation to the points yield ... generally speaking the show of muscles tends to come from the have-nots; and finally there was the slump in gates that early kick-offs seemed to bring that brought the cry for a shutdown that fortunately went unheeded.**

Not that it was all gloom and despondency. If you looked around for bouquets to award where better to start than Leeds. Their twenty games unbeaten league run to break a record ... and the manner that they achieved it was an object lesson for the other ninety-one league clubs. Even this far ahead manager Don Revie looks an odds on bet for the Manager of the Year award. There is no question that Leeds are destined to be the team of the year.

**After the morale shattering Cup final defeat both the team and the manager had to dismiss all those 'over the hill' verdicts and bounce back .... the same bouncing back that Malcolm Allison and Brian Clough are faced with next season.**

Middlesbrough took over from Burnley as the second division team of the year and despite all those misgivings that are still echoing around, three up and three down was the idea of the year. If the first division is as exclusive as most people claim, why don't the relegated teams go straight back up .... I've said before, it's a dozen or so years since Chelsea did it.

**Two things I'd like to see in 1974 .... first a bigger penalty for the violent offences compared with the trivial happenings that injure no one, coupled with an ending of the attempt to shift responsibility for thuggery from the managers and players to the referees, the players' union .. Joe Soap, Basil Brush or anyone that's handy.**

Secondly, an end to all the half baked ideas for changing various rules. It's not the game that's wrong but the way that some teams play it .... and they're in the minority.

### THE VISITING CLUB by Tony Pullein

Luton Town will create history if they succeed in their promotion bid — they would become the only club relegated from the First to the Fourth Division ever to regain their place at the top. In the early 'sixties they dropped through all four sections in five years.

Manager Harry Haslam has done a tremendous job since taking control almost two years ago. Because of financial problems Luton had sold such outstanding players as Malcolm Macdonald, Don Givens and Chris Nicholl in the year before Mr Haslam took over.

But he has rebuilt the team swiftly, signing players of the calibre of Bobby Thomson, a former England defender, and winger John Aston last season. He also risked a then club record fee of £50,000 in a reasonably unknown player, Barry Butlin, who has proved a big success.

Mr Haslam this season raised the record payout to £80,000 when he secured the transfer of Burnley's midfielder Alan West, then expended a further £70,000 in return for the experience of striker Jimmy Husband.

Now Luton are poised to return to Division One after a 14-year-absence. It was a victory over us at Kenilworth Road earlier this season which really set the Hatters on the way to the top of the table.

Luton had been crushed 0-4 in their opening game at Nottingham Forest so they were in particularly determined mood when we visited them a week later. The Hatters were five up in 25 minutes and 6-0 in the lead by half-time. We finally lost 6-1 though Luton had never previously beaten us in a League game!

The record now reads:



Luton Town F.C., formed in 1885, first entered the Second Division in 1897. But they dropped out three years later and didn't return to the League fold until becoming a founder member of Division Three (South) in 1920.

They had to wait until 1937 before they regained Second Division status which they held until a fantastic finish to the 1964/65 campaign saw them scrape into the First Division on goal-average. Contrary to most people's expectations, Luton made a good impression in the highest sphere and by 1959 they were good enough to earn themselves a Wembley visit to meet Nottingham Forest in the F.A. Cup final. Unfortunately, they struck a completely off-day and, though Forest played most of the game with only ten men, Luton were still defeated, by two goals to one.

Luton's fortunes took a dramatic turn from that day at Wembley. Twelve months later they were relegated to the Second Division, in 1963 they sank into Division Three and two years later — disaster, disaster! — they plummeted into the Fourth Division.

They won the Fourth Division championship in 1968 and two years later gained promotion to Division Two.

## MEN OF THE OPPOSITION

**GRAHAM HORN** (Goalkeeper). Luton paid Arsenal £25,000 for Graham and, though he had not played in the Gunners' first-team, he played several League games for Portsmouth while on loan to them last season. He has now established himself as first-choice at Kenilworth Road.

**League record: Arsenal nil aps.; Portsmouth 22 aps.; Luton 20 aps.**

**DON SHANKS** (Defender). Don had hoped to make the grade with Fulham, who signed him as a schoolboy. He later became an apprentice at Craven Cottage but he was released in January, 1970 when they didn't feel he would make the grade. Luton took a chance on him, soon he was in the England youth team and two seasons ago he got his chance in their League team.

**League record: Luton 67 aps., 1 gl.**

**JOHN FAULKNER** (Defender). John first sprang to national fame as the centre-half of amateurs Sutton United who met Leeds United in the F.A. Cup four seasons ago. He played so well that Leeds signed him shortly afterwards. When he dropped out of the reckoning for a first-team place he linked with Luton two seasons ago.

**League record: Leeds 2 aps.; Luton 49 aps., 1 gl.**

**ALAN GARNER** (Defender). Alan made his League debut for Millwall against Blackburn in October, 1970 but he got only one further chance in the Lions' team. Luton signed him in 1971 and last season he became a regular member of the defence.

**League record: Millwall 2 aps.; Luton 57 aps., 2 gls.**

**BOBBY THOMSON** (Defender). Bobby won eight England caps, and made 15 appearances for the under-23's, in his Wolves' days. It was in 1961/62 that he made his way into the Molineux club's senior eleven. He joined Birmingham City in 1969 and towards the end of 1971/72 he spent a few weeks on loan to Walsall. Luton signed him at the end of that season.

**League record: Wolves 277 aps., 2 gls.; Birmingham 62(1) aps.; Walsall 9 aps., 1 gl.; Luton 64 aps., 1 gl.**

**PETER ANDERSON** (Midfield). Peter made a quick conversion from non-League circles. Signed from Hendon in 1971, he went immediately into Luton's first-team in 1971/72 and was their top scorer. Peter grabbed two goals against us at Kenilworth Road this season.

**League record: Luton 99(3) aps., 19 gls.**

**JIMMY RYAN** (Midfield). Jimmy was for several years a Manchester United player but it was after his transfer to Luton in 1970 that he began to play regular League football.

**League record: Manchester United 21(3) aps., 4 gls.; Luton 99(8) aps., 9 gls.**

**JOHN RYAN** (Midfield). John, a Fulham regular in their First Division days, joined Luton in 1969 and was ever-present for two years until missing a few games last term.

**League record: Fulham 41(4) aps., 1 gl.; Luton 174(2) aps., 7 gls.**



BOBBY THOMSON

**ALAN WEST** (Midfield). Luton paid a club record £80,000 to sign Alan this season, yet they might never have had the chance. Alan developed in Burnley's juniors and, when he lost his first-team place this season, he had apparently signed for Sunderland. It the Roker club called off the deal on medical grounds.

**League record: Burnley 41(4) aps., 3 gls.; Luton 11 aps.**

**BARRY BUTLIN** (Defender). Last season Luton paid Derby a then club record £50,000 to sign Barry. Unfortunately, he was struck down by injury soon after his arrival but is now fully fit again and is one of the Hatters' top scorers. Barry began his career with Derby but spent several months with Notts County on loan.

**League record: Derby 4 aps.; Notts County 30(1) aps., 13 gls.; Luton 27 aps., 12 gls.**

**JIMMY HUSBAND** (Striker). A recent arrival from Everton, Jimmy's transfer cost Luton £70,000. Jimmy made his League bow for Everton in 1965 and later won five England under-23 caps. Earlier he had played in school and youth internationals.

**League record: Everton 158(7) aps., 43 gls.; Luton 3 aps.**

**JOHN ASTON** (Striker). Luton paid £30,000 for left-winger John who had starred in so many games for Manchester United — none more so than in the 1968 European Cup final. After breaking his leg, John never really re-established himself in the United side but he has certainly enjoyed his new lease of life at Kenilworth Road where he was top scorer with 12 goals last season.

**League record: Manchester United 139(17) aps., 25 gls.; Luton 56 aps., 14 gls.**

**ROD FERN** (Striker). Rod spent several seasons as a Leicester first-team player, topping their scoring list in 1969/70. Luton signed him last season.

**League record: Leicester 132(17) aps., 27 gls.; Luton 30(5) aps., 5 gls.**



**FOR YOUR INFORMATION**

We apologise to readers for the fact that the statistics, etc. appearing in this issue are not up to date. The reason of course is that because of the printer's close-down over the holidays the programme had to be printed before the break.

After negotiation with the appropriate Government Department the Football League have succeeded in obtaining a slight relaxation on floodlight usage over the holiday period. Clubs have been granted permission to use lights if they wish this afternoon and consequently we are able to revert to the normal kick off time of 3.00 p.m. The cup tie on Saturday, however, will kick off at 2.00 p.m.

Although the Aston Villa match, postponed from December 1st, has been rearranged for Wednesday, 20th March, the new date may now be in jeopardy unless the ban on floodlights has been lifted. Villa have recently acquired a generator and if the power crisis had not been resolved then the game on 20th March would go on with the lights being powered by a generator. The recent ban on generators has now ruled out that possibility and as there will be insufficient natural light at that time it will mean that everything will have to be back to normal or a further postponement will be necessary.
