Founded : 1885.

Joined Football League : 1897 (Division 2).

Honours : Division One best, 8th in 1957-58; Division Two runners-up, 1954-55; Division Three runners-up, 1969-70; Division Four champions, 1967-68; Division Three (South) champions, 1936-37 and runners-up 1935-36. F.A. Cup finalists 1959. League Cup best, 4th round 1963.

Luton did a smart deal for goalkeeper **GRAHAM HORN** last season for they paid £25,000 to Arsenal while the player was on loan to Portsmouth. As Portsmouth took their time to decide whether they wanted Horn permanently or not, Luton nipped in to make the signing.

Defender **DON SHANKS** is rated an outstanding prospect. A former England Youth player, Shanks was a Q.P.R. fan as a schoolboy once sold programmes outside the ground where Rodney Marsh was his idol. Experienced **BOBBY THOMSON** won a number of full England caps when he was in his prime at Wolves. He played nearly 300 games for the Molineux club and also had spells with Birmingham and Walsall (on loan).

Top scorer **PETER ANDERSON** is an enterprising midfield player who joined Luton from the amateur club Hendon. Since then he has made almost 100 appearances. Central defender **JOHN FAULKNER** moved from amateurs Sutton to Leeds as the prospective successor to Jackie Charlton, but a run of injuries restricted his progress and he moved to Luton for a modest fee to replace Chris Nichol, who went to Villa.


Alongside Faulkner is **ALAN GARNER**, a Londoner who began his career with Millwall. He only managed a couple of senior appearances while at The Den, however, and switched to Luton on a free to replace long serving John Moore.

Midfield man come winger **JIMMY RYAN** started life in professional football with Manchester United and made a number of first team appearances. Since transferring to Luton he has made almost 100 League games. One of the Luton new boys this term is **JIMMY HUSBAND**, who recently cost a £70,000 fee in moving from Everton where he played over 150 senior games. Striker **BARRY BUTLIN** spent much of his time at Derby in the Reserves until Luton came along with a £50,000 bid last season.

Another expensive recruit was **ALAN WEST**, who cost a club record fee of £80,000 when signed from Burnley recently. West was due to go to Sunderland for £100,000 but was rejected on account of a back complaint, so Luton stepped in smartly to clinch a deal. Another Luton player accustomed to First Division life is **JOHN ASTON**, who played the game of his life for Manchester United in their European Cup win against Benfica at Wembley. Aston played some 140 games for United but is now a favourite at Kenilworth Road.

Player with a famous name is **TOM FINNEY**, a 19-years-old Irish lad who scored five quick goals for Luton at the start of the season before tending to fade, while ex-club captain **JOHN RYAN** joined Luton from Fulham along with Malcolm Macdonald and has now played over 150 games for the club.
