The Editor's View - - -

Welcome to today's visitors Luton Town — a side with their sights firmly set on promotion to the First Division this season.

Luton are in second place in the League table and if they can maintain their run look certain to go up.

Talking about runs, the Wanderers' spell of consecutive League games without defeat ended at Millwall, on Saturday, after 11 games.

The Londoners won 2-1 and in spite of a great fight-back by the Wanderers, they just couldn't grab the equaliser after John Byrom had pulled them back from being 2-0 down.

Byrom's form in front of goal has been quite remarkable and his 22 goals have taken him to the top of the Second Division scoring chart.

Earlier this season he recorded his 100th goal for the club and was presented with a silver salver to mark the occasion by club chairman Mr. W. G. Isherwood.

Byrom's goals have come mainly since the arrival of Peter Thompson from Liverpool, in December.

Before that, the fair-haired attacker had hit target seven times in 15 games.

He has scored 15 goals in 19 games since then, including a great hat-trick in the FA Cup against Stoke City, and

Thompson has played in 18 of those games.

For anyone to score 22 goals in 34 games is good going, and this is particularly true in the Second Division where defences play it tough and tight.

The Sunday soccer experiment has ended, but the Wanderers' two Sunday games at Burnden hold the record in their own way for attendances this season.

On January 20, Bristol City were the visitors and 23,315 spectators attended the game — the best League gate of the season so far.

And the third round of the FA Cup against Stoke City attracted 39,138 fans the best gate of the season at Burnden.

The big attendances may have been due to the novelty of the situation, but one thing seems certain — we haven't heard the last of Sunday soccer in this country.

LUTON TOWN

Londoner **Graham Horn** has taken over in the Luton goal from **Keith Barber**. His first club was Arsenal, then he went on loan to Portsmouth for a spell before joining Luton. Graham stands 6ft. 1in. tall.

Full back **John Ryan** started his career with Fulham for whom he made 41 appearances. Then he signed for Luton and had made 163 appearances in the League for the Kenilworth Road club by the end of last season.

Midlander **Bobby Thomson** was born in Smethwick and was snapped up by Wolves when he left school. He appeared 277 times for Wolves then moved to Birmingham City.

Bobby played 62 League games for City and had a spell on loan at Walsall before signing for Luton.

Peter Anderson hails from Hendon. Luton Town are his first club and he had made 80 League appearances for them up to the end of last term, scoring 12 goals.

Six-footer **John Faulkner** was born in Orpington and went to Leeds United from school making only a couple of League appearances for the Elland Road outfit.

Since he arrived at Luton last season, he has been a tower of strength in the middle of their defence.

Lambeth-born **Alan Garner** is another six-footer in the Luton defence. He had a brief spell at Millwall making two League appearances before moving North to Town.

Jim Ryan had his first taste of League football with Manchester United making 21 appearances for them before moving on to Luton. He has been a regular in the Town line-up.

Jimmy Husband is a player with an eye for goals, hitting a hat-trick last weekend against Orient. Newcastle-born Jimmy was a signing from Everton this season for a biggish fee.

Barry Butlin had spells with Notts County and Derby County before signing for Luton. He was born in Roslington.

Alan West is another player signed this season who has done so much to help Luton's push towards promotion. A midfield player, he was born in Hyde, Manchester, and joined Town from Burnley.

John Aston needs no introduction to Burnden Park fans. He played 139 League games for Manchester United with whom he earned a European Cup-winners' medal.

Gordon Hindson was born in Durham and started his career with Newcastle United before signing for Luton a couple of seasons ago.

DENNIS TURNER (Cannock, Staffs.). A mining engineer, married with two daughters. Took up refereeing at the age of 16 in the local Cannock Youth League and graduated through the Staffs. County League and West Midland League to The League line and then the referee's list.

Refereed in the 1970 and 1972 Anglo-Italian tournaments and on the line for a European Cup game in Malta in 1968 and Wales v N. Ireland at Wrexham in 1972.

He lists his most memorable game as the Hereford United v Newcastle United F.A. Cup match in February, 1972. "This will stay in my mind for many years not simply because of the giant-killing act by Hereford, but for the number of attempts that were made to stage the match at Newcastle and the replay at Hereford and the atmosphere when the replay was eventually played at Hereford."

Plays cricket in the summer and swims at least once a week.
