



TODAY we welcome Luton Town and their manager Harry Haslam. A member of their team who springs readily to my mind is John Aston whom I am sure all of you will remember winning the man of the match award for his display for Manchester United against Benfica in the 1968 European Cup Final at Wembley, it was a truly memorable performance.

An interesting point to arise from our defeat at Charlton was that all their three goals came from defensive players, numbers 3, 4 and 5. I am a great believer in defenders moving forward into attacking positions, but unfortunately this has not happened. With the way things have gone for us and the general lack of confidence in the team players have tended to be too worried to move up into these positions. When players up front are not scoring they must be given support by defenders moving forward. It was mentioned at a recent practice game how very seldom some defenders were getting into our opponents' penalty area, and at the end of the game both Peter Scott and John Woodward had scored, thus emphasising this very point. We must learn to put into effect on the field what we do in these practice games and training sessions.

WELCOME TO LUTON TOWN

LUTON TOWN'S fourth round F.A. Cup defeat at Norwich ended a run of eight wins in a row — a sequence which has taken them to the fringe of the promotion race and a chance to regain the First Division status they lost last season.

The run of success by manager Harry Haslam's team coincided with reports that the club was in severe financial difficulties.

These have been overcome for the moment and Luton have bounced back off the field as well as on.

At that time Luton were forced to sell their star player, midfielder man PETER ANDERSON who joined the Belgium club, Anderlecht for £80,000.

Luton have the only set of identical twins playing together in League football. Both defender PAUL FUTCHER and his brother, striker RON, joined the club from Chester in the summer of 1974. Paul cost the club £100,000 and Ron £40,000.

Goalkeeper KEITH BARBER played his 100th League game earlier this season. He joined the club in April 1971 from Dunstable Town and won a regular place last season from former Arsenal keeper GRAHAM HORN.

Full back JOHN RYAN got his first taste of League football with Fulham in the First Division and has been in two Luton promotion winning teams. Recently completed 250 League games for the club.


STEVE BUCKLEY started the season at left back, then former England international BOBBY THOMSON took over for nine matches, but Buckley is back in the role again. He cost £5,000 when he was signed from Burton Albion in April 1974.

Thomson, a former Wolves and Birmingham City player, won eight international caps before joining Luton on a free transfer.

Defender JOHN FAULKNER played with Charlton Athletic as an amateur and later with Bromley, Cray Wanderers and Sutton United. It was whilst he was with Sutton that he played against Leeds United in

the F.A. Cup and later turned professional with the Elland Road club.

He had a tragic start to his pro career, breaking his kneecap in his second match. He never made a full recovery with Leeds and was given the chance to join Luton in 1972. He has since played over 100 League games for the club.

he scored in five League games on the trot.

Former England under-23 international ALAN WEST took over as skipper midway through last season. A product of Burnley's youth camp, he played 45 times for the Lancashire side.

In August 1973 he was set to join Sunderland for £70,000 but the move was called off on medical grounds. Two months later he went to Luton for £80,000.

Although he was out of the side at the start of the season JIMMY HUSBAND has returned to the Hatters' line-up to become one of the leading scorers.

Born in Newcastle, he played for England schools and joined Everton as an apprentice. He represented his country again as a youth player and was in the Goodison Park club's F.A. Youth Cup winning side.

He played in the losing Everton F.A. Cup final side of 1968 and the League championship winning squad of 1969-70. He played five times for England's under-23 side and moved to Luton in November 1973 for £70,000.

JOHN ASTON followed in his father's footsteps as a Manchester United player when he left school. He played 156 League games for the Old Trafford club and won one England under-23 cap.

With United he appeared in two Division One championship sides and won a European Cup winners medal in 1968. The following season he broke his leg.

In 1970 he almost moved to Birmingham City but the £50,000 deal fell through and it was two more years before he left Old Trafford, for Luton, for a similar fee.

Other Luton squad members include: JIMMY RYAN, a £20,000 signing from Manchester United, PETER SPIRING, the former Bristol City and Liverpool forward who cost £65,000, JOHN SEASMAN, formerly with Tranmere Rovers and MATT POLLOCK a former Burton Albion striker who once played for Walsall.

Midfield man BRIAN CHAMBERS played for both Sunderland and Arsenal without establishing himself with either club. He cost Luton £30,000 in July 1974.

ANDY KING, a Luton-born former apprentice, has suddenly become an ace goalscorer from midfield. Starting on the 13th December against West Bromwich Albion

10 Years Ago

City ended a run of 8 games without a win when they defeated Watford 1-0 at Bootham Crescent. It was only the second time that season that City had kept a 'clean sheet' the previous occasion being at Brentford early in September. A home draw against Shrewsbury followed and the next game was at Blundell Park against Grimsby Town who were on the fringe of the promotion race.

In what was a fiercely fought match City were beaten by 2 late goals. The game started dramatically — in the 2nd minute Paul Aimson scored his 21st goal of the season when he hit home a Billy Rudd pass but within another two minutes Town controversially equalised when Matt Tees put a shot past Tommy Forgan and although Barry Wealthall cleared the ball the referee adjudged it to have crossed the line. With Rudd playing magnificently City were very much in the picture and posed quite a few problems for the home defence.

As the sides fought for supremacy the game kept boiling over and 4 players were booked, — Barry Jackson, Gerry Baker and Rudd and for Town, Collins. With just 8 minutes remaining City looked set for a valuable point but then Foster netted with a long shot and with the last kick of the game Tees scored his 2nd goal.



Ground Regulations


Admission and the right to remain within the ground is strictly on condition that the spectator shall not commit any of the following acts:

- 1 Failing to comply with directions given by a steward or police officer in uniform.
- 2 Being in possession of any article capable of causing injury or danger or apprehension of injury or danger to any person.
- 3 Being in possession of any stick, pole, banner or flag.
- 4 Throwing or discharging missiles.
- 5 Going on to the playing area or adjoining track.
- 6 Climbing on any building, wall or fence.
- 7 Obstructing any gangway, passageway or alleyway.

- 8 Jostling, swaying or otherwise interfering with the comfort of any spectator.
- 9 Singing obscene or indecent songs or using obscene or indecent language.
- 10 Making any offensive or insulting gesture.
- 11 Defacing any notice or advertisement displayed within the Club premises.

The Club reserves the right to refuse admission to any person. The consequences for disobeying these regulations have often been most severe. Individuals have been sent to prison and borstal and club grounds have been closed as a result of serious incidents.
