

We shall go to Chester in the same frame of mind. I know they have a good Cup reputation, but we shall not be looking to alter our style. We shall go there to beat them by playing good football.

And what an incentive the Futcher twins will have to do well, having started their careers at Sealand Road before coming to Luton.

It's a year or two since we had a good run in the Cup, and I'd love to march into the fifth round before really having to start worrying about it. After all, you're only four matches from Wembley then.

In some quarters we seem to have been ruled out of any chance of promotion. I'm not blowing any trumpets, but you are never out of it until it's impossible. And it certainly is not impossible for us to get back up there.

A couple of bad results for the front runners and a couple of good ones for us, and we are in striking distance again. I've certainly not given up hope. I've seen the way this side can play in recent weeks, and if they can keep that up, then there's no telling what will happen.

This is the stage in the season when you just have to keep going. League and Cup games come thick and fast. You just have to keep tucking the results away, and it comes right in the end.

WELL, I can't say I'm too unhappy at our Cup draw. We'd have preferred to have had a home tie, but Chester away should give us a fair chance of progressing.

Playing these clubs from lower Divisions on their own grounds can always be a bit tricky, but if we apply ourselves to the task it should be quite easily within our reach.

We won at Halifax on Saturday. I know it was only one goal in the end, but we were good value for your victory — as even the locals told us.

That game was played on thick mud, and I was delighted at the way in which the lads played controlled football, never falling for the old kick and rush game.

EDWIN BLACKBURN (Goalkeeper): Even though he did not appear with the First Team last season, this young goalkeeper has a great future in the game. A north-easterner who was originally apprenticed to the Club. He is now in his third season as a Contract Player.

STUART BLAMPEY (Midfield): Has been a professional with the Club for eight years following amateur service. Has shown himself to be a steady and reliable player when called upon for first team duty. Missed a lot of last season through injury.

STUART CROFT (Defender): A north-easterner, he played his first full season last session and his consistent displays attracted the attention of many clubs as a talented back-four player.

PETER DANIEL (Defender): Another locally born player who attracted the attention of other clubs through his sound yet exciting display in the right-back position. Likes to move forward and uses his exceptional pace to great advantage. Must surely attract the attention of the National Team Selector before very long.

ROGER deVRIES (Defender): A locally born player who played his first game with the 1st XI over six years ago. Has now played almost 200 games for the Club and has proved himself to be a good, strong tackling defender.

IAN DOBSON (Defender): A strong and tough-tackling Central Defender who made his debut last season. Locally born.

CHRIS GALVIN (Midfield): Joined Hull City from Leeds United in 1973 and has a lot of skill to go with his experience.

VINCENT GRIMES (Midfield): Whilst born in Scunthorpe, he has progressed to the 1st XI, after playing as an amateur in the Junior and Reserve teams, and last season held a regular first team place.

PAUL HAIGH (Defender): A young Central-Defender who is in his second season as a contract player. He is certainly one for the future which can be evidenced by the fact that he was selected for the England Youth Squad.

JOHN HAWLEY (Striker): Another locally born player who recently signed professional. A strong and adventurous striker.

JEFF HEMMERMAN (Forward): Born in Hull, and played for the Club as an amateur in 1968. Is very skillful, and showed his true potential towards the end of last season.

MALCOLM LORD (Midfield): A very experienced player and is also an FA Full Badge Coach, and a member of the



PFA Executive. Has now been with the Club eleven years. His midfield ability was sorely missed by the Tigers when injury kept him out of the side last season.

GEORGE LYALL (Midfield): A midfield player who prefers the right hand side. He is skillful and an accurate passer of the ball coupled with a hard shot. Joined the Club from Nottingham Forest and is the joker of the team, and well known for his impersonations.

GRAHAME McGIFFORD (Defender): A young full-back who was transferred from Huddersfield Town in the close season. Can play on either the left or the right hand side of the defence.

JIMMY McINTOSH (Forward): Jimmy McIntosh is a Scot who was also transferred to the Club from Nottingham Forest last season. An asset to the side for his skill and work rate.

DAVE ROBERTS (Defender): Club Captain and Welsh International who established himself with his National Team in the last series of Home Internationals. Joined the Club from Oxford United after previously being with Fulham. Has proved to be a tower of strength in the back four, and his all-round ability and knowledge of the game has proved an asset to the Club. Is also the holder of the FA Full Badge Coaching Certificate.

GORDON STANFORTH (Forward): Hull born and bred, he is a fast and skillful right-winger. Gained Schoolboy Honours for his country.

DAVE STEWART (Midfield): A Northern Ireland Youth International. He is a skillful midfield player and made his first debut whilst only 16.

DAVE SUNLEY (Striker): A bargain buy from Sheffield Wednesday last season. Is skillful and good in the air for his size. Shields and holds the ball well. Was much sought after by the big 1st Division clubs a few seasons ago.

JEFF WEALANDS (Goalkeeper): The only player to appear in all 42 League games last season, and has now played over 150 1st XI games for the Club. Was born in Darlington and transferred from the Quakers in 1972.

ALF WOOD (Striker): LEAVE OUT

DAVE GIBSON (Midfield): A young north-easterner who made a tremendous impact on his debut last season. An exciting midfield player who likes nothing better than going forward to join in an attack.

GORDON NISBET (Midfield): Signed from WBA for £10,000. Started his career as a 'keeper but now plays in midfield.

BILLY BREMNER (Midfield): Signed from Leeds for £25,000, a valuable asset to any side.



A LOOK BACK AT LUTON TOWN FC A DECADE AGO

HISTORY repeats itself, they say, and in the Town's case that is true. Ten years ago today they were hard up and in trouble over goalkeepers, because they had only one professional on the books. So they borrowed one, on loan.

Tony Read was the Town's recognised goalkeeper in January 1967, but new manager Allan Brown, trying to shake up a team that was struggling, wanted new blood. Oldham Athletic had just bought David Best from Bournemouth, and Brown went to Oldham boss Jimmy McIlroy to take from him Ron Swan on a month's loan.

He made his debut on January 14, 1967, in a home match against Barnsley which was so one-sided that he had hardly anything to do. The Town's problems were mostly at

the other end. Thomas scored in a Barnsley breakaway and the Yorkshire side then withdrew into a blanket defensive formation.

The Town's attack battered away for the rest of the game, missing chances, having three shots kicked off the line, and being refused three penalty appeals. Graham French was the only forward to play up to his usual standard, and not until 65 minutes had gone did the Town finally get the equaliser, through a header by David Pleat.

It was a big disappointment for the 8,287 fans who turned up because the previous week the Town had come close to pulling off a shock Cup win at Eastville against Bristol Rovers.

That was a game to remember. The Town were Division IV strugglers. Rovers were second in Division III. They hadn't lost at home all season, while the Town hadn't won away for seven months. No-one gave the






