

with a packed defence. As we reach for a place in the promotions race, we know that games like that will be hard, and so will today's against Charlton. We have to give everything in every game, but our promotion hopes are in our own hands. We still have to play all the teams above us in the table. That was a hard game and the lads worked hard to win it.

Last Monday evening, Alan West, Doug Lygo and myself were guests of the Bedfordshire Sporting Club at the County Hotel, Bedford. Following an excellent dinner, we enjoyed four splendidly competitive professional boxing contests. And to complete our evening, the club members raised £65 for our funds by auctioning an autographed football. The generous recipient of the ball was Mr Ken Unwin, well known to us as an enthusiastic member of the Luton Town Century Sporting Club.

LES BERRY: 6'2" young defender made his debut for Charlton in February 1976 and made 14 consecutive first team appearances up to the end of that season scoring 1 goal.

DAVID CAMPBELL: 17 year old six foot schoolboy centre half who is studying for his 'A' levels. Made 3 League appearances for Charlton at the end of last season.

HARRY CRIPPS: This ex-Millwall veteran soon became a firm favourite when he joined Charlton in 1974. He now mainly concentrates on passing his experience and enthusiasm to the young Charlton players and reserves.

BOBCURTISS: Bob signed professional for Charlton in 1967 after spending his apprenticeship with the Club. Although most of his career has been spent at right back he played in the centre of the defence last season with distinction. He has made 284 League appearances scoring 28 goals.

MIKE FLANAGAN: England youth international who was an amateur with Tottenham before signing professional for Charlton. Has played 142 times scoring 33 goals as a forward.

BILL FOGARTY: Born London. Midfield player. Signed for Charlton Athletic FC in December 1976. Went to Gillingham as an apprentice and professional making 24 League appearances in 1976/77 season.

JIM GILES: Centre half. Signed from Exeter in 1975. Was ever present in the first team last season making 42 League appearances and scoring 3 goals in his first season.

GEOFF HAMMOND: Suffolk born Geoff signed for Charlton in the close season from Manchester City after being transferred from Ipswich Town for £40,000. He has gained wide First Division experience as a defender with both these Clubs.

JOHNNY HARRISON: The smallest player in the Football League at 5'2½", signed professional in January 1976 after two years as an apprentice with this Club. A winger, he played five Second Division games last season scoring twice.

PETER HUNT: Hard working, London born, mid-field player who has made 105 League appearances since his transfer from Southend United in 1972. Last season he played in 36 games scoring three times.

HUGH McAULEY: Born Bootle, Lancs. Joined Charlton Athletic FC in December 1976. Started career with Liverpool, then went on loan to Tranmere Rovers when he made 13 League appearances. Joined Plymouth Argyle where he made 76 League appearances and was a regular member of the side which gained promotion with us to the Second Division in 1975.

COLIN POWELL: Right winger Colin has made an outstanding success of the change from Southern League Football with Barnet to the Football League following his transfer to Charlton in 1973. Has made 135 League appearances scoring 17 goals.

DICK TYDEMAN: Born Gillingham, Kent. Midfield player. Signed for Charlton Athletic FC in December 1976 after being with Gillingham as an apprentice and professional making 280 League appearances for them.

PHIL WARMAN: Started his career as a winger but has played most of his 174 League appearances at left back. He played 29 League games last season scoring 6 times.

KEITH PEACOCK: Winger or mid-field player, Keith celebrated his four hundredth League games for Charlton by scoring against Blackburn Rovers on 20th March 1976 to record his 78th League goal, since he joined as a professional in 1962. Was the first ever substitute in the Football League versus Bolton Wanderers August 21st 1965.

MARK PENFOLD: Mid-field player or full back, local born nineteen year old Mark made his first League appearance in August 1973, to become the youngest ever player to appear for Charlton Athletic. He has since made 55 first team appearances including 34 last season.

Coaching

LAST Wednesday I had the privilege of attending Wembley to watch one of the best displays any manager or coach of any football team in the world would wish to achieve. Skill at its peak not only individually but as a team. Perfect synchronisation in all lines, so much awareness and concentration not only when in possession of the ball but when defending.

The passing was so accurate, the support and "movements off the ball" at all times were always there, and so much confidence and patience to wait for the right time to do it.

It made me wonder how many hours of practice, work and enjoyment, you name it, that Cruyff, Peters, Neeskens or any of the other players devoted themselves to in the early stages of their careers. I know how much time we used to devote ourselves in my country of origin, Uruguay, and as far as I can remember since the age of 9 or 10 we played every day and carried on until sunset. Our fathers then put up a light in the back garden so that we could continue to practice. We kept on playing with one object in mind, to be as good as the best and play the game we loved – football.

Keeping the ball in the air with both feet and head were every day competitions apart from the small sides games we played. We were always trying to do all the tricks of the big stars or idols at the big stadium – The Centenario – where the World Cup was played in 1924.

All the great stuff we saw at Wembley was certainly not achieved since the players had joined the senior clubs or international team but was mostly achieved before then in the schools and local parks. Same as in Uruguay and in England too.

How many hours does a manager or coach spend in

getting the right blend of players and get them to believe in the method, they believe is right for them?

This comes at senior club and international level. Everything was there at Wembley and I think any good player, manager or coach must have been impressed by

Dedication is vital in the early stages to get the skills and from the age of 14-15 at club level, "Good Coaching" individually and as a team are essential.

One thing the Dutch did not teach us and that was the ambition to score as many goals as possible. They did not show us the killer instinct of ours, so let's get on with the skills. Achieving them would mean England could once again become World Champions.
