Blackpool have found good form more consistently this season. We have discovered a blend that was even in evidence in defeat at Hull – a result we scarcely deserved.

What is the secret? Nothing more than the fact we are concentrating on our players' strengths instead of harping on about their weaknesses.

You would be hard pressed to name me a team of perfect players including centre halves with the dribbling powers of George Best and a centre forward who can tackle like Stan Cullis.

The perfect player does not exist. The better players – so-called Superstars are the ones who have perfected their strengths and do not allow themselves to be put into positions where their weaknesses are exposed.

If you have a Peter Lorimer you must get him into positions where he must be expected to shoot hard and often. You don't want to waste him in a defensive midfield role.

This season even more than last I have preached to the players to do what they are good at. I will not moan at my forwards if they miss goals if they are prepared to take the responsibility of shooting. As we found with the old Blackpool team of the fifties with Morty in full flight you have to shoot often to get a lot of goals.

The present Blackpool team is full of players with team spirit and a willingness to work. So many players I have known think they can drift in and out of a game and turn on the skills like a water tap.

You have to be constantly involved in the action to play to ability.

This is why I have been so pleased with Mickey Walsh and Bob Hatton. Both are unselfish when the other man is in scoring form. Bob worked like a trojan last season when Mickey Walsh was going well and with Bob banging in the goals this term Mickey has worked so hard to ensure he has the chances to take.

This kind of unselfish attitude typifies the blend and spirit we are getting in the club. With a class midfield player I feel really confident that we have the other ingredients to do well this year.

# LUTON TOWN

**Harry Haslam, Manager.** Known throughout football for his cheery outlook, Haslam has already experienced both sides of the coin as a football manager. He played for Manchester United, Brighton, Orient, Guildford and Hastings as a full-back before serving his "apprenticeship" as a manager in non-league circles with Eastbourne, Barry Town and Tonbridge. He has also done duty as scout and fund-raiser, and Luton have needed all his talents since he took over the manager's job from Alec Stock in May 1972. Two short years later he had welded together the Luton Town team that won promotion to the First Division. But they got off to an atrocious start, with only nine points from the first half of the season, and despite a tremendous fight-back for the second half Luton were finally relegated when Spurs escaped by beating Leeds in their last match of the season. Now Haslam is trying to build another team worthy of First Division status, after helping to save Luton Town from extinction last year when financial problems pushed them to the verge of bankruptcy. He had to sell players to raise the money, and with little cash available to buy new stars he has concentrated on seeking out bright young players who can be groomed for stardom through the junior teams. Away from football, he likes to go fishing . . . so that he can sit in peace and quiet.

**Milija Aleksic.** Luton paid £20,000 to Plymouth in January 1977 for Aleksic's services, and the fee turned out to be a bargain. Aged 24, he was unsettled at Plymouth, and the move to Luton turned out to be the turning point in his career. Son of Yugoslav parents, but born in the North of England, he broke into football as a part-timer with

Stafford Rangers. He quickly became a firm favourite at Luton, where the locals call him "Elastic" in tribute to his agility and quick reflexes.

**Tony Knight.** Only 18, Knight is one of the many young players Luton have recruited. Several clubs were chasing him when he starred as a schoolboy goalkeeper with Romford Schoolboys. He has been included in England Youth international squads, and has played a handful of league games for Luton.

**Paul Price.** His hopes of a career in League soccer had to overcome a double disaster before he made the grade - recruited by Luton as a youngster he was on the verge of success when he broke his leg. He fought his way back to fitness, only to break it again. He battled back again, and his performances at right back have made him Luton's first-choice at right back ever since.

**Steve Buckley.** Officially a left back, Buckley is more than a top class defender - his speed and sharp-shooting make him a dangerous attacker too. He was a free-scoring left winger with Burton Albion when Luton signed him for a bargain price of £2,000 in the summer of 1974. Within six months he had been converted into a defender with attacking flair, and has been a mainstay of the Luton side ever since.

**John Faulkner.** Luton's senior pro and vice captain, he has given Luton sterling service since they paid £6,000 for him in March 1972. He emerged from obscurity as centre-half in the Sutton United team that played Leeds. Don Revie signed him on, but a broken leg interrupted his career at Elland Road. Strong in the air and a no-nonsense tackler, he has been a regular member of the Luton defence for five years.

**Philip Driver.** In his first season as a professional after serving his apprenticeship. He is one of the youngsters with a bright future and after many promising performances in the reserve side last season, did enough to persuade the manager to sign him. Hails from Welwyn Garden City.

**Nigel Johnson.** He is also in his first season as a professional after serving his apprenticeship. Formed a good partnership with Ingram in the reserve and youth sides last year. Is very quick and has two good feet and is always looking for goals. He also comes from Welwyn Garden City.

**Paul Futcher.** One of the brightest prospects in League football today, Luton risked their record transfer fee when they paid £100,000 for him in the summer of 1974. He was still only 17, and with only a handful of Fourth Division games behind him. Luton beat off opposition from bigger clubs to persuade him to leave Chester, his home town club, and he has developed into a brilliant sweeper, cool in defence and far-seeing in setting up attacks. He has already been capped by England at under-21 level, and Luton supporters are convinced that full international honours are just round the corner. Still only 20, he was one of the players described by Don Revie as "an outstanding prospect" when the ex-England manager looked on his experiences with the national side.

**David Carr.** After learning his trade in defence or midfield in youth and reserve teams, Carr is now competing for regular first-team football. He comes from Margate, and became an apprentice at Luton when he left school in 1973.

**Jim McNichol.** Luton manager Harry Haslam is used to looking for bargains, and defender McNichol rates as one. Ipswich, prolific producers of youth players, allowed him to look for a new club after ending his apprenticeship at Portman Road in the summer of 1976. Haslam nipped in and although Paul Futcher's brilliance is hard to replace, McNichol has filled the sweeper's position with distinction whenever he has been called into the league team.

**Pasquale Fuccillo.** Son of Italian parents who settled at Bedford, midfield dynamo Fuccillo - "Lil" to his friends and the Luton fans - joined Luton as a 16-year-old apprentice in

the summer of 1973. Strong on the ball, he made his name with some storming midfield displays, and marked his league debut with a goal and has been a regular marksman ever since.

**Alan West.** Luton's club captain and a brilliant midfield man, West is one of the many stars to emerge from the "production line" of Burnley. An England under-23 international, he joined Luton for £100,000 from Burnley in October 1973. Still only 25, he is capable of turning defences inside-out with accurate passes.

**Ricky Hill.** A midfield player who has excited attention all over the country, Hill had a fairy-tale start to his league career. Signed as an apprentice from schools football in North London, he made it into the league team within a year and celebrated his debut by scoring once and laying on another goal. Now 19, he has been capped by England at youth level.

**Jim Husband.** Joined Luton in November 1973 with a string of

honours already collected with Everton, and has served Luton with distinction. He plays as an attacking midfielder or as a front runner, and has provided a regular supply of goals. A Geordie, he was capped by England as a schoolboy, as a youth, and at under-23 level, and hit 75 goals for Everton before moving to Luton for a £70,000 fee.

**Phil Boersma.** It was the end of a patient search for talent by Luton boss Harry Haslam signed striker Phil Boersma from Middlesbrough in July 1977. Three years previously Haslam had tried to persuade Liverpool to part with the player. He failed, and later went to Middlesbrough, and Haslam finally got his man two years later. Middlesbrough used him as a midfielder man but for Luton Boersma operates as a free-running attacker, with goals the main priority.

**Godfrey Ingram.** A local product of Luton's youth teams, Ingram has been tipped for high honours since his

outstanding midfield and attacking talents took him into Luton's reserve team when he was still only 16. Luton signed him on schoolboy forms, and he played for England Schools. He became an apprentice in the summer of 1976, and within a year had been upgraded to junior professional.

**Ron Futcher.** Twin brother of Paul and identical in looks. When Luton paid £25,000 for him it was thought that he had been transferred from Chester because the boys wanted to be together, but Ron soon made his mark with a hat-trick in his second first division game and has since established himself in Luton's front line.

**Gary Heale.** Now in his second season with the club after being signed from Canvey Island. Tottenham were very keen to sign him but with the managers connections in the area, finally persuaded him to join Luton. Good in the air and is a good target man to play to. Big things are expected from him this season.







# Supporters' Club Notes

The annual meeting of the Supporters' Club was held in the Social Club on Tuesday, 11th October before a good attendance of well over 100 members. The Supporters' Club Chairman, Mr. Ralph Wilson, presided and during the course of the meeting he handed to Mr. W. Cartmell (Chairman of the Football Club) a cheque for £2000, which with a cheque for a similar amount which was presented some weeks ago makes a total donation from the Supporters' Club to the Football Club of £4000. (the same as last year).

The donation is made from a net surplus for the year of £4627 and the small balance will be used for replacing furnishings in the Club.

The bar sales for the year were £44832, not far short of an average of £900 per week, a remarkable figure for such a small Club. However, in common with all other Clubs expenses all round are considerably higher this year and the Supporters' Club Committee did well to finish with a surplus of over £4600. His Worship the Mayor of Blackpool has been asked to accept the Honorary position of Patron during his year of office, Mr. William Cartmell was re-elected as President and R. C. Dewhurst, F. N. Dickinson and W. S. Lines re-elected Vice Presidents. Messrs. Thornton Baker & Co. were re-elected Auditors and the trustees are Councillor Malcolm Lord, P.J. Lawson and H. Alker. A full list of the new Officials and Committee will be given in the next Supporters' Notes in this programme.

The annual presentation of the trophies awarded for the best performances in the Blackpool Evening Cricket League were presented last night at a Social Evening held in the Co-operative Sports Club, Preston New Road. ### DOMINOES AND DARTS




