

## Nobby's Notes



Well, here we are at the last home match of the season and as I look back it does not seem any time at all since our first League game back in Division Two, when we beat Blackburn Rovers 4-1 last August. Let us hope we can end our home fixtures as we began them, with a convincing victory.

However, we will need to play a lot better than we did on Tuesday night when we did not really come to terms with the very difficult conditions. I must give all credit to Cambridge, who although well outplayed in the first half, came back well and took their chances after the interval. But I felt sorry for Roy Tunks who had no chance with the kind of goal that always leaves 'keepers helpless, when a deflection gave him no chance for their second goal.

So it is vital that we put that result behind us today and go into the match with the right attitude. We need the points to make absolutely sure of our place in Division Two next season, and I want us to finish the season on a high note and in a good League position.

Looking at the season as a whole, I feel we have achieved what we set out to do and that was to consolidate our position in the League in our first year back in Division Two and finish in a healthy position in the table. After a bad run in September and October, everybody got down to the job and things began to change in November. After a nervous win against Cardiff at Deepdale the lads have put together a very consistent run of only four defeats in 25 games. As I have said before we have a great bunch of professionals now here at Deepdale, but Alan Kelly and I will always be looking to improve if and when we feel the right players become available.

The supporters of North End have been really tremendous this season and have lifted the players on many occasions, both home and away. The support of our Weekly £4,000 Lottery has also helped us move into the transfer market and make ground improvements here at Deepdale. This, in fact, is how you can support your club throughout the summer, by having a little flutter and providing financial support to North End—and who knows you could be one of our big weekly winners of £1,000, £500 or £100, etc.

After our remaining two away fixtures at Bristol Rovers and Millwall, the players will be going to Majorca for a week's break. I am sure you will agree the lads have fully earned the trip both for gaining promotion last year and their continued improvement this season at a higher level.

I hope all our fans have an enjoyable summer break, and we look forward to seeing you all next season.



## AWAY TRAVEL TO BRISTOL ROVERS


Join the M6 at the most convenient intersection (note, mileages start at intersection 31, Samlesbury).



## Division Two

West Ham manager John Lyall considered the enormity of the Hammers' promotion task after his side had dropped another point in the 0-0 draw at Charlton. 'Our only hope really is if we can win all our games in hand over our rivals,' he shrugged.

As West Ham had picked up only eight points from seven games as he spoke, it seemed most unlikely that they could achieve that objective. The loss of that great England midfield schemer Trevor Brooking really hit the Hammers hard for, though they have quite a depth of cover in the reserves, there is no way in which any club could find a replacement for a player of his calibre.

West Ham were also without top scorer Bryan Robson at Charlton and a further frustration came in the 13th minute when Alan Devonshire had a goal disallowed because colleague Billy Jennings was offside. Yet Jennings, who had gone down with a painful injury moments earlier, was desperately attempting to hobble back into an onside position when the ball went into the net!

It is incidents like these that can decide promotion and relegation issues at this vital stage of the season.

Indeed, most of the top clubs have been showing signs of nerves just lately. Poor John Burridge, the Palace goalkeeper, made an awful blunder at Leicester to give away a goal after only 11 minutes. 'It was totally my fault', admitted Burridge, a £50,000 signing from Aston Villa last season. 'I went out to a high ball, intending to punch it up and away. But I mis-hit it and it dropped straight to the feet of Bobby Smith. He had the simplest of tasks to put it into the net and as the game went on I thought my error had cost us the game.'

It was defender Paul Hinshelwood who proved Palace's saviour when he went up to blast home an equaliser in the last minute. It was his first goal of the season.

Palace manager Terry Venables refused to condemn Burridge for his costly mistake, though. 'John has done a truly magnificent job for us all season and even he is entitled to a mistake now and again. And don't forget it was John who kept us in the game with two great saves later on.'

One of the happiest managers last weekend was Stoke City's Alan Durban, following his side's 1-0 victory at Wrexham. 'Our win owed much to the courage and loyalty of the players', he maintained. 'Former England' and Manchester City defender Mike Doyle was not fit to play but Dennis Smith, whom we expected to be out for the remainder of the season, insisted upon playing even though he had a horrible gash, and ten stitches, on his shin.'

Smith played a fearless game at the heart of the defence and a goal by Brendan O'Callaghan, his 17th of the season, was sufficient to give his side the points.

Mr Durban had time to reflect upon the nerves being shown by some of his rivals in the promotion race. 'It's understandable at this stage of the season', he said. 'We had a bad patch at the end of March, when we lost successive games at home to Sunderland and Blackburn.

'Now we have recovered and I hope we have got that spell out of our system.'

Stoke are in the happy position of knowing that victory at home to Newcastle this afternoon, and two points from their final game at Notts County, would guarantee their return to the First Division.

Sunderland's caretaker-manager Billy Elliott should be feeling pleased with himself after taking the club into such a strong position—but he isn't. His big niggle is the continual talk that Ipswich boss Bobby Robson will be taking over at Roker at the end of the season.

'We have been beaten only twice in 19 games since I took over in December and I think my track record compares with anyone's', he said after Sunderland's 2-0 success at Cambridge.

Goalkeeper Mervyn Day is not too concerned whether his club, West Ham, will be playing in the First or the Second Division next season. He hopes to be making a fresh start elsewhere after being deposed by Phil Parkes earlier this season. The Hammers have agreed to release him but are believed to be asking £150,000 for him, a figure that might frighten clubs like Notts County who have been watching him in action in the reserves.


